





• (U) North Korea arming with missiles and weapons of mass destruction, while its citizens starve.
• (U) Ongoing development of weapons of mass destruction and missile-related activities pose a continuing threat to regional security and U.S. forces, friends and interests around globe.
• (U) Regime is world's number one exporter of ballistic missiles and technology. North Korea's missile exports, which arm states in already tense regions, threaten U.S. forces and friends and are irresponsible.

#### TALKING POINTS ON IRAQ

- (U) Iraq's inflammatory statements after 11 September attacks, as well as continued rejection of UNSCRs, makes it clear Baghdad will take every opportunity to undermine fight against terrorism.
- (U) Saddam Hussein has barred UN weapons inspectors from searching for weapons of mass destruction since 1998.
- (U) Saddam Hussein's continued threats against Kuwait provide unequivocal proof he remains a threat to peace in region.
- (U) Iraq continues to flaunt hostility toward America and to support terror. Saddam Hussein continues work on anthrax, nerve gas, and nuclear weapons.
- (U) Iraq butchered thousands of own people with poison gas. Saddam murdered Shia clerics, tried to exterminate Marsh Arabs, and is conducting ethnic cleansing against Kurds in areas under his control.
- (U) Iraq accepted United Nations Security Council Resolution 687 as a pre-condition to cease-fire with United States and allies. Promised to disband weapons efforts and allow unconstrained international inspections. Pledged to renounce international terrorism.
- (U) Iraq in violation of cease-fire agreement with United States and in breach of numerous United Nations Security Council Resolutions. For over three years, Saddam Hussein blocked international inspections and rebuilding his deadly programs.


