Overview: Defining Success in the Conflict

Goal: Preserve the way of life of free and open societies, while denying extremists – including terrorist networks – what they need to operate and survive:

- To not be terrorized.
- No alternative to strategy of defeat, anticipate, prevent, offense and initiative.
- Terrorism attacks the trust and openness on which civilized societies freedom and prosperity are based.
- The conflict affects commerce, travel, study throughout the civilized world.
 - No country can opt out through appeasement or otherwise.

Overview: Defining the Enemy

- The enemy is a network of networks:
 - (1) Designated terrorist organizations.



OSD 1.4(d)

- One of the extremists' key instruments is terrorism assassinations and murder of ordinary people.
- (2) Their state and non-state supporters.

Activities of the terrorist groups in the enemy networks can function as mutually reinforcing insurgencies.




Defining the Enemy (cont'd)

- Extremists vs. moderates Islam's civil war.
 - "Moderate" does not mean unobservant, secular or Westernizing.
 - The U.S. is allying itself with the large number of moderate Muslims who reject rule by the extremists.

U.S. strategy is to help create and lead a broad international effort to deny terrorist networks what they require to operate and survive.

U.S. strategy for the Conflict has three elements:

- 1. Protect the American homeland.
- 2. Disrupt and attack terrorist networks.
- 3. Counter ideological support for terrorism.

Key to success: Support moderate Muslims in their civil war against the extremists.

2nd Element of Strategy: Disrupt and Attack Key Assumptions

- Defeating terrorism will require decades of effort.
- Success requires all elements of U.S. national power.
- Success requires cooperation from other countries.
- The enemies do not respect national boundaries.

3rd Element of Strategy: Countering Ideological Support Key Assumptions

- An Essential Metric: Are extremist movements making new terrorists faster than the U.S.-led coalition can capture or kill them?
- Ideological support is:
 - Foundation for terrorist success.
 - Key to recruitment and indoctrination.
- Coalition victory requires stemming flow of recruits into enemy ranks.
- Entire civilized world has crucial stake in success of Muslim moderates over extremists.

3rd Element of Strategy: Countering Ideological Support Winning the Ideological Struggle

- · Often said that "one can't defeat an idea."
- Historical examples belie this:
 - 19th Century British de-legitimated slave trade.
 - WW2 Allied victory over Nazism and fascism.
 - Cold War Soviet Union's collapse undercut Communist appeal.

3rd Element of Strategy: Countering Ideological Support Main Tasks

- · Negative: De-legitimate terrorism.
 - Make like slave trade, piracy and genocide.
 - Focus on clerics, educators and media.
- Positive: Support models of moderation and sound economics in world of Islam.
 - Compete with extremists' visions and their "charitable" works.
 - Progress in Afghanistan and Iraq.
 - Bolster states like Turkey and Indonesia.
 - Fund non-extremist schools e.g., in Pakistan.
 - Greater Middle East Initiative.

3rd Element of Strategy: Countering Ideological Support New Strategy

- Focus on key voices in Muslim world, not just messages U.S. sends to Muslim world (i.e., not just U.S. public diplomacy – a separate strategy).
- Amplify moderate voices:
 - This is crucial and tough to do.
- Impede and impose costs on extremists.
 - Counter extremist media, clerics and schools.
 - Eliminate state and private support for extremism.

Will be a decades-long struggle.

3rd Element of Strategy: Countering Ideological Support New Strategy -- Gov't and Private Sector

- Most important voices for moderation not Western, but Muslim.
- Governments can help amplify voices for moderation, but private sector NGOs, media, universities can be more effective.
 - Support for moderate Muslim schools.
 - Support for humanitarian aid to compete with terrorist "good works."
- How can USG and Coalition encourage and enable private sector to play this role?
- · Does USG need new institutions? New authorities?
 - Encourage study by Americans (e.g., languages) relevant to long-term conflict.
- · Develop plan?
 - Task force to implement?
 - Metrics?


