MOT supply of food rations to prisons

Following our discussion yesterday:

I met with the Officer on Charge of the Ministry of Trade (MOT) yesterday (Yousuf Abdul-Rahman) and briefly touched on food supply to prisons. The MOT have been discussing this internally and intend to carry on providing food rations, as they have to the Ministry for Labour and Social Affairs (MoL&SA) in the past. This is envisaged to be the same commodities and same quantities as the food ration basket under the OFF, i.e. wheat flour, rice, lentils, vegetable oil, sugar, salt, milk powder, soap and detergents. I believe in the past MoL&SA wrote a written request to MOT locally (i.e. within governorate or within the local Baghdad office) for food, providing details of the number of prisoners they were catering for. Yousuf said that he would be instructing the appropriate MOT offices in Baghdad and the governorates of their need to respond to requests from prisons.

At the meeting you should attend with MOT on Sunday (13h00), it may be useful for you to clarify the following issues. This is a regular MOT, WFP & CPA meeting on the PDS. You should explain the shift that prisons is taking away from the MoL&SA and that there are few Iraqi counterparts you are working with at present.

- To whom should the request from prisons be addressed (there are three MOT companies dealing with food rations, Grain Board, Grain Processing and Foodstuffs – the first two deal with wheat and rice, and the last with all other food stocks).
- Who will be responsible for transporting food from the mills and the foodstuff warehouses to the prisons?
- Is there a need to provide ration card details or is there a need simply for the number of prisoners expected over the course of a particular month?
- I believe the food is provided gratis – you may want to verify this.
- Given the need to ensure that prisoners are provided with an adequate diet and following international protocols, will the MOT ensure that prisoners receive the full ration basket? It is sometimes the case that standard ration requirements are not met due to pipeline shortfalls – either less quantities of a commodity are given or are dropped completely. For the current June distribution, salt and milk powder have been dropped and there are lesser quantities of oil and lentils being delivered.

In regard to providing supplements to this ration, I recommend that you meet with UNICEF nutritionists in Baghdad (contact via: [REDACTED]). ICRC may also be able to provide advice on this matter.

I would be grateful if you could keep Basrah informed of the outcome.

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FYI. I have replied to [REDACTED] yesterday informing him that MOT will provide bulk food according to the OFF ration, but will not be paying any operating / recurrent costs for prison - this would appear to be under your remit.



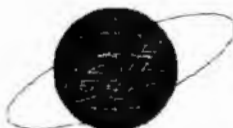

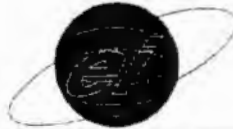

It used to work out at £60million (UKPD) for 600 inmates for a Cat A Prison; that's £100,000 per inmate. Under Design Build Finance & Operate (DBFO) the number should be lower, but I don't have any information on how much lower. Also, the facilities for a prison in Iraq will be much less than for the UK.

As a guide, I would suggest £75,000 per inmate, which gives:

*1000 bed unit	£75million	
* 2000 bed unit	£150million	
* 3000 bed unit	£225million	
* 4000 bed unit	£300million	495M\$

Economy of scale will be a factor with 2,3 & 4. Building in Iraq will inflate the figures. Construction time from start of design to first occupation for prisons here in the UK can be anything from 2 years plus, for the full service facility. Fastrack design and construction methods, including prefabrication, may allow significant programme savings.

We could ask a contracting partner here in the UK for more assistance on both cost and programme if you so wish.

POLICE VEHICLE INSTALLATION GUIDE

Safety Is Not an Option

Driver and right-front passenger air bags are standard equipment on all Crown Victoria police vehicles.

An air bag, in conjunction with properly worn safety belts, provides added protection for the head and chest in moderate to severe frontal collisions roughly equivalent to striking a parked car of comparable size at 28 mph or more.

Don't Let Anything Get in the Way of Your Job



An air bag fully inflates in less than 1/20 of a second. Anything occupying its deployment zone will not only restrict the effectiveness of the air bag, but could result in personal injury.

Safety is your job. The proper placement of after-market police equipment is critical.

Here are a few simple rules to keep in mind when installing radios, computers and the like on a police vehicle:

- Do not mount or place any objects in the deployment path of an air bag.
- Any surface that could come into contact with an inflated air bag must be "friendly." They should be free of sharp edges, corners or protrusions that could damage the air bag.
- Dash, tunnel or console-mounted equipment should not be placed outside of the zones specified in the accompanying Figures.

