Dear Bill:

After reexamining the points contained in your April 28 memorandum regarding Pakistan's request for Redeye missiles, I am convinced that our wisest course of action is a conventional one. Considering that we have firmly and publicly established a major security assistance program with Pakistan, President Zia's desire for Redeyes can be satisfied rapidly, [redacted] and best through Foreign Military Sales procedures.

However, as I am sure you appreciate--though Zia may not--Defense has no means for providing these weapons without cost to Pakistan. Our financial assistance to help Pakistan purchase U.S. arms will not begin until FY 83. Even then, the program contains no grants, only credits. While I cannot fault Zia for wishing to obtain Redeyes [redacted] cost-free

I do not believe this is justifiable.

In recognition of the possible increase in the air threat from Afghanistan, we have been prepared since early March to respond to a formal Pakistani FMS request by diverting Redeyes from U.S. Army stocks and delivering them expeditiously. The unit price for the missile is \$15,000; the full package cost, including spares, support equipment, transportation, etc., is approximately \$2.8 million. Compared to the other purchases Pakistan has made from us and the additional procurements it has under consideration, the Redeye transactions would be a modest and unexceptional one.

Accordingly, [redacted] I suggest [redacted] Islamabad [redacted] request a Letter of Offer and Acceptance for Redeyes through the U.S. Embassy. Defense will act on this request immediately after receipt.

SUBJECT: Pakistani Request for Redeye Missiles *(S)* -- ACTION MEMORANDUM

(S) [redacted] Pakistan's President Zia, [redacted] brought up his unresolved request for cost-free Redeye missiles. This request was made [redacted] last November, [redacted]

(S) [redacted] the original request (Tab B) to the Department of State. Under Secretary Buckley supported the transfer in a letter to DepSecDef (Tab C). In his 6 March response, DepSecDef stated DoD's willingness to divert [redacted] Redeye missiles from U.S. Army stocks for immediate sale and delivery to Pakistan (Tab D). State shared this information with CIA. However, we have received no subsequent request from Pakistan for an FMS purchase of Redeye.

(S) [redacted] memorandum seems to imply that [redacted] President Zia hold out hope that DoD can find a way to provide Redeye at no cost to Pakistan. We cannot. I recommend you sign the reply beneath suggesting that [redacted] the Pakistanis [redacted] initiate an FMS purchase of Redeye and assuring them that Defense will arrange rapid sale and delivery.

