Chairman's Message

JOHN G. ROWLAND CONNECTICUT

For the first time in the history of the Republican Governors Association, our chairmanship changed hands three times in less than one year. It has been a tumultuous year for America — and for the RGA — but through it all, present and former Republican governors have stepped into vital leadership roles, from the White House to our statehouses.

It all began with the crucial presidential election of 2000, when, after weeks of uncertainty and seemingly endless recounting and court action, Governor George W. Bush of Texas was inaugurated as president of the United States. Republican governors played a central role in that long and difficult period, lending their support and voices to the Bush campaign. In the end, our constitutional system prevailed, and the will of the voters was sustained.

President Bush moved swiftly to assemble a government — and once again, he turned to Republican governors.

Governor Tommy G. Thompson of Wisconsin, the "father of modern welfare reform," was tapped to serve as Secretary of Health and Human Services in the Bush Cabinet.

Governor Christie Whitman of New Jersey, whose outstanding leadership brought an economic boom to her home state, stepped up to become director of the Cabinet-level Environmental Protection Agency.

Governor Paul Cellucci of Massachusetts joined the administration as America's ambassador to Canada.

President Bush turned to a former GOP governor, former Senator John Ashcroft of Missouri, as his new attorney general.

He also asked RGA Chairman Governor Jim Gilmore of Virginia elected at last year's annual conference — to become chairman of the Republican National Committee. Governor Gilmore handed over the RGA chairmanship to Governor Tom Ridge of Pennsylvania

Tragically, forces beyond our control brought terror to America. Governor Ridge was among the Republican chief executives who responded to terrorist acts on our soil — in Pennsylvania's case, the crash of one of the hijacked aircraft. Across our nation, governors of borh parties, and of independent affiliation, set aside past political batties to organize and rush aid to the stricken communities and to ensure the safety of their own residents.

Like the rest of America, I was also proud of the leadership displayed by our president. His fellow Republican governors had long known what kind of man George W. Bush is; now, the world recognizes his courage and calm and determination.

Following the September 11 attacks, President Bush asked Tom Ridge to resign as governor of Pennsylvania (and as RGA chairman) to accept the newly created position of Director of Homeland Security. As the fourth former GOP governor to assume Cabinet-level duties in the Bush administration, Governor Ridge is in the best of company for the difficult task ahead of us.

As the newly installed RGA chairman, I am proud to assume leadership of an organization that has produced far more than its share of outstanding American leaders. But most of all — as an American — I am gratified to be part of an organization that celebrates so many of the best things about our country... especially our free and open constitutional form of government that allows the people to decide our goals and our destiny. In the wake of September 11, partisan politics took a holiday — but democracy did not, and that is as it should be. The RGA continued to play an active role in the off-year gubernatorial elections in Virginia and New Jersey.

At the same time, your RGA continued to represent "America's Majority" — the Republican governors who lead a substantial majority of our states and the people who elected them.

Under Chairmen Gilmore and Ridge, and continuing during my time as RGA chairman, the RGA hosted a series of most successful events, from the January celebration of the inauguration of President Bush through this RGA annual meeting in November. RGA members played vital and active roles in the national debates over tax relief, energy policy and education reform, helping the Bush administration win important victories for working families. By virtue of the active roles played by outstanding GOP governors in advancing policy initiatives, we were able to play a greater part than ever before in setting America's agenda.

These are vital and historic matters that were not made moot when terrorist attacks of September 11 shifted the nation's focus. If America faced economic challenges after the attacks, imagine how serious our troubles would have been without the tax cuts enacted by Congress and modeled on so many tax reforms promoted by Republican governors throughout the 1990s. With trouble once again in the Middle East, consider how essential a self-sufficient national energy policy such as the one supported by President Bush and the RGA is today. With renewed threas from abroad, the revitalization of our national defense capabilities has become even more central to our national discussion — and our national wellbeing.

It was an astonishing and historic year for America and for the RGA. I believe it fitting that I conclude this message with the words of the final stanza of our national anthem — a stanza not often sung in the past, but most applicable to the times in which we live. O! Thus be it ever, when free men shall stand Between their loved homes and the war's desolation! Blesr with victory and peace, may the heaven-rescued land Praise the power that hath made and preserved us a nation. Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just, And this be our motto --- "In God Is Our Trust": And the star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave.

