FOOD REFUSAL ASSESSMENT: Psych tech attempted to conduct interview with the detainee. The detainee stated, "I don't want to talk to you," and waved his hand to go away. The detainee was offered and refused behavioral health services. Unable to assess SI, HI and A/VH due to the detainee refusing to talk to the Psych tech.

Objective:

Per DIMS the detainee has missed 35 meals, but has intake of fluids at breakfast time prior to interview today. Per block NCO the detainee has not caused any disciplinary problems prior to interview. Upon approach the detainee was sleeping and was woken up by block guard for interview. Upon seeing the Psych tech the detainee then refused to talk to Psych tech. The detainee appeared thin but was in no medical/emotional distress at the time of the interview. The detainee maintained little to no eye contact during the interview. The detainee spoke at normal rate, rhythm and tone and showed no aggressive behavior during the interview. The detainee did not respond to internal/external stimuli during the interview. No SIB noted other than food refusal.

After Psych tech was introduced the detainee stated, "I don't want to talk to you." The detainee was offered services and the detainee stated, "I told you I don't want to talk to you." The detainee refused to continue with the interview. The detainee was told by Psych tech that BHS will be back next week for reassessment. The detainee did not respond. Unable to assess SI/HI and A/VH due to detainee refusing to talk with Psych tech.

Objective:

Per block NCO the detainee has not caused any problems today. The detainee was in a seg room. Upon approach detainee was on his rack with no restraints. The detainee had a feeding tube inserted into his nose and an IV was inserted in his arm. The detainee was sitting up on his rack and appeared to be in no emotional distress at the time of the interview. The detainee maintained good eye contact and spoke at normal rate, rhythm and tone. The detainee showed no aggressive behaviors towards Psych tech and interpreter. The detainee did not respond to any internal/external stimuli during the interview. Upon termination of the interview, the physicians arrived and observed part of the interview. No S/E noted other than food refusal.

Detainee seen off block for Food Refusal assessment with interpreter. Detainee reported via interpreter that he is "not mental or nothing." He reported that he "can't eat," because he vomits "blood." He reported that he also unable to drink water for the same reason. He reported that if his "health got better, yes" he would start eating. He reported that he is not depressed. He denied having S/H/AVH. Detainee reported that he could no longer speak.

Objective:

Upon approach detainee was speaking to corpsman from (b)(2) while laying down on the floor of his cell. He was wearing orange pants and no shirt. He appeared to be weak and reported that it was difficult to speak, but he refused to drink water. Detainee informed corpsman of his problem with vomiting blood. Corpsman will F/U with clinic staff. As per corpsman, detainee was standing laughing and smiling when they arrived to the block. As per block MA detainee has refused 25 meals.
