The support furnished by DoD/Army was non-operational and was approved by OSD and/or Army Secretariat and has been provided by both the Active and Reserve components.

 - (a) two utility helicopters (UH-1);

Would it be possible for the TXARNG to explain what role the Counter Drug Command Group may have played in arranging for the use of Fort Hood facilities for training of BATF agents in preparation for the raid on the compound, if such was the case.

A sit-down interview with or any other Guard officials who can explain the role of TXARNG in the raid would be ideal.

I'm also interested to find out specifics of TXARNG activities in the duty office or command center on the morning of the raid.

I would also appreciate interviews with the air crews of the OH-58 helicopters and UH-1 helicopter used in the morning raid along with information about what level of damage these aircraft suffered.

You attention to this detailed and complex information request is greatly appreciated and I look forward to working something out.

- 7. Aircraft 689 was sent to the field site after 355 departed with the patient. Aircraft 587 remained at TSTC.
- B. At 1700hrs ATF/FBI officials released the standby aircraft at TSTC and requested 680 remain at the field site for one more hour.
- 9. Aircraft 355 returned from Dallas with five ATF agents on board and was subsequently released. 689 departed at 1860hrs and returned to Hood AAF at 1960hrs.



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

On the morning of February 28, 1993, I was pilot in command of a life UH-60L helicopter assigned the task to act as a diversion while ATF personnel approached the Mount Carmel compound outside of Waco, Texas.

At approximately 0945 we approached the compound from the Northeast following two OH-58 helicopters. We began to receive gunfire on the approach


but at no time returned the fire.

My helicopter was not armed nor did any of the crewmembers carry weapons. The ATF agents we were transporting carried side arms but at no time did they discharge said weapons while on board the aircraft.

The aircraft, SN 91-26319, carried external fuel pods and flew with all doors closed making it impossible to discharge weapons from the passenger

compartment.

I submit that these statements are true and correct.
