Dear Secretary Gates:

We seek your assistance in preserving the integrity of the defense acquisition process as it relates to the U.S. Army's Family of Medium Tactical Vehicles (FMTV) competitive rebuy contract awarded by the Army on August 27, 2009, and formally protested to the General Accountability Office (GAO) by the losing bidders in September. Specifically, we are concerned with recent efforts, based on inaccurate and incomplete information, to publicly criticize the Army's contract award to Oshkosh Corporation, efforts that threaten to undermine the ongoing independent review and analysis of the GAO. We encourage you to ensure that the ongoing protest review process remains free from undue influence or outside interference.

Unfortunately and despite prohibitions on such interference, some appear to be attempting to influence the ongoing Government Accountability Office review of this award. While we firmly believe that the GAO protest of this program will be rejected as without merit, we are concerned with the blatant efforts to affect the outcome of this independent, quasi-judicial review by attempting to raise protest issues through a public media campaign and through improper contact with Department of Defense officials.

We are also concerned that some have gone so far as requesting that the Army provide highly confidential and sensitive source selection materials for their review. We believe this is both inappropriate and a dangerous precedent that could result in undue interference in the competitive process.

Finally, we believe the ongoing public relations campaign initiated by disappointed parties has disseminated a significant amount of incomplete and inaccurate information regarding the FMTV competition. Oshkosh Corporation is a strong, diverse company that has produced over 67,000 military vehicles for use by our armed forces, and is well situated to reliably serve the Department of Defense for decades to come. Oshkosh officials assure us that they have more than enough capacity to handle the anticipated FMTV production, as well as any surge production that might be required, with no impact on its existing contracts. In fact, the DOD scrutinized and confirmed Oshkosh's manufacturing capacity and capability in two separate reviews this year, during both the M-ATV and FMTV competitions. Over its 80-year history of manufacturing vehicles for the Department of Defense, Oshkosh and its highly-skilled union workforce has proven its capability to delivery quality products on schedule while keeping costs low to the government.

In order to ensure that the process goes forward in an unbiased manner, we know you will take steps to ensure the Department handles outside inquiries relating to the FMTV procurement decision, including requests for sensitive source selection materials, in strict compliance with the law,

particularly while the GAO conducts its review of the protests. We request that you provide the undersigned with a complete copy of all materials provided to other Members of Congress relating to the FMTV competition as well as the opportunity to receive the same briefings that are provided to other Member offices, including Committee briefings.

We are especially proud of our constituent's long history of supporting our men and women in uniform and ensuring they receive the best equipment available. We appreciate your efforts to ensure the FMTV procurement and protest review process is handled in a professional manner. We look forward to working with you on this matter.

Dear Mr. Secretary:

We are writing to express our concern over the future of the U.S. combat vehicle industrial base.

The Defense Strategic Guidance you unveiled in January calls for significant reductions in the armed forces, especially in the Army and Marine Corps, as well as sacrifices in investment programs. Regarding the U.S. industrial base, the guidance calls for protecting critical industries as the nation adapts to the new defense posture. You and your leadership team have referenced tactical aviation and shipbuilding as just two industries that require continuous national support to remain viable.

However, the strategy neglects the U.S. combat vehicle industrial base. The combat vehicle industrial base is a unique asset that consists of hundreds of public and private facilities across the United States. Despite this, the FY 2013 President's Budget request proposes to terminate U.S. tank production for the first time since before World War II.

The Army specifically proposes to shut down the tank industrial base and then reconstitute it in 2017 to produce further upgrades to the M1 Abrams tank as well as the new Ground Combat Vehicle. While international sales opportunities for Abrams appear stronger than prior years, they are inadequate to sustain the industrial base and in some cases uncertain. In light of this, modest and continued Abrams production for the Army is necessary to preserve the industrial base.

Another important tenet of the Defense Strategic Guidance notes that because the future Army and Marine Corps will be smaller and leaner, they must retain the quality and capability that will allow them to fight and win on future battlefields. Indeed, to quote Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Martin Dempsey, "capability is more important than size." We agree. To that end, we support the continued production of the M1A2 SEP tank, which is the world's most capable tank featuring survivability and seamless connection to the digital network and of far higher quality than the older M1A1 Abrams tank.

The debate over the fate of the U.S. combat vehicle industrial base is not new. The Congress in bipartisan fashion supported additional tank upgrades in the FY 2012 Defense Authorization and Appropriations Acts to forestall shutdown of the industrial



base into 2014. Despite this support and the emphasis on maintaining the health of the industrial base in the Strategic Guidance, the Army continues to stand by its decision to shutter U.S. tank production.

We ask that you work with the Congress to sustain U.S. tank production in the FY 2013 budget. Thank you for your continued leadership and commitment to this nation.

As you consider the Fiscal Year 2015 Army budget proposal, we urge you to preserve the force structure and end strength of the Army National Guard and to leverage the operational reserve to increase cost-savings in the Total Army.

We understand that your soon-to-be-completed budget review is focused on rebalancing active and reserve forces in our Nation's long-term military strategy, which is commendable. With the operational reserve being rebuilt since September 11, 2001, this generation of Army National Guardsmen and Reservists has proven every bit as effective, committed, and capable as their active counterparts.

We believe that significant end strength and force structure cuts can be mitigated by better utilizing the Reserve Component, which would save money while sustaining defense capacity and capability. Blending Active and Reserve Component Army units, as the Air Force has begun to do with its Active Associate program, could ensure long-term budgetary savings to maintain a robust Total Army. As your Reserve Forces Policy Board (RFPB) recently noted, a blended Total Army composition means more combat capability at about one-third the cost.

Alternate cost-savings proposals under consideration that would reduce the Army National Guard to 315,000 soldiers – 35,000 fewer soldiers than pre-9/11 levels – are deeply troubling, especially considering the Army National Guard is the most cost-effective dual use force available. Knowing such draconian cuts alone may not be enough if the budget sequester continues and military personnel costs double, as projected, by 2025, we are convinced that end strength reductions in the Reserve Component are not a practical or long-term solution to ensuring our Nation's security in an era of fiscal restraints. As you are aware, Congress last year rightly rejected similar proposals that reduced end strength and force structure for the Air National Guard.

We strongly encourage you to avert a large end strength reduction that would inhibit our Army's ability to respond to world events and domestic emergencies. We look forward to reviewing your final decision, which we understand will be issued in the next several weeks, and to working with you to ensure a robust future Total Army.
