EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is presented by the Department of Defense (DoD) in accordance with Title 10 of the United States Code, section 2249c (10 U.S.C. 2249c). The Regional Defense Combating Terrorism Fellowship Program (CTFP) was established to meet an emerging and urgent defense requirement to build partnerships in the struggle against violent extremism through targeted, non-lethal, combating terrorism (CbT) education and training. The CTFP directly supports the DoD's efforts by providing CbT education and training for mid- to senior-level international military officers, ministry of defense civilians, and security officials.

The CTFP's goals are:

- Develop and strengthen human and intellectual capital that understands the ideologies and mechanisms of terrorism and the ways and means of countering them;
- Build the CbT capabilities and capacities of partner nations;
- Build and strengthen a global network of CbT experts and practitioners committed to participation in support of U.S. efforts against terrorists and terrorist organizations;
- Counter ideological support for terrorism and violent extremism;
- Harmonize views about the threat of terrorism and its evolution; and
- Develop CbT and Counter Insurgency (COIN) mutual understandings.

CTFP programs are designed to address key CbT challenges globally, regionally, and in specific countries through a tailored program of educational and training activities. The CTFP provides a unique and flexible tool that can focus efforts toward building partner capacity to meet a specific Combatant Command (COCOM) objective.

The Assistant Secretary of Defense for Special Operations/Low Intensity Conflict (SO/LIC) provides policy oversight. The Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA) provides program and financial management. CTFP events require approval from the appropriate U.S. Embassy Chief of Mission. Human rights vetting (in accordance with the Leahy Amendment) is conducted prior to any event or engagement.

As detailed in the remainder of this report and the table below, the CTFP sponsored multiple CbT educational events in fiscal year 2012 (FY12). These events involved approximately 3,300 security personnel from 145 countries, all with the goal of meeting needs identified by the regional combatant commanders.

This report accounts for the expenditure of appropriated funds during FY2012 for the CTFP, including the countries that received CTFP funding, the total amount of funding provided for each country, and the educational courses attended by the foreign officers and officials. The report also includes an assessment of the effectiveness of the program and a review of efforts to improve it.

The contents of this report are unclassified and reflect data gathered from multiple sources, including security assistance officers, COCOMs and other DoD entities.

I. CTFP CONTRIBUTIONS

A. OVERVIEW

Created in 2002, the Combating Terrorism Fellowship Program (CTFP) was established to meet Department of Defense (DoD) requirements to build partnerships in the struggle against violent extremism through targeted, non-lethal, combating terrorism (CbT) education and training. The CTFP directly supports DoD efforts by providing CbT education and training for mid- to senior-level international military officers, ministry of defense civilians, and security officials. The CTFP provides unique relationship and capacity-building opportunities that enable partner countries to address threats of terrorism within their borders and regions and strengthens collaboration with and support for U.S. and partner efforts to defeat terrorism.

The CTFP's goals are to:

- Develop and strengthen human and intellectual capital that understands the ideologies and mechanisms of terrorism and the ways and means of countering them;
- Build the CbT capabilities and capacities of partner nations;
- Build and strengthen a global network of CbT experts and practitioners committed to participation in support of U.S. efforts against terrorists and terrorist organizations;
- Counter ideological support for terrorism and violent extremism;
- Harmonize views about the threat of terrorism and its evolution; and
- Develop CbT and Counter Insurgency (COIN) mutual understandings.

CTFP programs are designed to address key CbT challenges globally, regionally, and in specific countries through tailored education programs. The CTFP is a flexible tool that can focus efforts toward building partner capacity to meet a specific Combatant Command (COCOM) objective.

The CTFP works hand-in-hand with the COCOMs to identify candidates for programs and to develop CbT programs specifically tailored to partner nations and their regional and global relationships. COCOMs recommend participants to the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) for approval. Potential candidates include senior and mid-level military officials, ministry of defense civilians, and other foreign government security officials who could have an impact on their country's ability and willingness to cooperate with the United States in the struggle against violent extremism. CTFP funds these participants to attend DoD programs in the United States and abroad. All candidates are verified and vetted for human rights abuses as required by annual DoD appropriations acts (in a provision also referred to as the Leahy Amendment).

