Background:

Politburo Standing Committee Member and Vice President Hu Jintao was appointed to be the First (senior) Vice Chairman of the Military Commission in September 1999. This is widely seen as a signal that he is President Jiang's designated successor. The appointment serves to give Hu a means to develop a working relationship with the senior PLA leadership and an understanding of military issues and perspectives. He is expected to have a prominent role, whether it is as President or not, in the 16th Party Congress leadership which will be selected in 2002. He has had minimal, if any, direct contact with the U. S. military.



Objectives:

• Set the foundation for a long term working relationship between the Defense Department's civilian leadership and the Vice President Hu.
