## MEMORADUM FOR ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE (PUBLIC AFFAIRS)

SUBJECT: Joint Civilian Orientation Conference

Last fall, Secretary Cohen invited me to nominate an attendee for the Joint Civilian Orientation Conference scheduled for June 20-28, 1998. While reading about the type of distinguished citizen who is commonly invited to participate in this annual event, it occurred to me that this audience would benefit from learning about the Department of Defense's efforts to care for those who fought in the Gulf War, and use this information to protect future forces.

According to the fact sheet your office provided, the purpose of this conference is to increase public understanding of national defense issues and facilitate a candid exchange of information on defense matters. In my opinion, one of the most important issues to the American public today is taking care of the sons and daughters they entrust to the care of the military services.

As you know, since November 1996, we have made every effort to follow the President's direction in "leaving no stone unturned" in finding out what happened during the Gulf War. Important as that is, I've also remained fully aware of my equally important mission of ensuring the DoD learns from our experiences in the Gulf.

Our expanded outreach program to our active duty forces is part of our effort to inform the American public. I believe that speaking to the JCOC would be another important outreach effort.

Please give this request your serious consideration. I am available to speak at your convenience and can provide a comprehensive display for the date of my presentation or the entire week.