The CTFP builds interagency cooperation among partners by training a broad range of foreign CbT military officers and government security officials, and provides specialized programs to address individual country needs. CTFP programs engage military, national police, gendarmerie, internal security, border security, and other security officials. The program enables DoD to implement the President's National Strategy for CbT more effectively by providing resources that can be targeted toward integrating instruments of national power,

traditionally expressed as diplomatic, economic, informational, and military. In addition, the CTFP seeks to integrate military instruments with other security-sector elements, such as financial, intelligence, and law enforcement.

In FY2012, approximately 3,300 foreign military, and security officials attended CTFP-funded programs throughout the six regional COCOMs. This included CbT education and training support to emerging regional and sub-regional organizations and alliances. Regional training events are particularly effective in developing personal and professional relationships among security officials from many countries within a given geographic area, and are extremely cost effective. Additionally, the CTFP provides a series of globally oriented courses that enhance mutual understanding, and facilitates cooperation across the globe.

Regional and global events are crucial in building a robust network of CbT officials who share a common understanding of CbT issues, and are able to reach out to other organizations and countries to coordinate effectively. However, in helping to build this network, the CTFP recognizes that 10 U.S.C. 2249c restricts payment of costs only to those associated with the education and training of individuals who are currently foreign military officers, ministry of defense officials, and security officials. Therefore, all foreign participants in CTFP events are screened to ensure their current eligibility under the law. In most classrooms, U.S. personnel are learning alongside CTFP-funded participants, developing and reinforcing relationships between partner countries and the United States. Only an empowered network of CbT practitioners will defeat the networks of our adversaries. The CTFP catalyzes networks and actively sustains and facilitates these connections through continuing education and training activities that reinforce relationships. The network, as it grows, will become increasingly self-reinforcing and less reliant on the United States for support.

B. REPORT REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to 10 U.S.C. 2249c, "not later than December 1 of each year, the Secretary of Defense shall submit to Congress a report on the administration of this section during the fiscal year ended in such year."

This report is submitted by DoD in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2249c and provides:

- A complete accounting of the expenditure of appropriated funds for authorized purposes including:
 - The countries of the foreign officers and officials for whom costs were paid; and
 - For each such country, the total amount of the costs paid.
- The training courses attended by the foreign officers and officials, including a specification of which, if any, courses were conducted in foreign countries.
- An assessment of the effectiveness of the CTFP in increasing the cooperation of the governments of foreign countries with the United States National Counterterrorism Strategy.
- A discussion of any actions being taken to improve the program.

C. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Since CTFP's creation in 2002, graduates of the program have continued to advance professionally, and in many cases have entered into senior-level positions in their respective countries. The CTFP works with eleven institutions to provide resident courses of various lengths and CbT focus. Under DSCA are the five Regional Centers: Near East South Asia Center for Strategic Studies (NESA), Center for Hemispheric Defense Studies (CHDS), Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies (APCSS), Africa Center for Strategic Studies (ACSS), and George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies (GCMC). The Defense Institute for International Legal Studies (DIILS), an academic institution, is also under DSCA. The other five are academic institutions: The Defense Intelligence Agency/National Intelligence University (DIA/NIU), the Naval Post Graduate School/Defense Analysis Department (NPS/DA), the National Defense University/College of International Security Affairs (NDU/CISA), the Joint Special Operations University (JSOU), and the Center for Civil Military Relations (CCMR).



D. KEY PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In FY2012, the CTFP continued to build individual and institutional capacity in key countries to combat terrorism. Highlighted below are a few of the major accomplishments:

- **USAFRICOM:** In response to the growing threat from Al Shabaab, CCMR conducted a seminar in Mombasa, Kenya on responses to maritime violence. Twenty-two participants from the Kenyan Port Authority and Navy took part in discussions on the unique challenges facing Kenya regarding the detention and prosecution of pirates. The Kenyan country presentation highlighted the substantial improvements being carried out in Mombasa, including new motion-sensing fences and cameras.

