ADMINISTRATION AND OVERSIGHT OF PROVISION OF HEALTH CARE FOR THE WHITE HOUSE MEDICAL UNIT

Purpose: In accordance with the authority in DoD Directive (DoDD) 5124.02, this issuance:

- Establishes policy, assigns responsibilities, and prescribes procedures for administering and overseeing the provision of health care services of the White House Medical Unit (WHMU) as an organizational element of the DoD Presidential Support Program (PSP) and as a set of clinics supported by the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC).
- Establishes the WHMU as a DoD military medical treatment facility (MTF) subject to the laws and DoD policies applicable to administration and management of MTFs, with procedures appropriate to its unique mission.
- Establishes eligibility criteria and processes for providing health care services at the WHMU.

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SECTION 1: GENERAL ISSUANCE INFORMATION

1.1. APPLICABILITY.

This issuance applies to OSD, the Military Departments, the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other organizational entities within the DoD.

1.2. POLICY.

- a. The WHMU, an organizational element of the DoD PSP, is comprised of a specialized team of health care professionals entrusted with delivering optimal comprehensive health services to ensure the Presidency functions uninterrupted and to support the health and safety of the President and Vice President of the United States. The WHMU also provides health care services relating to White House functions and activities to support Presidential activities.
- b. As part of the DoD PSP in accordance with DoDD 5210.55, WHMU provides medical services and support, consistent with this issuance, at the direction of the White House Military Office (WHMO), which is an organizational element of the DoD.
- c. In relation to the provision of health care services and all clinical and clinical support operations, WHMU manages the clinics that support the DoD PSP, including those located on the White House complex that are supported by WRNMMC. It therefore is an MTF subject to:
- (1) The laws and DoD policies, including DHA policies, applicable to administering and managing MTFs and civilian employee occupational health clinics.
 - (2) Certain special procedures, consistent with law, appropriate to its unique mission.
- d. WHMU patients must meet the eligibility criteria established in Section 3. Services will be declined:
 - (1) To individuals who do not meet such criteria; or
 - (2) That **do not** meet the authorized scope of services established for eligible individuals.

1.3. SUMMARY OF CHANGE 1.

The changes to this issuance clarify the scope of services provided by the WHMU and reimbursement requirements.

SECTION 2: RESPONSIBILITIES

2.1. UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR PERSONNEL AND READINESS (USD(P&R)).

- a. In accordance with DoDD 5124.02, the USD(P&R) is the approval authority for any exceptions to provisions of this issuance. This authority may be delegated only to the Deputy USD(P&R) or the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs (ASD(HA)). Such delegations must be in writing.
- b. In coordination with the ASD(HA), Director, DHA, and Director, WHMO, the USD(P&R) will establish safeguards to secure medical records for patients receiving care at the WHMU.

2.2. ASD(HA).

Under the authority, direction, and control of the USD(P&R), the ASD(HA):

- a. Oversees DHA implementation of this issuance.
- b. Recommends to the USD(P&R) appropriate actions to effectively implement this issuance.
- c. Coordinates with the Director, WHMO, and appropriate DoD Component heads to harmonize activities under the authority of the DHA and those pertinent to managing the DoD PSP.

2.3. DIRECTOR, DHA.

Under the authority, direction, and control of the USD(P&R), through the ASD(HA), in accordance with DoDD 5136.13, and in addition to the responsibilities in Paragraph 2.5., the Director, DHA:

- a. Acting through the Director, Defense Health Network National Capital Region and the Director, WRNMMC supports the WHMU, consistent with this issuance, to achieve mission accomplishment.
 - b. Ensures patients meet the eligibility criteria established in Section 3.
- c. Issues supplemental guidance to implement this issuance in coordination with the Director of WHMO.
 - d. Ensures that the Director, WRNMMC:

