Materials we have

Useful to note for the future

So this is a first effort to collate these ideas and Things That It Is Useful To Bear in Mind For Future for benefit of all.

 - (b)(6) explained about US State Department's Arabic Book Translation Program. It is a global program to translate American books (about 12 titles a year) with 2 purposes (i) to disseminate US books (ii) commercial the titles should be viable so that translated versions can be sold to indigenous publishers to distribute, market and profit from. The Arabic versions are prepared in Amman and Cairo. The process takes about 6-12 months. They tend to be aimed at professionals, college students and postgraduates. There is also an Outline Series, covering basic themes like "What is democracy/ market economy... etc." There is also a web resource at
 - www.usinfo.state.gov. They are printing extra quantities of their new publications this year (especially young adult literature e.g. Newbery Award winners) to send to Iraq and are estimating that about 1000 of each is about right. This sounds quite low: we might want to make some effort to estimate what would be good. (b)(6) will supply a list of all titles and we will be able to get titles through (b)(6)
 - The UK's Department for International Development put together a note for us on available resources. I extracted lessons learned and sources (both attached). The British Council is investigating whether it can supply some from its Citizenship program in Bahrain last year. - Activities and Ideas. The IRI is planning a web resource specifically for Iraq. The Iraq Foundation is
 proposing an e-democracy library, linking all resources, universities, schools, relevant national and

 the early Abbasid Caliphs to translate the western classics into Arabic during the 800s). We should find out

At the moment, the curricula are driven centrally and based on single textbooks. There are also all sorts of creative ways of doing this OTI is distributing USIP books on conflict resolution by giving them to 15 Professors who are paid \$50/ month to mentor 20 students each for 3 months at the end of which there will be an essay competition and the winning students will get laptops. Could be used by 'Invisible Colleges', which was an initiative whereby top professors coached talented students in extra time. Prizes could also include internships at Ministries etc.
