

CASE SUMMARY

- Investigation was initiated on 13Jun03 following notification USMCR, Combat Services from Support Company 135, 1st FSSG, that on the morning of 13Jun03, he was approached by a member of his unit, Control Industry USMCR, reported that on the previous evening (12Jun03). at a unit party, a member of the unit named that he and two other several other unit members (including Marines had been ordered by his former USMCR, to execute three Iraqi enemy prisoners of war EPWs) __ The executions allegedly took place in early Apr03 while unit was temporarily residing at an abandoned Iraqi pharmaceutical factory south of Baghdad. threatened to kill him if he did not carry out the executions. also claimed that after executing the EPWs, the bodies were disposed of in an eight foot deep hole. Stated after hearing story, he called in the Marines who allegedly heard make these statements. See Said each of the (three) other Marines who were present confirmed hearing statements, and believed they were credible.
- 2. Following initial reporting of the incident, interviews were conducted with the five individuals present when <u>made</u> the aforementioned statements. In addition to the following individuals were who initially <u>reported the incident, the following individuals we</u>re interviewed; Civilian, USMCR, _USMCR,_ USMCR, All of the aforementioned persons confirmed version of statements, exhibits (1) through (5) pertain.
- 3. On 13Jun03, USMCR, interviewed. Following advisment of rights and signing of a waiver, provided an explanation concerning his statements the previous night, exhibits (6) and (7) pertain. executions of EPWs never took place, and stated it was a story he made up. Stated he made up the story to tell his friends. stated unlike his colleagues, he didn't have good stories to tell about his deployment to Iraq. stated he was intoxicated, and thought up the story while at the party.



For identification purposes, I am a male, tall and weight pounds. I have hair and yes. I was born in male, the Marine Corps Reserve. My MOS is 3533, Logistics Vehicle System (LVS) operator. I am currently assigned to Combat Service Support Company 135, based out of Ft. Lewis, WA. I have been with this command since December, 1998. I have been in the Marine Corps Reserve since June, 1998.

I came forward because I was concerned about USMC, and his mental and emotional condition. Last night (12Jun03), made a claim that I found disturbing, and I felt I needed to report it. My unit returned home from deployment in Iraq this past Wednesday, 11Jun03. Since our return to Camp Pendleton, the guys in our section have been out partying each night. Our section has been very close since we were activated. On 12Jun03, our section went over to hother in law's home in Fallbrook for a welcome home party. We started partying about 1700, and lots of people were coming and going from the second mother in law's home. We were all partying and drinking really heavily. At approximately 2300, I went out of the house with my brother, Civilian. We left the house out of the back, and went around the side of the house. We were leaving to go out to a local casino. As we were walking on the side of the house, I saw tanding there talking. and (crying. After we walked up, walked up. We asked told us that around 06Apr03, he was in a convoy to Marine Base "Yankee going on. Stadium" to support 11th Marines. The convoy left "Yankee Stadium" in the evening time, and decided to stop for the night about six miles north of "Yankee Stadium" at an abandoned Iraqi pharmaceutical factory, 15-30 miles south of Baghdad (I knew about this pharmaceutical factory because I went to it in a separate convoy three days after said when the convoy arrived, did). (they were ordered to secure the buildings, and a place in the compound they would be sleeping. said they had at least one Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW) with them.

Basically, in my opinion anything could have happened in Iraq, and that's what made claim easy to believe. But I thought that suppressing issues with his dad, and needed an outlet, and get people focused on him. I think he made the story up about the killing of the EPW's as a sort of cry for help, in order to focus attention on him and his real issues. I think his statement about the EPW's was driven by his emotional state, and the alcohol he had. I saw earlier this morning in the First Sergeant's barracks room. He told me everything he said the night before was a lie, and that he felt bad about himself now because he said he felt he let us down. is marked as a liar.

There were several Marines from section at this party. I do not drink, but most of the Marines there were drinking mostly beer, I think. Some of them may have done a couple of shots, but I'm not quite sure what it was they were drinking.

At about 2230 or 2245 I walked around the corner of the house and saw standing there with some other Marines and was telling a story from Iraq. When the Marines initially saw me they all stopped talking. Shortly after repeated the story he was telling them when I interrupted. Said that during a specific mission, I don't know when, he and two other Marines were ordered by to shoot three EPW's. In the said that during a specific mission, I don't know when, he and two other Marines were ordered by said there was no where to keep them so they needed to be killed. Said he didn't want to do it but when he objected to told him he better do it or would be right there with the EPW's. Said that would order one of the Marines to shoot an EPW, from behind, in conjunction with a bomb being dropped on Bagdhad, so the shots could not be heard from any other Marines in the area. Said he dug about an eight foot hole that the bodies were placed in and after the hole was filled he drove over it several times with his vehicle so it wouldn't look out of place.

While was telling the story he was crying. The also said that he had been holding this in for almost two months and he needed to get it off his chest. The said that after this incident would exclude him and the other two Marines from whatever the rest of the Marines were doing.