The RGA: A Year of Change and Challenge

It was a year that began with the longest presidential election in American history — and ended with great tragedy.

Through it all, Republican governors played central roles. During the extended recounting of the presidential ballots in Florida that followed the 2000 election, Republican governors were frequent — and credible — spokespersons on behalf of the Bush campaign and the rule of law. As chief state executives, they were able to speak with passion and authority about election laws. As Republicans, they stood firmly for adherence to Florida law and against efforts to manipulate and change the vote. As

Americans, they shared our national pride when that battle ended in a fair and orderly manner.

On January 20, Republican governors were again front and center as one of their own — former Governor George W Bush of Texas — took the oath of office as president of the United States.

The Bush administration brought to Washington many of the values and goals that had long been associated with Republican governors, the most innovative force in American politics during the 1990s. The president proposed tax cuts like those that had invigorated economies in state after state led by GOP governors. He put forth sweeping learning-based education reforms that mirrored those supported and enacted by his fellow Republican governors. His faith-based unitiatives to join government and the faith community in good works had been field-tested in Texas and other states — again under the enlightened leadership of Republican governors. With the enthusiastic and vocai support of Republican governors, President Bush also proposed measures to strengthen Medicare and to craft a sensible national energy policy to reduce our nation's dependence on foreign oil

Republican governors were also part of the Bush team in Washington on a daily basis. Governors Tommy G. Thompson (WT) and Christie Whitman (NJ) joined the Bush Cabinet, as did former Missouri Governor John Ashcroft and, later. Governor Tom Ridge (PA). Governor Paul Cellucci of Massachusetts was named America's ambassador to Canada — the first ambassador named to serve in the new administration.

(To replace them, outstanding Republican lieutenant governors have stepped up ro serve as chief executives: Scott McCallum of Wisconsin, Jane Swift of Massachusetts and, finally — Mark Schweiker of Pennsylvania. In New Jersey, the state Senate president — Donald T. DiFrancesco — became acting governor. In each one of these cases, these outstanding men and women have already served the citizens of their states with distinction.) We are a great ration because un have faced adversiry and overcome it. We must not lose faith; instead, we must now show strength. I am proud of the former — and currens — Republican governors who are working with the president to provide for our homeland defense on all fronts."

 Governor Jun Gilmore (VA), Chairman of the Republican National Committee Throughout the year, GOP governors were frequently quoted in the media in support of Bush administration initiatives, especially when Congress passed the president's \$1.35 trillion tax cut — a Republican idea that had proved so effective in state after state. As America entered the fall, the president's approval rating was strong. Americans were receiving the first down payment on the Bush tax cuts, and other administration programs were advancing in Congress.

Republican governors who had led successful education reform efforts in their own states were strong and effective proponents of the president's national school reform plan. This was the president's No. 1 domestic priority. Shortly before the inauguration, a group of governors met with President Bush to set priorities, and after the education bill passed both houses of Congress, Governors John G. Rowland (CT), Tom Ridge (PA) and Mike Huckabee (AR) joined President Bush and Secretary of Education Rod Paige at a White House ceremony in calling for swift action on the conference report.

At breakout sessions at the National Governors Association winter and summer meetings, and at regional Governors' Forum events throughout the year, the governors were highly visible in their support for the Bush agenda. Speaking with one voice, the governors earned major media coverage whenever and wherever they spoke out, since their own experiences in the states had helped create that agenda in the first place. The RGA communications staff worked closely with the Republican National Committee to ensure maximum media coverage of these events, including satellite feeds back to each governor's home state.

There were staff changes at RGA as well. In May, Susan Nelson became RGA finance director to lead a vigorous fund-raising effort in preparation for the 2001-2002 elections. The year ended with the return of Clinton Key as executive director, who had previously served under three RGA chairmen. Our communications, policy and corporate member services staffs remained intact with the goal of improving the effectiveness of the organization for our governors and members

Post-September 11 . . .

