It was agreed that:

OMB will review the supplemental request for Sudan with State to meet peacekeeping, reconstruction, and humanitarian requirements. (Action: OMB and State; due by January 26, 2006)

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CONTENENTS NO

- State will engage with the African Union (AU) to expedite rehatting of the AU mission to a U.N. peacekeeping mission. (Action: State; due by January 26, 2006) (87)
- State will move forward to pass a UNSC resolution for rehatting the AU mission to a U.N. mission. (Action: State; due by January 26, 2006)
- State and DOD will outline how NATO and individual countries can support the AU Mission as a "Coalition of the Willing."

 (Action: State and DOD; due by January 26, 2006)
- State will review when it is possible to access Contributions to International Peacekeeping Account (CIPA) funds for a U.N. Mission and NATO support. (Action: State; due by January 26, 2006)
- The Africa PCC will review and validate the U.N. and U.K. proposed targeted sanctions lists. The Africa PCC will propose next steps for Deputies' consideration, including maximizing the ability to negotiate and use U.S. approach as leverage for talks with Khartoum and rebels. (Action: Africa PCC; due by January 26, 2006) (2)
- Treasury will ensure that the Executive Order to implement sanctions is fully coordinated within the interagency and ready once the United States receives sanctions designation from the UNSC. (Action: Treasury; due by January 26, 2006) (2)
- The Africa PCC will review and recommend Tier 2 issues for Deputies' consideration as presented in the PowerPoint by the Deputy Secretary of State. (Action: Africa PCC; due by January 26, 2006)
- The Africa PCC will identify a working group to:
 - Obtain and evaluate the basis for which the U.N. Panel of Experts made their decision;
 - Compare the U.N. identifiers and evidentiary information of each person against U.S. standards and determine U.S. decision on each individual; and
 - Prepare a package and recommendation for Africa PCC consideration: (Astion: Africa PCC; due February 7, 2006)

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
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

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