- **USCENTCOM:** Programs for FY2012 included numerous individual training events in the United States, as well as multi-national conferences conducted overseas. Of particular note was the cooperation between the Regional Centers, and NDU in hosting events for both experienced alumni and students with new CbT responsibilities in their home nations. Additionally, in September, CCMR conducted a seminar on Civil-Military Responses to Terrorism at MacDill Air Force Base. This seminar was attended by 40 liaison officers to USCENTCOM from around the world, covering topics that included tools and strategies for CbT, interagency collaboration, intelligence and information operations, terrorist financing, and international approaches to fighting terrorism.

Participants from Central Asian countries attended numerous CTFP events with Pakistan, sending 50 students to a wide range of programs. These included a focus on developing effective intelligence networks to combat terrorism, the use of special operations to improve operational capabilities, and ways to identify high-value targets and terrorist financial networks.

Lebanon, Jordan, and Egypt continued their active participation in the CTFP, highlighted by Lebanon sending 85 students to various CTFP events. These included mobile education teams conducted by CCMR on Civil-Military Response to Terror, and Media Dynamics & Public Affairs.

More than thirty Jordanian security officials attended CTFP events that focused on improving intelligence capabilities and developing special operations applications to combat terrorism.

Yemen and Oman sent more than thirty officials each to various CTFP events in FY2012. Yemen focused on programs related to the development of effective CbT policies. Oman's two priorities were intelligence programs related to CbT and counter-piracy.

- **USEUCOM:** Numerous programs were conducted throughout the USEUCOM area of interest during 2012. A noteworthy event was a one-week bi-regional seminar on regional strategies against terrorism held in Sofia, Bulgaria. The seminar brought together Southern European nations as well as Lebanon, the Palestinian Authority, Yemen, and Turkey. The seminar was divided into Southern and Middle Eastern working groups, with Turkey taking part in both. Discussions centered on common challenges and the various techniques and methods each country employs to counter them.
- **USPACOM:** The International Intelligence Fellows Program (IIFP) was held in Washington, DC and Hawaii. The IIFP is managed by the Defense Intelligence Agency and funded by the CTFP. The goal of the IIFP is to promote greater intelligence sharing across borders, and to professionalize intelligence collection, analysis, and dissemination. The program dramatically improved relationships, and bolstered regional security cooperation by providing a forum for senior leaders to gather, exchange ideas,

explore pressing issues, and achieve a greater understanding of intelligence and regional security. The 2012 IIFP focused on "Intelligence Support to Combating Terrorism," and emphasized discussion among Fellows through the innovative use of subject matter experts, off-site visits, topic discussions, and exercises. Almost 30 representatives from 20 countries gathered at the event with three specific goals:

- Building personal relationships and trust among senior intelligence leaders from the Asia-Pacific Region;
- Identifying areas of mutual concern and potential cooperation; and
- Building stronger bilateral relations and evolving into multilateral cooperation.

In the Philippines, the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and Philippine National Police (PNP) hosted the third annual Pacific Area Security Sector Working Group (PASSWG) in 2012. JSOU and the Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies (APCSS) facilitated and Special Operations Command Pacific (SOCPAC) organized the event. Security-sector leaders from 13 countries were present, including a representative from the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

The purpose of PASSWG was to enhance the understanding of non-traditional security issues specifically from the perspective of Southeast Asian (SEA) countries, and to network with SEA security-sector professionals across the region to foster enhanced collaboration and cooperation, especially in CbT.

- **USSOUTHCOM:** The region hosted several CTFP events during FY2012. Both Colombia and El Salvador hosted educational seminars designed to improve their public relations and media management skills. Strategic communications have become increasingly important in CbT, and the participants learned valuable skills in crafting unified strategic messages using a variety of media outlets.

El Salvador also hosted a regional training program on national security decision making. In addition to participants from El Salvador, participants from Mexico, Guatemala, Panama, Costa Rica, and Colombia took part in the discussions. Discussions centered on developing regional responses to the various threats facing Central and South America.

- **USNORTHCOM:** JSOU held a bi-lateral working group with Mexico, in Mexico City, to discuss the nexus between transnational crime and terrorism. The need for a common, North American strategy to deal with both criminal activity and terrorism was addressed, and numerous recommendations were offered to both the governments of the United States and Mexico.

