Dear Bill,

(S) On November 10 I advised you that the Defense offer to sell Pakistan 100 Redeye missiles through Foreign Military Sales procedures remained valid but that we would have to determine with the Army if the larger quantity of 400 Redeyes could be made available.

(S) The withdrawal of an additional 300 missiles from Army assets would have a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness. Since October 1978 the Redeye missile has had a rocket motor ignition problem, and only those missiles which will be used for training practice are being retrofitted to correct the problem. The 100 Redeye missiles available for sale to Pakistan have been retrofitted; however, the Army is already below its required number of Redeyes for training and further withdrawals would negatively impact U.S. force readiness.

(S) Army assets of man-portable air defense systems (MANPADS), such as the Redeye, are expected to be improved by 1986. At that time, we anticipate that we would be able to provide Pakistan with additional Redeyes, should the Pakistanis still have the requirement. We believe that the 100 Redeye missiles presently available are sufficient to meet current Pakistani requirements.

SUBJECT: Pakistani Request for Redeye Missiles *(b)* -- ACTION
MEMORANDUM

(b) On November 10 you advised the Director of Central Intelligence that we were reviewing with the Army the Pakistan request for an additional quantity of Redeye missiles to determine whether they could be provided without a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness (Tab A).

(b) In our view the withdrawal of the additional 300 Redeye missiles from Army assets would have a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness (see Army paper Tab B). The attached response advises the Director of Central Intelligence that, at this time, we are unable to make available the additional 300 Redeye missiles from Army assets because of this adverse impact. We are, however, still prepared to provide 100 missiles.

Dear Bill,

(TS) In response to your October 26 letter concerning provision of Redeye missiles to Pakistan, the Defense offer to sell 100 Redeyes through FMS procedures for U.S. \$2.8 million is still valid. Defense is prepared to provide the Government of Pakistan a LOA for this quantity upon their request.

(TS) The original quantity of Redeyes was offered to Pakistan for immediate delivery by diverting U.S. Army stocks. It is necessary to determine with the Army if the larger quantity can be made available to Pakistan from stocks without a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness. After reviewing the Army position, expected in the next two weeks, I will be in a better position to provide a response to your query.

(TS) As you request, we will review the total package to ensure that there are no duplications in services associated with the increased quantity of missiles which would unnecessarily add to the total price.

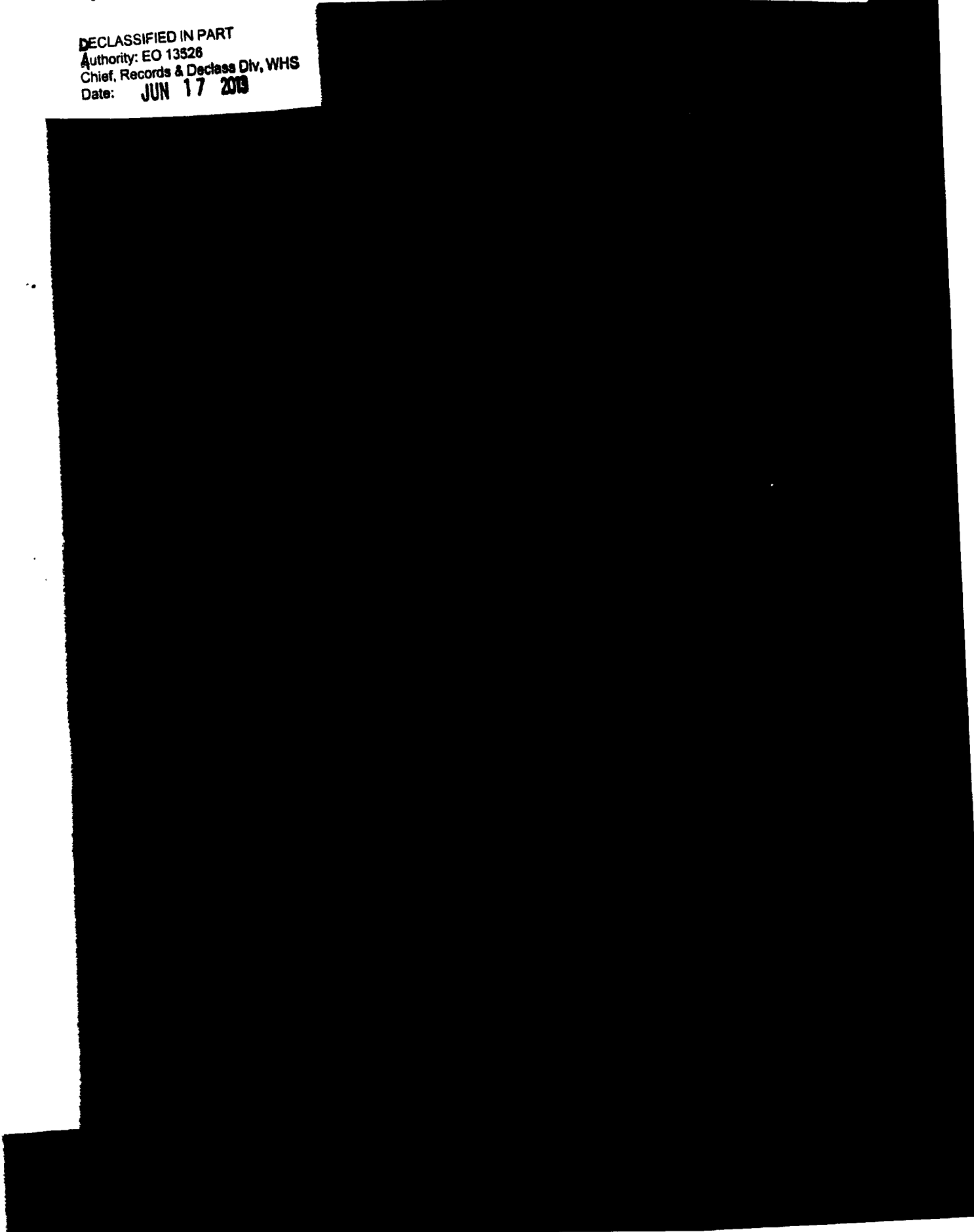

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DEPUTY SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

SUBJECT: REDEYE for Pakistan (U) - INFORMATION MEMORANDUM

➡ Army was requested to comment on the feasibility of providing 400 REDEYE Missiles vice 100 to Pakistan. The REDEYE Missile has been suspended except for combat use since October 1978 with a Rocket Motor ignition problem. Even though there is an ongoing retrofit program, only those missiles earmarked for Annual Service Practice are being retrofitted at this time.

➡ The withdrawal of 400 REDEYE Missiles from Army is the equivalent of equipping six infantry battalions. Army asset posture will not improve significantly until FY 1986 upon adequate STINGER fielding. Withdrawal of 400 missiles from Army assets would have a significant adverse effect on Army combat readiness.

➡ If the Army were directed to sell the 400 missiles to Pakistan, the price of the missile would remain the same, \$15,000. There would be a modest reduction in proportionate total package cost, as support equipment and training requirements would not increase fourfold.

ORIGIN: On November 10, DepSecDef Carlucci advised the Director of Central Intelligence that we would have to determine with the Army if a larger quantity of Redeye missiles could be provided to Pakistan without a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness. We now have the Army position and are completing our response to the CIA.

PURPOSE: To advise DepSecDef Carlucci that in our view the provision of 300 additional Redeye missiles from Army assets would have a significant adverse impact on U.S. force readiness and provide a letter to the Director of Central Intelligence on this issue.

ACTION RECOMMENDED: Forward attached Memo to DepSecDef.
