The purpose of this memorandum is to share with you my views on the critical matter of the control of the use of nuclear weapons.

(X) As you are aware, the United Kingdom has asked us to revise the 1958 Murphy-Dean agreement: In addition, although an official request has not been made.

(7) In my view, the current British proposal for updating the existing U.S./UK bilateral agreement exceeds the bounds of military prudence.

While I would be receptive to allowing certain nomenclature changes in the existing Murphy-Dean agreement, I believe we should resist substantial changes to existing nuclear control agreements and arrangements, especially those that would introduce cumbersome consultation/decision processes.

(XX) The upcoming INF deployments have brought increasing public pressure on officials of the basing countries, especially in Great Britain, to answer sensitive questions on the control of these weapons.


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In order to help relieve growing public pressure on upcoming INF deployments, I recommend that we formulate question and answer guidance for use by U.S. officials when responding to specific questions on nuclear control arrangements. This guidance, which would be coordinated with individual governments and take into account their concerns, must reaffirm the basis of common purpose and mutual trust contained in existing arrangements that have served the Alliance so well for 30 years--arrangements that fully safeguard the sovereignty, security, and national interest of each NATO nation. Any specific reference to existing bilaterals, however, must be avoided.



In sum, I believe that any substantive changes to existing nuclear release agreements and arrangements would adversely affect NATO's nuclear deterrent capability. I therefore recommend against any such changes to existing bilateral agreements that would cause them to be more restrictive. Further, we should avoid entering into any new bilateral nuclear control agreements.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff concur in the above. I trust that you will provide these views to Larry Eagleburger for his use during negotiations on the subject.