There were three (Iraqi) civilian EPW's that we picked up (from south side of the area somewhere) and were taken to the back of the building (pharmaceutical plant) and we (, a grunt and a third Marine—maybe an MP... and 2 LCPLS) had to bag and gag them, on orders from the Once we bagged them, we had to dig 3 shallow graves, about 8 feet deep or so. The Major posted sentries at either end of the building before we went back so noone would come back there. The told us, "You guys will shoot these individuals now and I said, "Sir, this is wrong, I don't think we should do that." 

For identification purposes, I am an adult male, born on I enlisted in the United Sates Marine Corps Reserve (USMCR) circa Feb98 and went to recruit training at MCRD San Diego, CA, circa May98. Since Oct02, I have been a drilling reservist with the 4TH Landing Support Battalion (LSB), USMCR, at Fort Lewis, WA. Prior to being recalled to active service on 12Feb03, I was a full time student at the University of Washington in Seattle, WA, where my course of study was Biology. I reside at with my wife and two children. Circa Apr03, I was assigned duties as a tactical vehicle driver with the Motor Transport (MT) section of Combat Service Support Company 135 (CSSC-135) while deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. My duties involved support of unit mission to include convoy operations. On 10Jun03, CSSC-135 arrived back at Camp Pendleton, CA, from Kuwait. On the evening of 12Jun03, my mother-in-law, and approximately twenty (20) to twenty-five (25) of my friends assigned to the MT section to their residence located at in order to have a welcome back party. The party was held both inside and outside of the residence and included a barbeque (BBQ). During the BBQ, both soft drinks and alcoholic beverages were served. At approximately 2200, 12Jun03, See Section 2018 USMCR, CSSC-135, pulled me aside in the backyard and asked to speak to me in confidence. Some ounded serious. We went on to tell me that circa mid-Apr03, I don't recall the exact date, while he was participating in a site investigation at A.C.A.I. Pharmaceutical Company, approximately twenty (20) to forty (40) miles south of Baghdad, Iraq, he had been ordered to participate in the execution of three EPW personnel. told me that he had been one of three Marines, ordered by USMCR, to shoot the three EPWs. At the time he told me of the incident, he appeared to be in full control of himself and not acting as a result of any form of intoxication. I went to the party with a group of people from my unit. While I was there, I partied with a number of friends from my unit including brother. We arrived at mother in laws house at around 1700. We stayed until around 2300 or 2330. While I was at the party, I had alot to drink, including a twelve-pack of Tecate beer and five or six shots of tequila. By the time we got ready to leave, I was intoxicated. Before we left, and his brother and the same and I were standing near the driveway of the house talking. We were talking about probably Iraq, and what we had all done there. (Earlier that night, all of us were standing around talking about our deployment in Iraq, and everybody seemed to have a good story except me. I didn't have a story, so I started thinking up a story so I could feel like I would fit in with everyone else.) As we were standing there talking in front of the house, I decided to tell everybody the story I concocted. I told them that during the deployment, I was part of a convoy taking ammunition to 11th Marines. I said that as we were heading back to our base, we pulled into the AKIA Phamaceutical factory along Highway Six in order to bunk for the night. Everybody else had been to the factory, so they knew what I was talking about. I stated that when we pulled into the factory, we had captured three Iraqi's, who probably lived out in back of the factory. I said that had ordered us to shoot the Iraqi's. I said that when gave that order, there were two other Marines with us, a guy from 271 and a Marine from the grunts. I stated that when I refused to shoot the Iraqis, to the state of the shoot them, I would wind up in a hole with them. I told them to told us to shoot them at exactly the moment when artillery shells were falling nearby, in order to cover up the sounds of the rifles. I said after we executed them, we dug an eight (8) foot hole and buried them. I told them that after we buried the Iraqis, we ran over the dirt with Humvees, in order to pack the dirt down. As I told them the story, some of the guys would say something about what happen, and I'd grab hold of it and use it. For example, when I stated that we'd packed the graves down with Humvees, the stated he'd seen the tire tracks at the factory compound. When I finished telling my friends the story, they were really freaked out, and some of them cried. I didn't tell any of my friends at the time that this was just a made up story, and

I used the pharmaceutical factory in my story because I knew all of my friends had been there, and so my story would sound more believeable. I made up the part about the guy from 271 because I knew nobody would have any contact with them. And I knew nobody would pursue my story about the grunt because I didn't mention the name of this guy. While I didn't like I don't think he would ever kill anybody. Plus, the entire time I was deployed, our unit never captured any prisoners. Even if we had, Camp "Yankee Stadium" was only a mile and a half from the factory, and there were Marines from 11th Marines on Highway Six outside the factory, who we would have dropped prisoners off with.

Thave been to the Iraqi Pharmaceutical Factory twice, on the first and third trips my unit made there, but I don't remember the dates. We never encountered any Iraqi soldiers or other opposition there. I had nightmares in Iraq because I didn't like dead bodies, and had nightmares for a two to three week period after seeing some dead Iraqi's on a road. But I haven't had nightmares since then. In my past, I've had a history of telling lies. My story about the execution of the Iraqis was another lie. What I told my friends didn't happen, and I'm sorry for it.
