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**WHAT WE HAVE DONE FOR PAKISTAN  
(as of February 2007)**

**Foreign Military Financing (FMF)/Economic Support Funds (ESF)**

- In 2003, the President approved a five-year, \$600M per year military and economic aid package from FY05 to FY09 (subject to Congressional approval). This aid is split between Economic Support Funds (ESF) and Foreign Military Financing (FMF).

**Earthquake Relief**

- To date, the U.S. has pledged a total of \$510 million in earthquake relief and reconstruction efforts. This total includes:
  - \$300 million in FY06-FY09 assistance from USAID;
  - \$110 million in military support for relief operations [NOTE: This is a low estimate of total military in-kind assistance]; and
  - \$100 million anticipated from U.S. private contributions.

**Coalition Support Funds**

- To date, we have provided Pakistan with \$4.8B in Coalition Support Funds (paid Pak reimbursements through August 2006).
  - Coalition Support Funds are used to reimburse Pakistan for their operations in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF).
  - Currently, the Pakistanis are requesting reimbursement for such things as:
    - transportation (airlift, sealift and ground transport);
    - expenditure for food, waster removal, base support, etc.;
    - petroleum, oil, and lubricants for support of vehicles, heaters, electrical generators, etc.;
    - security for transiting or deploying forces;
    - helicopter flight hours and other aircraft use; and
    - cost incurred to coordinate operations in support of U.S. requirements.

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### **1206 Global Train and Equip**

- We are in the process of providing approximately \$22M in training and equipment that will improve Pakistan's air assault capabilities in the GWOT.
  - Our FY07 1206 program will include \$4.5M for Pakistani Army Aviation and special forces enhancement.
  - A proposal to add \$71.5M of 1206 for the Frontier Constabulary has been vetoed by OSD GC, citing the FC's status as a Ministry of Interior force (excluded from 1206).

### **Foreign Military Sales**

- Air Assault Package (\$235M paid for with CSF):
  - two-year lease for 26 Bell 412 helicopters, spare parts, tech support and training for pilots and maintenance personnel;
  - 260 sets of night vision goggles (plus training); and
  - 239 NATO-compatible radio sets.
- We have sold or are in the process of selling to Pakistan:
  - 300 Aim 9Ms;
  - P-3C maritime patrol aircraft;
  - 60 Harpoon II;
  - 130 additional Harpoon Block II missiles;
  - 6 Naval Close-In Weapons Systems—CIWS ;
  - 2,014 Tow 2A Missiles;
  - an additional 2,774 additional TOW-2A(RF) Missiles and 422 TOW-2A Penetration Missiles;
  - Cobra spare parts;
  - follow-on support for their F-16 fleet;
  - laser-based Infrared Countermeasures System (LAIRCM) (\$20.0M): for Presidential aircraft;
  - 6 TPS-77 Radar systems;

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- 6 C-130 aircraft;
- 5,591 Harris Radios;
- 115 M109A5 Self-Propelled Howitzers; and
- Vehicle Mounted Stinger Launch Platform (VMSLP) and missiles.
- Excess Defense Articles (grant transfer)
  - 8 P-3 aircraft (Pakistan is using FMF to refurbish them);
  - P-3B aircraft, four (4) each, for conversion to Airborne Early Warning (AEW) configuration;
  - 19 Excess Defense Articles T-37 aircraft provided to Pakistan in September 2003 (USG grant);
  - 50 F-16 370-gallon external fuel tanks and 50 pylons;
  - 30 F-16 Fire Control Computers (worth \$15M);
  - 20 AH-1F Helicopters (Pakistan is using FMF to refurbish them); and
  - 20 AH-1F Helicopters for use as spare parts.

**F-16s**

- We are currently in the process of selling Pakistan:
  - 18 New F-16 Block 50/52 aircraft (with an option to purchase an additional 18);
  - Mid-Life Updates to the current fleet of 34 Pakistan F-16A/B aircraft;
  - 26 Used F-16s plus mid-life updates; and
  - weapons package for the new and used F-16s.
- We have provided Pakistan with 2 EDA F-16A aircraft (Delivery was made on December 13, 2005).

**DoD Counter-Terrorism Fellowship Program**

- We have provided Pakistan \$3.7M from FY02-FY07 for counter-terrorism training and courses through the Counter-Terrorism Fellowship Program.

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### **DoD Counter Narcotics Funds**

- **Currently, DoD programmed \$3M and is requesting approximately \$41M in FY07 CN funds for Pakistan. This will be used to train and equip CN forces in the FATA region and to provide infrastructure and equipment for CN operations in the Makran Coast.**
- **DoD is provided \$28.7M in counter-narcotics funds (CN) to Pakistan in FY06 for improving maritime interdiction capabilities on the Makran Coast.**
- **In FY05 DoD provided \$7.7M in CN funds that Pakistan used to purchase scanners, observation towers, and refurbish patrol boats to improve coastal interdiction capabilities.**

### **IMET**

- **We have provided Pakistan \$2.024M in IMET Funds in FY06. (We have provided Pakistan a total of 7.168M of IMET since 2001.)**
- **Current plans are to provide Pakistan with an additional \$2.075M in IMET in FY07.**

### **Law Enforcement/Counter-Narcotics Programs (State-INL INCLE funds)**

- **State has requested \$25.5M in INCLE money for Pakistan in FY07.**
- **State is providing \$37.6M in FY06 INCLE assistance to Pakistan.**
- **State provided \$32.1M in INCLE funds funding for FY05. This was used for:**
  - **Counter-narcotics**
    - **Alternative crops, demand reduction training, roads to facilitate farm-to-market access.**
  - **Border Security/Guards**
    - **10 Huey II Helos and 3 Cessna 208s to Ministry of Interior for Balochistan border security**
    - **Roads and bridges to support access to FATA area**
    - **Training and technical assistance for effective border operations**
    - **Border outposts**
  - **Law Enforcement**
    - **Info Technology, fingerprint analysis**

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
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- Technical training and assistance
- In FY04, State Department gave Pakistan \$31.5M in INCLE funds. This included funds for:
  - Purchase of five helicopters for use in border security
  - Road, border outpost, and port construction
  - Law enforcement training projects
  - Automated Fingerprint ID System (AFIS) implementation

**Other State Department Funding**

- Child Survival Health: State provided Pakistan \$21M in FY05, \$26M in FY06, and is requesting \$21.7M in FY07.
- Development Assistance: State provided Pakistan \$29M in FY05, \$30M in FY06, and is requesting \$29M in FY07.
- Anti-Terrorism Assistance: State provided Pakistan \$6M in FY05, \$6.1M in FY06, and is requesting \$8.5M in FY07.

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**Debt Relief/International Loans:**

- The USG has provided \$1.5B in debt relief.
  - There are no plans for additional debt forgiveness.
- The USG has led efforts in the Paris Club on debt restructuring and forgiveness, resulting in generous terms that have dramatically reduced Pakistan's debt.
- The USG has backed loans from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), which resulted in a \$1.47B three-year Poverty Reduction and Growth Facility (PRGF) arrangement.

**Major Non-NATO Ally Status**

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- USG granted Pakistan Major Non-NATO (MNNA) Ally status in June 2004.
  - Largely a symbolic gesture with limited potential for substantive benefits.
- Activities under MNNA could include R&D projects with DoD in areas such as counter-terrorism, basic materials, or medicine.

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