E. CONTINUING ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY

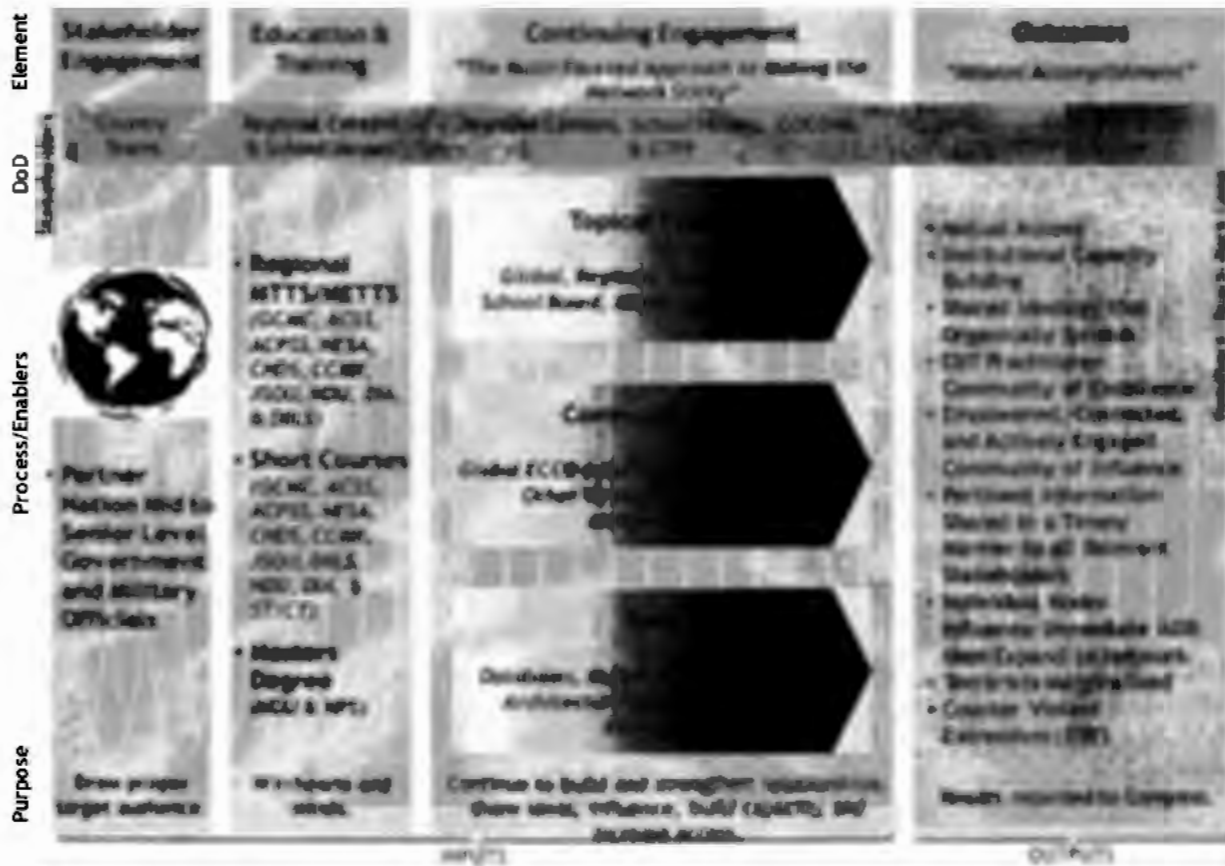
In FY2012, the CTFP continued efforts to expand individual and institutional capacity-building programs for developing a networked, global CbT capacity. Since its establishment in 2002, the CTFP has educated more than 25,000 people (see Exhibit A below). As explained in previous annual reports, “phase one” of the program focused on building a comprehensive strategic-level CbT education curriculum. This was accomplished through a combination of short, certificate programs at specialized DoD academic institutions and full-scale masters degree programs at NDU and NPS. Each of these courses and/or degrees was designed to address relevant and emerging CbT issues proactively. Starting in FY2008, NDU and NPS had the opportunity to reengage alumni through short symposiums, which set the tone for a formalized CTFP continuing engagement strategy.

