1. This memorandum is in response to items one through five of the SWAN/ACLU FOIA request dated 15 October 2010, pertaining to domestic violence reporting in the Department of the Navy (DoN).
2. Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) is responsible for the Department of the Navy's (DoN) Family Advocacy Program (FAP). FAP provides clinical assessment, treatment and services for military members and their families involved in incidents of domestic abuse. The CNIC FAP systems manager provided information responsive to items one and two. For items three through five, CNIC requested responsive data from all Regions throughout the claimancy. Several regions provided data, but many deemed it unreasonably burdensome to respond or possessed no responsive information.
3. Item (1): Information pertaining to where and how DoN stores military-related reports and investigations about domestic violence complaints.

a. Response: CNIC installations maintain FAP records pertaining to domestic violence complaints. A set of required data elements pertaining to each allegation of child or domestic abuse is maintained in the Navy Central Registry of Child and Domestic Abuse Incident Reports, which is maintained at CNIC Headquarters. The Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) is responsible for maintaining domestic violence investigative information.

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4. Item (2): Information concerning how servicemembers can request or obtain these reports pertaining to domestic violence.

a. Response: Reference (a) provides information on how a person can request FAP information pertaining to him/herself.

5. The data requested by items three through five is not routinely collected or compiled by the release authorities for FAP records (Installation Commanding Officers). Unless specifically noted below, all other regions had no responsive data.

a. Item (3): The number of requests by servicemembers for the release of domestic violence records for Fiscal Year (FY) 2006 - 2010: 337.

- (1) Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic (CNRMA) - 324
- (2) Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Southwest Asia (CNREURAFSWA) - 6
- (3) Commander, Navy Region Japan (CNRJ) - 7


b. Item (4): The number of reports relating to domestic violence released to servicemembers or the public in FY 2006 - 2010: 342.

- (1) CNRMA - 323
- (2) CNREURAFSWA - 8
- (3) CNRJ - 11

c. Item (5): The number of military-related incidents of domestic violence reported by servicemembers in FY 2006 - 2010: 266.

- (1) Commandant, Naval District Washington (CNDW) - 78
- (2) CNREURAFSWA - 188