Air bag safety is the result of staying within the law and in this case, the laws of physics and common sense. Study these drawings well. When in doubt, play it safe. There really is no other option.

How Air Bags Work

Air bags are designed to deploy in moderate to severe frontal crashes based on the detection of sudden deceleration by sensors in the vehicle.

The air bag system is designed to activate in a frontal collision equivalent to hitting a solid barrier perpendicular at about 14 mph or more, or, roughly with a parked car of similar size at 28 mph or more. When activated, the air bag is designed to inflate fully in about 1/20 of a second. Following inflation, the air bag begins to vent almost immediately and is deflated in about one second.

The design and deployment of an air bag does not interfere with aggressive pursuit driving situations. High-speed braking or uneven road surfaces will not cause inadvertent inflation of an air bag. Any attempt to tamper with, disconnect or deactivate the air bag system could cause the bag to inflate or become inoperative, and may result in liability to the owning agency.

Push Bumpers and Air Bags

Police officers often ask whether or not push bumpers on the front end of a vehicle could possibly affect the proper deployment of air bags.

Different push bumper designs may each have different deformation characteristics in a crash situation that may not affect the deployment of air bags. Without the benefit of crash tests of vehicles equipped with push bumpers, it is Ford's opinion that installation of some push bumpers could affect the timing of

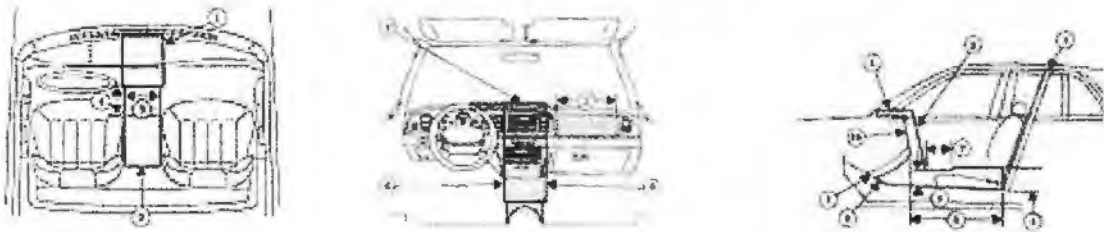
the air bag deployment. However, use of a push bumper that mounts solely to the vehicle's bumper should not have a significant effect upon air bag deployment.

Buckle Up

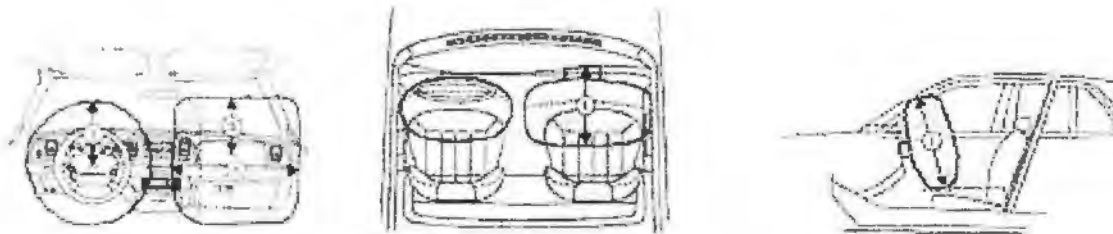
An air bag is not a substitute for a safety belt. Buckle up. Why? To start with, safety belts minimize the probability of an occupant being thrown from the vehicle during a severe side impact or rollover. Also, safety belts reduce the risk of injury in the kinds of accidents for which air bags are not designed to inflate: rollover, side or rear impacts.

Finally, safety belts reduce the risk of injury in frontal collisions that are not severe enough to activate the air bag.

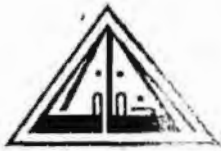



Iraq: The US must ensure humane treatment and access to justice for Iraqi detainees

(Baghdad) Amnesty International called on the United States today to give hundreds of Iraqis detained since the beginning of the occupation the right to meet families and lawyers and to have a judicial review of their detention. The organization also called on the US to ensure that detainees are treated humanely and that excessive use of force is investigated.