As the program matured, our engagement strategy has evolved to build on the success of prior years. Under phase two of the CTFP, the program focused on providing resources to enable partner institutions to maintain and grow their educational relationships with past participants. This “phase two” of the CTFP allows DoD to realize the value of its investment more fully by creating the foundation for an enduring global CbT network. The graphic below (Exhibit B) outlines how the Continuing Engagement strategy builds on the first eight years of the program. Continuing Engagement has three main lines of effort: topical events, communication, and tools. Each of these lines of effort is intended to help create a global network of CbT practitioners working together to counter violent extremism.

As a result of the Continuing Engagement program's success, many U.S. Government departments and agencies have begun to request access to the global CbT network, including: U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA), Department of State (DoS), U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), and DIA. As indicated in Exhibit C below, the demand for CTFP continues to increase as Continuing Engagement events, expenditures, and participation have expanded significantly since 2008.

The following sections provide a summary of the events and past participant accomplishments.

F. Global Engagement

The CTFP works with the five Regional Centers (NESA, CHDS, APCSS, ACSS, and GCMC), as well as six academic institutions (NPS/DA, DIA/NDIC, NDU/CISA, JSOU, CCMR, and DIILS) to hold resident CbT courses. The academic institutions, by curriculum design and mission, educate students from all regions of the world (as opposed to the more limited focus of the Regional Centers). Each institution's program is unique based on its expertise and area of focus (e.g., special operations, intelligence, civil-military relations, legal). This global classroom design logically translates into global network activities. In FY2012, most of the Continuing Engagement funding was allotted to global or multi-regional initiatives, summaries of which follow.

Global Conference on Crime and Terrorism partnered with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sydney, Australia

More than 30 participants representing 24 nations attended the FBI National Academy Associates 15th Asia Pacific Training Conference. The theme of the event was "Organized Crime and Terrorism – What is working, what is not, what holds promise and what challenges are emerging globally and regionally."

Conferences such as this present exceptional opportunities to exchange information on emerging threats and trends in the region. They also encourage and foster professional liaison relationships that can be critical to accomplishing DoD objectives overseas. The Global Conference on Crime and Terrorism represented a step beyond the average event. In addition to 14 presentations from subject matter experts from Australia and the United States on recent cases, emerging threats, and trends, the planners incorporated a series of nine 15-minute strategy, tactics, education, and practice (STEP) talks from academic and industry leaders. New South Wales Police also provided a large-scale public order demonstration and display, complete with riot squad, dogs, horses,

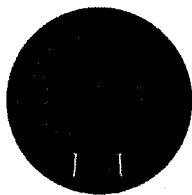


special purpose vehicles, and a helicopter.

National Intelligence University (NIU)/Joint Special Operations University (JSOU) Gaborone, Botswana

The symposium was a partnership event conducted jointly by NIU and JSOU, with support from the security assistance office of the U.S. Embassy in Gaborone, Botswana and USAFRICOM. The symposium's theme was "Integrating Intelligence, Counterterrorism

Strategies, and Special Operations to Combat Terrorism.” The participants were African regional military officers, defense civilians, and interagency civilian equivalent alumni of NIU and JSOU. The seminar objectives were: 1) Integrating Intelligence, Counterterrorism Strategies, and Special Operations to Combat Terrorism; 2) the application of CbT lessons learned from sovereign nations and sub-regions in Africa to ongoing and developing terrorism-related problem sets; and 3) the enhancement and establishment of relationships within the CbT community to foster the use of regional and whole-of-government approaches to CbT.



CCMR Bulgaria

CCMR conducted a continuing engagement seminar in Sofia, focused on developing regional CbT strategies. Officials from Southeast Europe and the Middle East were formed four working groups and participated in a series of four workshops during the week. Two of the working groups were regional: Southeast Europe (including three Turks) and the Middle East. The other groups were composed of Bulgarian officials only. Each working group was asked to evaluate regional risk; perform a net assessment against the most dangerous transnational adversary; develop strategic objectives with ends, ways, and means to achieve them; and designate specific measures of effectiveness for tracking progress toward those objectives.



