SUBJECT: Survivor Annuity Programs for the Uniformed Services

1. REISSUANCE AND PURPOSE

Pursuant to the authority provided in reference (a), this Directive reissues reference (b) to update the responsibilities, functions, authorities, and relationships as outlined below and authorizes the publication of DoD Instruction 1332.42 (reference (c)).

2. APPLICABILITY

This Directive applies to the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Military Departments (including the Coast Guard when it is not operating as a Military Service in the Navy by agreement with the Department of Homeland Security), the Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration under agreements with the Departments of Health and Human Services and Commerce, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Defense Agencies, and all other organizational entities in the Department of Defense. The term "Military Services," as used herein, refers to the Army, the Navy, the Air Force, and the Marine Corps.

3. POLICY

It is DoD policy that:

3.1. All members and their survivors, as applicable, are informed of the Survivor Annuity Programs.

3.2. The Military Departments, within the limits of available resources and expertise, shall inform and educate persons eligible for the Survivor Annuity Programs. It is especially important that military personnel be educated with respect to these matters prior to eligibility for retirement.

3.3. The Survivor Annuity Programs as provided in reference (a) are effectively implemented.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES


It is DoD policy that:

4.1. The Principal Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Personnel and Readiness), under the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, shall manage this Directive and implementation of reference (c).

4.2. The Secretaries of the Military Departments shall ensure compliance with this Directive and establish policies and procedures to implement reference (c).

5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Directive is effective immediately.