In the wake of the terrorist attacks on our nation, Republican Governors George E. Pataki (NY), Jim Gilmore (VA) and Tom Ridge (PA) stepped forward in states that had been directly affected by the attacks to provide calm, firm and reassuring leadership. In other states, GOP governors responded with help and action. As the terrorist threat unfolded — first in the need to strengthen airport security, and later as bioterrorist assaults emerged in widely scattered locations — Republican governors were again at the forefront of the national response. They moved to activate National Guard units, mobilize state health and law enforcement agencies and reassure their residents. They also joined their fellow Americans in offering support to President Bush as he assembled and led an international coalition to pursue, neutralize and hold accountable terrorists.

As the year drew to a dramatic close, Americans were united as never before.

Governors' Forums held in Colorado, California, New York and Michigan drew heavy media coverage as Republican governors spoke out in support of President Bush's agenda of lower taxes and real education reform. Our District of Columbia Issues Forums brought the debate on these and other issues home to Washington, where a closely divided Congress listened to the experiences of Republican governors who had succeeded with many of the same ideas in state after state. The annual America's Majority Dinner in February celebrated the inauguration of our new president. And throughout the year, GOP governors continued to act as informed, authoritative advocates for the principles of limited government, lower taxes and reform that mark the Bush presidency.

The RGA launched a National Finance Committee, an innovative program designed to reach out to business leaders who share our common domestic agenda goals: lower taxes, balanced budgets, less government, fewer regulations, and returning power back to the people. The new program concluded the year with a special evening with Vice President Richard B. Cheney in Washington, D.C., in late October. Combined with other active fund-raising throughout the year, the National Finance Committee helped the RGA raise nearly \$1 million to support our candidates and causes.

The RGA suffered a tragic death in the family at midyear when we lost Heinz Prechter of Michigan, who had served as RGA finance chairman in 1995-96, and whose leadership had made the RGA a major fund-raising force in American politics. We continue to owe a debt of gratitude to Ron Kaufman, our national finance chairman, for his dedication and tireless work on behalf of the organization.

As in past years, our 2001 Governors' Forum programs drew strong attendance and heavy media coverage. The Governors' Forum programs bring together a number of RGA governors to discuss key issues at locations outside of Washington . . . bringing the issues to the people.

Our Colorado Forum in Denver and Aspen discussed state trends in technology and ways the states can address policy to the new challenges of technology. In California, RGA governors addressed energy policies and the looming price crusis in gasoline, as well as the contentious issue of health-care policy. The California Forum spanned two days, moving from Los Angeles to San Jose, where discussion also addressed the use of technology in education. At Mackinac Island in Michigan, GOP governors tackled Medicaid policy and public finance issues of concern to the state. The RGA had also planned a fall Forum in Houston, but it was canceled following the September 11 attacks.

In addition, RGA introduced Washington, D.C., Issues Forum events, where RGA members host discussion groups on "hot topics" of the moment, reaching out to opinion makers in the nation's capital with the state perspective. Our ongoing breakfast series for RGA members and the Washington staff of our governors also encourages a lively exchange one that is emulated in RGA events featuring our governors throughout the country.

The 2001-2002 Political Outlook

Two states --- Virginia and New Jersey --- elected governors in 2001.

In Virginia, popular Republican incumbent Jim Gilmore was term-limited. GOP candidare Mark Earley, the incumbent attorney general, faced a wealthy, self-financed Democratic opponent. The central issue was taxes — Earley wanted to continue Governor Gilmore's tax reduction programs, while his opponent rook a traditional Democratic stand against tax cuts and in favor of larger, more expensive government.

In New Jetsey, Republican State Senate President Donald T. DiFtancesco became acting governor when Governor Christie Whitman accepted

President Bush's offer to become the new chief of the Environmental Protection Agency in Washington. Acting Governor DiFrancesco did not seek election to a full term, and formet Jersey City Mayor Bret Schundler emerged as the Republican nominee.

While the RGA worked to support these two outstanding gubernatorial candidates, we retained a clear focus on the 2002 election cycle, when the voters of 36 states will elect governors. Of those, 23 are currently held by Republicans, with nine of our incumbents term-limited and uneligible to run for re-election. In Illinois, GOP incumbent Governor George H. Ryan has announced that he will not seek a second term. In addition, four Democratic incumbents and one independent are also term-limited. Seven incumbent Democrats, one independent and 14

Republicans are eligible to seek re-election. Given the near-party split between the parties in both houses of Congress, it is clear that 2002 will be a competitive election year.