APCSS Cyber Security and Counter Terrorism Singapore

This CTFP-sponsored workshop focused on the issue of identity and security in Southeast Asia. Participants examined national, ethnic, and cultural self-representations in the cyber domain, and the increasing impact on the social, political, economic development, and security in the region. This workshop helped enhance thinking and build common perspectives related to the discourse on identity as a security issue. Thirty-seven alumni participants including mid- to senior-level military and civilian government officials from a cross-section of agencies in five Southeast Asian nations (Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand), and subject matter experts from Australia, India, Iraq/United Kingdom, Malaysia, Pakistan, Singapore, and the United States took part in the discussions. Recommendations generated during the seminar were to:

- Strengthen areas of collaborative research by setting up national institutes to study identity and violence;
- Build collaborative linkages with other institutes in the region, share intelligence, and strengthen region-wide cooperation among states, leaders, and organizations to create greater understanding, political will, and unity on identity issues;
- Identify and engage the silent majority, emphasizing identity issues through education, training, and the media;

G. Individual Alumni Accomplishments:

Many of the CTFP alumni are now in prominent positions within their countries and regions. Frequently, they are asked to speak on panels and provide insight into regional and global issues. Below are a few examples of CTFP alumni accomplishments from FY12.

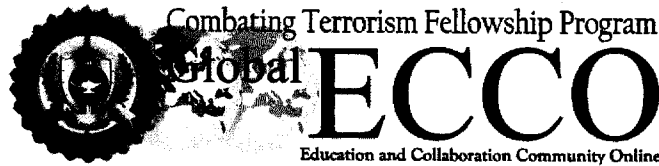

H. PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES

Updates on FY12 Initiatives



CTFP Global Education and Collaboration Community Online (ECCO): In FY2012, the Global ECCO project made significant progress toward the creation of an

online, interactive community. ECCO designed and built the website, globalecco.org, which features news, blogs, discussion boards, and unique content.

Social Media

The CTFP was very active in helping international partners understand the impact of social media on CbT. In addition to helping educate host nations in the effective use of social media to counter violent extremism, the CTFP devoted significant resources in developing and providing tools to help international partners identify and track terrorist leaders through their use of social media.

NPS CORE Lab

The CORE Lab developed a three-week curriculum designed to introduce and develop basic social network analysis (SNA) capacity for select partner nations. The CORE staff is working with select analysts from several nations to assist them in rapidly developing a basic understanding of SNA theory and techniques with the purpose of applying these newly acquired skills for detecting and displaying "dark networks".

New Initiatives for FY2013

- **The Asian Defense Ministers, Plus (ADMM+) Counterterrorism Conference.** CCMR, working with SOCPAC, developed a plan for support of ADMM+ "Experts Working Group on Combating Terrorism" event, to be conducted in September 2013. This event will feature a tabletop exercise for all eighteen governments, as well as a "practical exercise" conducted for selected tactical-level forces. The practical exercise, non-lethal in nature, will be coordinated with the tabletop exercise scenarios.
- **Global ECCO.** The Global ECCO project will continue to mature in FY2013. After undergoing testing with users in the first few months of FY2013, it will be active beginning the spring of 2013. The ECCO project will continue to work on the CbT Archives sub-project, which has collected the personal experiences of international and U.S. personnel in the fight against terrorism for use in developing international "lessons learned." To date, 86 interviews have been collected, 32 of which have been edited and posted to the website. In FY2013, this project will continue to collect interviews from CTFP alumni and others. The ECCO project has also made significant progress in creating several types of interactive, strategic CbT war games. In FY2013, these games will be integrated into the globalecco.org website. Additionally, new games on dark networks and counter-ideologies will also be developed in FY2013.

I. SUMMARY

The CTFP is a valuable tool in the global fight against terrorism, and fills a crucial void in U.S. efforts to provide targeted international CbT education and training. The close relationship between OSD and the COCOMs has turned the program into a strategic tool in the struggle against violent extremism that effectively supports the efforts of the COCOMs in achieving their objectives through flexible, targeted international partner education and training. Building on previous efforts, the CTFP made significant strides during FY2012 to develop and reinforce the CbT capabilities of partner nations, and to strengthen a global network of CbT experts committed to the fight against violent extremism and their proponents. Senior DoD and DoS officials consistently note the value of a global CTFP network and derive benefit through active participation in CTFP activities or by accessing the network to gain a better understanding of partner perceptions and best practices. The CTFP's continued efforts in operationalizing the global network, through a combination of targeted education and virtual communication, will help to ensure that the United States has a vast resource of CbT capability from which to draw in the years to come.
