(U) RECOMMENDATION / OBSERVATION: All the compounds wired into the master manifest so MP soldiers can account for their detainees in real time and without waiting for their change sheets to be processed. This would also have the change sheet serve as a way to check up on the accuracy of the manifest as updated by each compound. BATS and NDRS system can be utilized for this function

Fix: Account for detainees in real time.

Action: With the implementation of the **Detainee Information Management** System (DIMS) set to come on line, real time transmission of changes and counts will now be possible. Currently ISN counts are conducted twice daily and changed annotated on Change Sheets. Likewise, intercompound transfers, new additions, and other topdown changes are delivered to the compounds twice daily. DIMS is in use at Abu Ghraib for all of these functions and is undergoing implementation at Camp Bucca.

Change: DIMS needs to link to NDRS.



Taguba Report – Closed Items



(U) <u>RECOMMENDATION / OBSERVATION:</u>

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- There must be significant structural improvements at each of the detention facilities. The needed changes include significant enhancement of perimeter lighting, additional chain link fencing, staking down of all concertina wire, hard site development, and expansion of Abu Ghraib (BCCF).
- The Geneva Conventions and the facility rules must be prominently displayed in English and the language of the detainees at each compound and encampment at every detention facility IAW AR 190-8.
- Further restrict US civilians and other contractors' access throughout the facility. Contractors and civilians must be in an authorized and easily identifiable uniform to be more easily distinguished from the masses of detainees in civilian clothes.
- Facilities must have a stop movement/transfer period of at least 1 hour prior to every 100% detainee roll call and ISN counts to ensure accurate accountability.

(S) CURRENT ASSESSMENT:

No change. Significant improvements made. Continues to be a working action. Require published standards from Army.

- New/Improved facilities were constructed at all theater internment facilities. Physical security has been enhanced, lighting improved, concertina wire staked down, additional fencing and gates added, and towers situated appropriately.
- Geneva Convention and facility rules are prominently displayed in all internment facilities.
- Contractors must also display ID at all times.
- All movements are stopped at least an hour before ISN counts.

Change: Ensures appropriate improvements are made to facilities, material, policy, leadership