On October 25, the RGA hosted a major kickoff event for the 2002 election cycle. This "Evening With President George W. Bush" drew some 1,250 members and supporters to Washington and exceeded the fund-raising goal of \$1 million. While President Bush was unable to

attend due to pressing duttes (which we fully understood), Vice President Dick Cheney took his place and updated those in attendance on the ongoing national crisis. Earlier on that date, more than a dozen GOP governors gathered in Washington for the Team 1000 Fall National Leadership Meeting, which also drew key figures from the administration. Those governors later met with President Bush at the White House for an up-to-the-minute briefing on national security and homeland defense issues.

The RGA is already in high gear preparing for our next election year, which will decide who will control America's statehouses during the first decade of the new century. Many of our outstanding Republican governors first elected in the "Class of 1994" are ending their second terms and must leave office. A number of equally outstanding governors elected in 1998 are already actively planning re-election campaigns, and in other states where gubernatorial seats are either open or held by Democrats or Independents, strong Republican candidates are emerging.

Your Republican Governors Association is ready and eager to play a central role in these contests.

On the organizational front, Team 1000, our new grassroots effort, has enrolled some 1,000 new RGA members and supporters. The RGA Web site has been redesigned to provide even more information to the public and members of the media, and to attract new members. Our enhanced Web-based e-mail system allows us to disseminate information, including our RGA daily news summary, bimonthly newsletters, talking points and important briefing materials, with only a few keystrokes. The Web site contains many state-of-the-art features designed to improve efficiency and communications.

Republican Governors Respond to September 11

- In New York, Governor George E. Pataki stepped forward as a leader and uniter of his people in the wake of the worst of the terrorist attacks. He coordinated fund-raising efforts for the victims, mobilized state resources and refused to bow to terror, announcing that New York would rebound and recover. Public support for the governor soared.
- In Virginia, Governor Jim Gilmore rushed state resources to the stee of the Pentagon attack. He also launched a special task force to coordinate and inspire economic recovery.
- In Pennsylvania, Governor Tom Ridge oversaw the state response to the airline crash in his state, then stepped forward to accept President Bush's request that he serve as the nation's new Directot of Horneland Security. Lieutenant Governor Mark Schweiker, who was sworn in on October 5, quickly appointed a governor's task force on security.
- In Connecticut, Governor John G. Rowland enhanced airport security and implemented a statewide help line for the families of many Connecticut residents who were victims of the New York attack.

- In Oklahoma, Governor Frank Keating, whose state experienced the last major domestic tertorist attack in 1995, mobilized National Guard resources to rush blood to New York on September 11. As the only governor who participated in an earlier national exercise on the threat of bioterrorism, Governor Keating also emerged as a national spokesman on this important issue.
- In New Jersey, Acting Governor Donald DiFrancesco created an Office of Recovery and Victim Assistance to help thousands of families touched by the New York attacks
- In Michigan, Governor John Engler dispatched National Guard and law enforcement assets to tighten border security with Canada.
- In Texas, Governor Rick Perry established a state Task Force on Homeland Security to examine border and coastline security issues.

- In Florida, Governor Jeb Bush created Operation Paycheck to assist state residents left jobless by economic problems stemming from the attacks.
- In Ohio, Governor Bob Taft stepped up security measures at six major commercial Ohio airports and then flew from Cleveland to Columbus on October 5 to bolster public confidence in air transportation. "We are responding to President Bush's call to restore confidence in commercial air transportation and protect the people of our state," Taft said.
- The Nevada Homeland Security Commission, created two years ago by Governor Kenny Guinn, is nearing completion of a three-year strategic plan. The plan will qualify Nevada for additional federal domestic terrorism funding and additional anti-terrorism funds to help state and local agencies purchase equipment, and plan and train in preparation for potential attacks.
- Utah Governor Mike Leavitt, Wyoming Governor Jim Geringer and Idaho Governor Dirk Kempthorne held prayer services at their state capitols to comfort their citizens.
- Arkansas' Mike Huckabee and Governors Mike Foster (LA) and Bill Janklow (SD) visited blood donation centers and mosques to express support for Arab-American and Islamic communities. "Religious freedom is the foundation of our democracy," said Foster.

Across America, Republican governors joined their peers in other parties, President Bush and the American people in affirming the nation's strength and in supporting homeland security efforts.
