MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

SUBJECT: Cuban Activities in the Western Hemisphere -- INFORMATION MEMORANDUM

The threat to US interests posed by Cuban activity in Latin America is of a different character than the African situation but no less worrisome. In Latin America Castro has embarked upon a careful effort to increase Cuban influence and foster new communist states. His techniques are nonmilitary and generally subtle, fearing that overt military action in our backyard would precipitate a US military response. Castro has selected ways to promote his aims without provoking the US or even arousing much public concern in the US.

The Situation

Castro is concentrating on the Caribbean where the new, small countries are resource poor, undeveloped, and until recently, dependent upon a major foreign power for survival. Their governments are weak and often plagued by power struggles, violence and incompetence. The colonial heritage has left a legacy of bitterness and distrust of the major powers. With its economic control and Socialist discipline, its growing reputation as a third world leader, and a history of success against the US, Cuba offers an attractive example to these struggling mini-states.

They also have few options to resist Cuban advances. Militarily, economically, and politically we pay little attention to the Caribbean community. In sum, conditions are excellent for Castro in the Caribbean as long as he does not invoke our wrath through overt military aggression.

Tactics and Operations

Castro's current tactics are to:

- Infiltrate the political and economic power base of the largest countries and influence their policies.

-- In Jamaica 300 Cuban advisors are engaged in economic develop-

security forces; 120 Jamaican youths have received "construction" training in Cuba and 300 more will go later this year. Some 90 recently returned youth are being used by Prime Minister Manley as political action cadres. Manley expressed admiration for Castro and increasingly looks to him for advice.

- -- In Guyana 100 Cubans are engaged in economic development projects. Several hundred Guyanese Defense Force personnel have been trained in Cuba. Prime Minister Burnham's personal bodyguard force was trained by Cubans and Cubans were totally responsible for security at the 26 May independence celebration. Burnham is another strong Castro admirer. The Cubans suggested the Guyanese propaganda campaign about an invasion threat from Brazil. Burnham admitted no threat existed but claimed that the campaign has united the country. Guyanese defense personnel have been trained in Cuba for guerrilla and jungle warfare. Guyana has been used as a refueling stop for Cuban planes in transit to Angola.
 - -- Cuban intelligence tried to recruit the Attorney General of Belize.
- -- The Cubans have apparently offered assistance in agriculture, housing and political organization to Dominica, a British associated state planning independence within the year and whose viability is in doubt.
- Foster closer state-to-state relations in Latin America, thereby limiting the opposition of the other states to Cuban efforts and obtaining their support for Cuban positions in international forums.
- -- A Cuban official is working behind the scenes to establish full diplomatic relations with Ecuador.
- -- Fifty Peruvian Air Force pilots recently completed flight training in M-16s in Cuba. Thirty-six plus Peruvian cadets are there now. (With recent political change in Peru, Cuban-Peruvian relations have cooled.)
- -- Cuba is pressing for reestablishment of consular and diplomatic relations with Costa Rica.
 - -- Expanded landing rights have been negotiated with Barbados.
- -- Upsurge of Cuban visits to Surinam, Barbados, the Bahamas and other Caribbean islands have been reported including meetings to discuss improved relations.
- -- Reports indicating Cuban-Colombia commercial relations continue to improve.
 - √-- Castro is actively courting the Mexican leadership.
- -- Active Cuban friendship societies have been formed in Surinam, Guyana, Guadeloupe, Jamaica and Martinique.

Covertly export revolution, disruption and terrorism.

- "- Venezuelan terrorists claimed that direction for Niehous kidnapping and other planned kidnappings in Venezuela, Colombia and Argentina is coming from Cuba.
- -- A Cuban was reportedly responsible for development of the logistical structure for terrorists in Argentina.
- -- Leaders of guerrilla activity in Guatemala are apparently Cuban trained.
- -- French have expressed concern over expanded Cuban Interest and possible Cuban subversion in the French Caribbean Islands.
- -- Cubans are training Nicaraguan guerrillas in Cuba and have promised limited financial support.
 - Actively pursue anti-American actions.
- -- Reports indicate that Cuba is behind Jamaican recent anti-American propaganda campaign.
- -- Castro says he can deliver heavy artillery to Panama without arousing US suspicions. He has also offered paramilitary training to Panama. The 26 March student demonstration at the US Embassy in Panama City was promoted by the Cuban Embassy.
- -- Havana based radical labor unions have initiated a campaign for support of Puerto Rican independence. Castro has promised all necessary support. Puerto Rican labor leaders will be sent to Cuba, Eastern Europe and Soviet Union for training.
- -- Castro has promoted regional structure to exclude the US and align small countries toward Cuba. For example:
- --- SELA (Latin American Economic System), NAMUCAR (Caribbean Multinational Shipping Association), and GEPLACEA (Latin American and Caribbean Sugar Exporters Group), and the new radical Caribbean labor union.

<u>Implications</u> for US Policy

Castro is successfully capitalizing on the endemic problems of the area and indifference thereto. The near term consequences of his policies and actions in Latin America are not momentous yet they are ominous. Castro
