**PROBLEM:** SecDef must approve the invitation list and approve his letter of invitation, to be signed by autopen, to initiate the JCOC 59 invitation rocess.

**DISCUSSION:** The JCOC 59 Joint Selection Panel rated 167 nominees, of whom 120 were selected and placed on an invitation list in rank order. For logistical reasons, only 60 will be invited to attend. If we do not get enough positive responses from the initial group of invitees within two weeks, we will continue inviting individuals from the rank-ordered list until we reach a total of 60 confirmed participants. To get quality participants, the initial invitations should be mailed as soon as possible.
