



Electricity



- According to UNDP, from 1991 through 2001 average daily power production was 3300 Megawatts.
- As part of an uneven upward trend, electrical power reached a post-war peak of 3724 megawatts. Power station unreliability due to obsolete and worn-out equipment means progress will be uneven, although we have posted project managers at every power station.
- Repairs to transmission lines are still slow. A recent survey shows that about 620 transmission towers are down.

- The Oil-Power Fuel Task Force is working to ensure adequate fuel is available for increased generation. Collaboration and results are positive. Shortage of diesel is a limiting factor and other fuel sources are being sought.

- No evidence of epidemics.

- MOH has graduated two classes of 76 Iraqi Emergency Medical Service students who now serve as First Responders in Iraq.
- Results negative for radiation effects for all 2,600 (from a universe of 4,000) potentially affected by radiation at the Al Tuwaith nuclear research site.