- (1) Provides necessary budgetary, financial, personnel, administrative, management, equipment, supplies, training, transportation, clinical support, and other resources necessary to achieve mission accomplishment to the WHMU, consistent with applicable DoD and DHA policies and procedures.
 - (2) Provides support for WHMU compliance with:
- (a) Medical facility accreditation standards, Drug Enforcement Administration controlled substances regulations in Parts 1304, 1306, and 1317 of Title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, and other applicable requirements and standards external to DoD.
- (b) Applicable Military Health System requirements and standards for clinical quality, patient eligibility, medical records, laboratory, radiology, pharmacy, billing and collections, financial management, electronic health records, and other MTF operations, including auditing and oversight activities.
- (c) DHA requirements for proper pharmaceutical management, including procurement; storage and inventory; prescription, dispensation, and disposal of controlled substances; and formulary management, including preference for generic medications.
 - (d) This issuance and DHA implementation of it.
- (3) Supports and implements authorized DoD PSP health care activities in accordance with DoDD 5210.55, including the provision of health care services to the individuals identified in Paragraph 3.1.a., as well as accreditation visits or clinical oversight and special procedures approved by the ASD(HA) for security and confidentiality in relation to these selected WHMU patients.
- (4) Provides care outside the scope of services described as authorized for DoD civilian employees in Administrative Instruction 118 at WRNMMC in accordance with applicable DoD and DHA policies and procedures to the senior officials, established in Enclosure 2 of DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6025.23 as Secretarial Designees, who are referred for such care by the WHMU.
- (5) At the request of the Physician to the President, provides clinical oversight, credentialing, and privileges for the Physician to the President and provides support to the same for the authorized clinical activities.
 - e. In coordination with the Director, WHMO, ensures that the Director, WHMU:
 - (1) Supports authorized clinical activities of the Physician to the President.
- (2) Ensures that the provision of WHMU health care services and all clinical and clinical support operations are carried out in accordance with this issuance.
- (3) Uses established processes to interview and select personnel for assignment to the WHMU. These processes may not be modified without approval by the Director, WHMO.

- (4) Communicates the WHMU support requirements to the Director, WRNMMC, as needed, to effectively accomplish the mission and implements any process improvements or corrective actions in areas identified in this issuance.
- (5) Communicates, through appropriate DoD channels, any matters involving a potential conflict between requirements of law or this issuance and any competing instructions or requests. Such DoD channels may include the Director, DHA as well as other senior DHA officials, the Director, WHMO, the respective legal offices, or other leadership channels, as appropriate.

2.4. DIRECTOR, WASHINGTON HEADQUARTERS SERVICES.

Under the authority, direction, and control of the Director of Administration and Management (DA&M), in accordance with DoD Directive 5110.04, and in addition to the responsibilities in Paragraph 2.5., the Director, Washington Headquarters Services provides operational support and administrative services to the WHMU.

2.5. DOD COMPONENT HEADS.

The DoD Component heads require that all DoD personnel engaged in health care activities that support the DoD PSP comply with all applicable legal and regulatory requirements.

2.6. SECRETARIES OF THE MILITARY DEPARTMENTS.

In addition to the responsibilities in Paragraph 2.5., the Secretaries of the Military Departments nominate military medical personnel for assignment to WHMU in accordance with DoDI 5210.87.

SECTION 3: ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH CARE SERVICES FROM WHMU

3.1. THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT AND OTHER SECRETARIAL DESIGNEES.

- a. The President and Vice President (including former Presidents, their respective spouses, widows, and dependent children), and other Secretarial Designees identified in DoDI 6025.23, Enclosure 2, are eligible for space-available health care in any MTF. Care provided to the President, Vice President, former Presidents, their spouses, widows, and dependent children is non-reimbursable.
- b. To the extent that such services are available at the WHMU for the individuals identified in Paragraphs 3.1.a., they may be provided in accordance with DoDI 6025.23.

3.2. FEDERAL CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT.

- a. Federal civilian employees of the components of the Executive Office of the President (other than individuals covered by Paragraph 3.1.) and civilian employees of other Federal agencies who are assigned or detailed to duty at the White House complex or at the WHMO may, by agreement between the Office of Administration, which provides enterprise services to the Executive Office of the President, and the DHA, be made eligible for limited health care services from the WHMU similar to occupational health care services generally provided by agencies to civilian employees in accordance with Section 7901 of Title 5, United States Code.
- (1) Within 180 days of the date of this issuance, the Director, DHA, in coordination with the Director of the Office of Administration, will conduct a trial assessment to determine peremployee costs that will be incurred.
- (2) Within 365 days of the date of this issuance, the agreements entered into pursuant to 3.2.a. will be reimbursable agreements. On a biannual basis, the parties to the agreement will review and discuss incurred costs.
- b. The scope of services authorized in Paragraph 3.2.a. may not exceed the scope of services authorized for DoD civilian employees in Enclosure 2, Paragraph 1.b. of Administrative Instruction 118.
- c. Health care services authorized by Paragraph 3.2.a. also include the services necessary to support official travel, including appropriate services provided by WHMU personnel accompanying the official traveling party. Health care services provided during official travel will be provided on a non-reimbursable basis.
- d. Agreements made in accordance with Paragraph 3.2.a. must comply with DoDI 4000.19 and DoD 7000.14-R.

