SUBJECT: Directive-type Memorandum (DTM) 17-003 – Veterans Military Exchange Online Shopping Access Policy

References: DoD Directive 5124.02, “Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (USD(P&R)),” June 23, 2008

DoD Instruction 1330.21, “Armed Services Exchange Regulations,” July 14, 2005

Purpose. In accordance with the authority in DoD Directive 5124.02, this DTM:

- Extends limited online military exchange shopping privileges (no uniform items, alcohol, or tobacco products) to all honorably discharged veterans of the Military Services effective November 11, 2017.
- This DTM is effective January 18, 2017; it must be incorporated into DoD Instruction 1330.21. This DTM will expire effective January 18, 2023.

Applicability. This DTM applies to OSD, the Military Departments, the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other organizational entities within the DoD.

Policy.

- DoD exchange benefits are an integral and valued part of the military compensation and benefits package designed to recruit and retain professional and ready Armed Forces. Currently, DoD extends full exchange privileges (in-store and online) to honorably discharged veterans with a 100 percent service-connected disability, Medal of Honor recipients, and military retirees. In recognition of the service and sacrifice made by current and former Service members, limited online military exchange shopping privileges (no uniform items, alcohol, or tobacco products) are extended to all honorably discharged veterans of the Military Services effective November 11, 2017.
- Honorably discharged veterans may make online exchange purchases for themselves and their dependents, but these online exchange shopping privileges do not extend directly to those dependents.

- Veterans authorized online exchange shopping privileges by this memorandum are not authorized either to receive a DoD identification card or to gain access to DoD installations and other DoD property upon which exchanges are located.

Responsibilities.

- The Secretaries of the Military Departments will ensure that their respective military exchange services and supporting DoD entities implement the procedures of this memorandum by November 11, 2017.
- Under the authority, direction, and control of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, in coordination with the Director, Defense Human Resources Activity, may approve an earlier start date for full operational capability if he or she determines it is appropriate.

Summary of Change 4. The changes to this DTM are administrative and extend the expiration date.

Procedures. The military exchanges and supporting DoD entities will:

- Begin preparation on the effective date of this memorandum to achieve full operating capability by November 11, 2017.
- Track online operational and financial performance data attributed to honorably discharged veterans shopping under the authority granted by this memorandum.
- Use nonappropriated funds generated from resale activities to finance all costs associated with implementing and administering online shopping for honorably discharged veterans, including making advance payments to the Defense Manpower Data Center for database support to facilitate verification of veteran eligibility.
