OBSERVATION: Patient was seen in his cell with no restraints on with a guard and interpreter present. No gross deformities noted however noted some B UE/LE atrophy. Patient is at no risk for a fall
AROM: B UE/LE grossly WFL
GMT: B LE grossly WNL
SPECIAL TESTS: Negative Lachman's Anterior Drawer or McMurray's tests
PALPATION: non focal pain along entire knee area
NEURO SCREEN: bilateral 2+/4 L4, S1
PT INTERVENTION: instruction of HEP

Assessment:

1. Diffuse right greater than left knee pain. No evidence of any fractures or internal derangement or recent MOI since the initial PT evaluation.
2. Patient does not need any brace or supportive device at this time.
