OBSERVATIONS: (U)

We do a good job of depicting the critical information requirements and have a link in the LNO Guide for automated sending of SPOT reports for them. What is not so clear is the expectation for LNO reporting of lower level incidents that could develop into a significant / CIR related situation.

DISCUSSION: (U)

The LNOs at the Multiagency Coordination Center (MACC) have visibility to multiple law enforcement and public safety organizations. MACC LNOs monitor events in the Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) event tracker and, in many cases, have video feeds for incidents in the tracker. The US Secret Service (USSS) leads often provide verbal updates for some of these incidents. During the Nuclear Security Summit (NSS) MACC LNOs reviewed the HSIN events and made judgment calls on which might be of interest or could rise to a CIR level activity. MACC LNOs generally captured each of the HSIN events in their LNO Activity Log (ICS 215). They selectively sent SPOT reports to the NCR Watch and ERT-A Operations Chief. One example of an incident like this, with an associated update, is shown below.

01APR/0738: As of 0620 The DC National Guard reports - Protest gathering in the vicinity of 11th and L Street. Approximately 500 people. DC Guard personnel have eyes on and are monitoring. No issues to report at this time. Sent SPOT Report to NCR Watch – Posted to Web EOC.

The LNO's judgment was that the size and location of this event... though not at CIR... was cause to at least report it as "early warning." As it happens, this event later escalated and the SPOT report below was sent forward.

01APR/1053: Initial Report from 0738 by the DC National Guard - Protest gathering in the vicinity of 11th and L Street. Approximately 500 people. DC Guard personnel have eyes on and are

monitoring. No issues to report at this time.

As of 1010 - Protest is becoming unruly. MPD is responding. Sent SPOT report to NCR Watch at 1053

RECOMMENDATION: (U)

MACC LNOs do not know whether the ERT-A found these reports useful or if the ERT-A was already monitoring them through HSIN or other means.

If NSSE LNOs are supposed to use WebEOC for monitoring (activity reporting, etc.). It makes sense to have the LNO boards include all critical links and information needed. It would also be a good idea to inform the LNOs of the need to obtain the LNO view in WebEOC in advance of the event and to provide time, perhaps during a pre-event exercise, for them to open this view and learn what boards are available and where to find them. Since LNOs were not sure where their activity reports were being posted (Region III, ERT-A, NRCC, etc.) we tended to limit items posted to the activity log in WebEOC while using a more detailed log (ICS 215) of nearly all actions taken during the shift. This created duplication of effort for significant actions that were recorded in both places.

Corrective Action: (1) A call was held with Liaisons to clarify reporting procedures and expectations. (2) The Liaison Officer Reference Guide is being revised to ensure that clear guidance on reporting procedures is codified. ONCRC LNOs and Region III Operations are providing comments to ensure a comprehensive and compatible updated LNO guide.
