A DARPA Agent is an organization or an element of an organization that has been given the authority and responsibility to assist in managing a DARPA effort. This assistance usually includes all technical, contractual, financial and other required functions. The agents' technical function encompasses day-to-day performer monitoring, interpreting, and approval tasks normally carried out by a Contracting Officers' Technical Representative (COTR). The contracting functions include both negotiation and administration. The Agent also assumes financial accountability for the effort and provides any required financial reports, and provides or arranges for security and any other routine required management functions. The use of Agents helps to reduce the day-to-day technical management and contractual workload of the Agency.
