free and voluntary statement to (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) NAVSTA GTMO Security
whom I know to be a Patrolman for the Security Department

I make this statement of my own free will and without any threats or promises extended to me. I fully understand that this

statement is given concerning my knowledge of a medical emergency at Camp Delta

On 10 June 2006 I was working as a Patrolman for NAVSTA Security, and was riding with (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) At about 0030 I was dispatched to a 911 call to Camp Delta. The call involved an individual who had no pulse and was not breathing. At the time of the call, I did not know who the victim was. We responded Code 2, and we showed our JTF Badges to the checkpoint and were allowed to pass. We drove through the first Sally Port for Camp Delta, and there were JTF personnel who directed us to another gate. We drove through the second gate and there was a JTF MA who directed us down a dirt road towards the JTF Detention Hospital. At this point, the USNH Ambulance was behind us and followed us to the scene. We drove just past the building and stopped to look for the victim. (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) and I exited our vehicle and saw some medical personnel direct the Ambulance paramedics towards the victim. (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) the paramedics, and I carried the stretcher into the building and up a flight of stairs and through a set of double doors. We saw one victim sitting on a hospital bed who appeared to me to be dead as his feet and legs were blue. I did not see any other victims but I heard (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) (sp) telling other personnel that there were two other victims in a similar condition as the first victim. (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) and I stood by seeing if the paramedics needed any assistance and observed for about seven minutes while JTF medical and the paramedics tried to revive the first victim, with no success. The paramedics decided that since there was no doctor there at the scene, they were going to transport the victim to USNH. The paramedics loaded the victim onto their stretcher, and took him to their Ambulance. (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) and I assist the paramedics with this. Once the victim was loaded, (b)(3):10 USC §130b,(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) and I entered our vehicle and escorted the ambulance to USNH while operating in a Code 3 response. At USNH, we watched the paramedics transport the victim inside the ER at USNH, then left the hospital.//End of Statement//