3.3. UNIFORMED SERVICES PERSONNEL ASSIGNED OR DETAILED TO THE WHITE HOUSE.

Uniformed service personnel on active duty are entitled to receive health care services from any MTF, subject to the availability of facilities and capabilities of the medical and dental staff. Such personnel assigned or detailed to duty at the White House complex or at the WHMO are eligible for available health care services from the WHMU consistent with standard MTF procedures and this issuance.

3.4. OTHER MILITARY HEALTH SYSTEM BENEFICIARIES ASSIGNED OR DETAILED TO THE WHITE HOUSE.

Individuals assigned or detailed to primary duty at the White House complex or at the WHMO who are also health care beneficiaries of the Military Health System in accordance with Chapter 55 of Title 10, United States Code, are eligible for services in any MTF. Subject to the availability of facilities and capabilities of the medical and dental staff at the WHMU, such services may be provided consistent with standard MTF procedures.

3.5. OTHER INDIVIDUALS DETERMINED TO REQUIRE MEDICAL CARE TO PROTECT THE HEALTH OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH.

- a. Any individual not covered by another paragraph of this section who is determined by WHMU personnel to require health services to protect the health of the President, the President's family, Vice President, members of the Cabinet, or Assistants to the President, by agreement between the Office of Administration, which provides enterprise services to the Executive Office of the President, and the DHA, are eligible for health care services as Secretarial Designees on a reimbursable basis. Health care services for these individuals may not exceed those required as "protective medicine" and may include services such as screenings for infectious diseases.
- b. Within 365 days of the date of this issuance, the agreements entered into pursuant to Paragraph 3.5.a. will be reimbursable agreements. On a biannual basis, the parties to the agreement will review and discuss incurred costs.

3.6. EMERGENCY AND ACUTE SERVICES FOR OTHER INDIVIDUALS.

- a. Any individual not covered by another paragraph of this section who, on the White House grounds or when traveling with the official party, has an emergency medical condition requiring immediate medical response may be provided such services, if available, by the WHMU as a Secretarial Designee in accordance with DoDI 6025.23. This may include first aid for minor injuries. This care will be provided on a non-reimbursable basis.
- b. Any individual not covered by another paragraph of this section who, when interacting with the official party off White House grounds, requires acute medical care, may be provided such care, if available, by the WHMU as a Secretarial Designee in accordance with DoDI 6025.23. This care will be provided on a non-reimbursable basis.

3.7. OTHER EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.

- a. In accordance with Enclosure 3, Paragraph 1.a. of DoDI 6025.23, the USD(P&R) may authorize the WHMU to provide health care services to designated individuals in extraordinary circumstances. In accordance with the general policy in DoDI 6025.23, this authority is used very sparingly, and only when it serves a compelling DoD mission interest.
- b. Services provided in accordance with Paragraph 3.7.a. will be reimbursable unless the USD(P&R) authorizes non-reimbursable care in accordance with Enclosure 3, Paragraph 1.a. of DoDI 6025.23.

G.2. DEFINITIONS.

These terms and their definitions are for the purpose of this issuance.

TERM	DEFINITION
acute medical care	Short-term treatment for the sudden onset of serious injury or illness.
MTF	Any fixed facility of the Department of Defense that is outside of a deployed environment and used primarily for health care; and any other location used for the purposes of providing health care services as designated by the Secretary of Defense.
protective medicine	Health care delivered primarily to protect the health or productivity of a principal, rather than the health of the patient receiving care.
Secretarial Designee	An individual without a specific statutory entitlement or eligibility who is made eligible to receive health care services from the Department of Defense pursuant to DoDI 6025.23.
White House Complex	The Executive Residence, the West Wing, the East Wing, the Eisenhower Executive Office Building, the New Executive Office Building, Blair House, Camp David, and the White House Communications Agency.