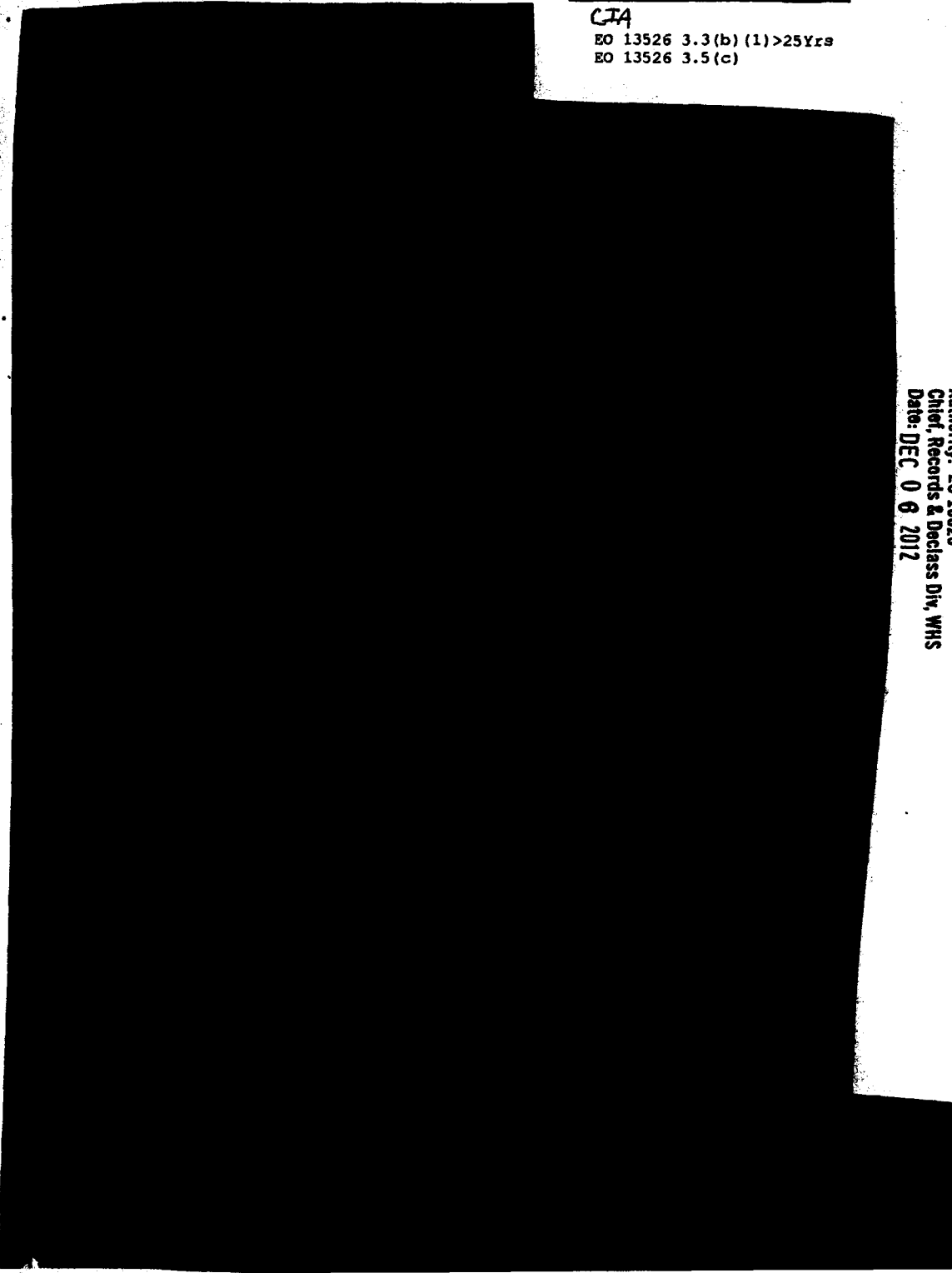

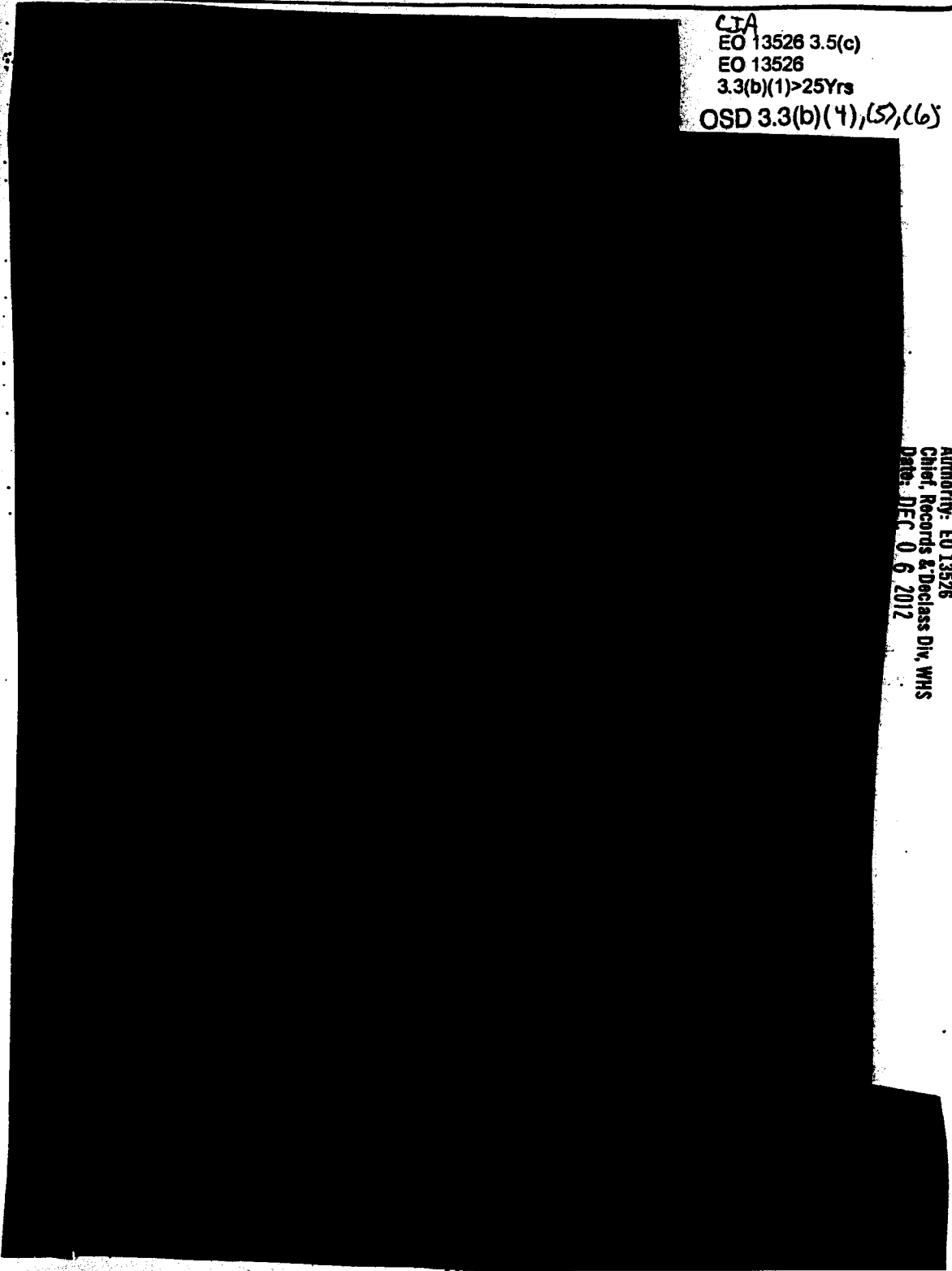



Dear Frank:

As you will see by the enclosed memorandum, the Pakistanis have made an urgent request for ~~REDEYE~~ REDEYE missiles. Last December we anticipated a similar Pakistani request for ~~missiles~~ missiles. Our two Departments agreed to approve their sale at \$15,000 per missile and to divert them from US Army stocks. The sale never materialized. On receipt of this latest request, we checked with DSAA and understand that ~~REDEYES~~ REDEYES could be offered at the same \$15,000 per missile price, but that your authorization is required to divert them from inventory.

I think you will agree that the Pakistan requirement is both real and urgent in the face of increasing Afghan/Soviet cross-border air attacks. I would like to request therefore that you take the necessary action to offer ~~REDEYES~~ REDEYES to Pakistan on an expedited basis.

I have reviewed the Government of Pakistan's request for urgent delivery of REDEYE air defense missiles. After assessing the impact on the U.S. Army's combat readiness, I concur that the importance of expedited delivery of these missiles to Pakistan outweighs the adverse impact of diverting these missiles from Army stocks.

My decision constitutes the exception to the National Disclosure Policy required to permit the sale of this classified weapon system to Pakistan. Accordingly, I have requested the U.S. Army take the necessary action to arrange for the FMS sale and expedite delivery of the missiles to Pakistan.

I suggest you advise Ambassador Spiers that we are proceeding on the assumption that the accelerated purchase of REDEYE under normal FMS procedures is acceptable to the GOP.