"The conditions of detention Iraqis are held under at the Camp Cropper Center at Baghdad International Airport - now a US base - and at Abu Ghraib Prison may amount to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment, banned by international law," Amnesty International said.

Detainees arrested by US forces after the conflict have included both criminal and political suspects. Detainees held in Baghdad have invariably reported that they suffered cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment immediately after arrest, being tightly bound with plastic handcuffs and sometimes denied water and access to a toilet in the first night of arrest. Delegates saw numerous ex-detainees with wrists still scarred by the cuffs a month later.

'Uday and Rafed 'Adel, 31-year-old twins, were arrested on 16 May by US forces who were chasing looters. Both denied involvement to US forces but were handcuffed tightly and taken to various transfer centres, and then to Camp Cropper.

"They did not interrogate us and they treated us like animals. In the first week we were not allowed to wash and didn't have sufficient water," Rafed said.

After 20 days of detention the two brothers were told they would be released but instead were taken to Abu Ghraib prison. Each day, some were released but others remained; detainees grew increasingly despairing. On Thursday 12 June all detainees demonstrated against their detention conditions. The Captain promised to inform them individually about their detention period the next day. Only six were released the next day while no news was given for the others causing the detainees to stage another demonstration. The guards opened fire above their heads. One detainee, Ala' Jassem Sa'ad, was shot dead in his tent. Seven detainees were wounded, including others in the tent.

"The USA as an occupying power must uphold international humanitarian law and human rights standards in dealing with issues of law and order in Iraq, in the arrest, detention and interrogation of

detainees and in ensuring that firearms are only used if lives are in imminent danger," Amnesty International said.

The organization raised these concerns in a letter addressed to US Administrator in Iraq Paul Bremer, head of the Office of the Coalition Provisional Authority (OCPA) on 26 June, 2003. It also asked the OCPA to publicly declare the measures it intends to take to investigate allegations of abuses during house searches, to announce preventive measures to avoid the recurrence of such abuses and to ensure compensation of the victims.

Amnesty International delegates however welcomed statements by lawyers from the US military and the OCPA that they intended to rapidly improve conditions and would eventually ensure that every detainee had access to lawyers within 72 hours.

US military lawyers who met Amnesty International delegates last week acknowledged that the failure to give information about the detainees' whereabouts was regrettable but claimed that it had been impossible until recently to set up logistics to do this.

The lack of clarity concerning procedures and law has brought about a dual system in Baghdad: some detainees are taken to US-run detention centers; their family has no news of them and they are only entitled to a review of their detention within three weeks by a US military lawyer. Others arrested for similar offences receive the protection of the procedures in the 1971 Criminal Procedure Code: their files are brought before an Iraqi examining magistrate within 24 hours. They are entitled to release if there is insufficient evidence against them.

"Many of those detained at the airport were mistakenly arrested and were released, after being detained for several weeks in inhumane conditions, with bitterness, frustration and a lack of confidence in US justice. As the net of arrests widens, so does the injustice," Amnesty International said.

Amnesty International is also concerned about a number of allegations of stealing of money from houses which were being searched by UK or US soldiers.

Four brothers, As'ad, 'Ali, 'Uday and Lu'ay Ibrahim Mahdi 'Abeidi, were arrested from their house on 29 April 2002 after a shooting in a street in Baghdad. They were hooded and tightly handcuffed.

"We spent our first night in custody lying on the ground in a school. We had no access to a toilet and were given no food or water," one of the brothers said. The next day they were taken to Camp Cropper where they were held in the open in the burning heat of the sun until tents were brought on the third day. There was not enough water for washing. All had been released by 11 May.

The brothers said that some \$20,000 in their savings and other goods was taken from the house. The Iraqi interpreter involved in the search operation said he handed over the family money to the US second lieutenant. But the money has not been returned.

"If a new future where human rights are respected is to be ensured, it is of fundamental importance that the present authorities ensure transparency and accountability for all human rights violations not only of the past but also of the present," the organization added.

Background

Detainees held in the Airport and at Abu Ghraib have no access to the outside world except the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). Family members are not allowed to visit them. In dozens of interviews, families of detainees complained that US forces had been unable to provide any information when they sought to discover where their relatives had been detained.

Widespread looting and insecurity in Baghdad have prevailed since the beginning of US occupation of the city on 10 April. Amnesty International has documented many cases of revenge killings in Iraq, as well as armed robberies, encouraged by the proliferation of weapons.
