

I have received your letter concerning our support of your F-16 fighter aircraft program. I want to assure you of my support for this program and consider it one of our nation's most important security assistance programs.

The Air Force has informed me that all of the requirements for the F-16 Aerospace Ground Equipment (AGE) spares have been determined and that the parts have been ordered. The first shipment of spares was made in September 1982, and the Egyptian Air Force should now be receiving these items. The Air Force is now researching, through your freight forwarder, the exact status and location of all Egyptian AGE spares. Our delegation will be prepared to address these matters in detail with your staff during the Military Coordinating Committee (MCC) meeting later this month.

SUBJECT: Egyptian Minister of Defense Abu Ghazala's
Dissatisfaction with U.S. Support of the F-16 Aircraft
Program (U) -- ACTION MEMORANDUM

Minister of Defense Abu Ghazala has sent a letter complaining that the Egyptian Air Force (EAF) has not received any spare parts for the F-16 aircraft ground support equipment nor has the USAF established a delivery date for the spare parts (Tab C.) At Tab D is a short summary of the problem and corrective actions already taken by the USAF.

The USAF's corrective actions had started prior to the MOD's letter, and the EAF was aware of this. The U.S. Military Coordinating Committee team will be prepared to discuss this issue and others along with items we feel the Egyptians must correct to ensure the success of the F-16 program.

At Tab A is a proposed letter to MOD Abu Ghazala and at Tab B a cable transmitting the letter to our OMC.

LETTER FROM MINISTER OF DEFENSE AND MILITARY PRODUCTION, FIELD MARSHAL MONAMED ABOUT HALIN ABOUT GHAZALA IS HEREIN QUOTED FOR YOUR REVIEW.

QUOTE

DEAR MR. CASPER WEINBERGER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

#### I WOULD LIKE TO INFORM YOU ABOUT THE FOLLOWING:

- IN SEPTEMBER 1980. THE USAF AGREED TO PROVIDE AEROSPACE GROUND EQUIPMENT (AGE) IN SUPPORT OF THE PEACE VECTOR I (40 F-16 A/B AIRCRAFT) PROGRAM. CONTRACT(S)
  FOR AGE SPARES MERE DELAYED BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE
  DID NOT PREPARE AND FORWARD THE LISTS OF THE PARTS TO EAF FOR APPROVAL IN A TIMELY MANNER. LISTS OF THESE PARTS SHOULD HAVE BEEN FORWARDED EARLY IN THE PROGRAM PER PRE-VIOUS AGREEMENTS AND LETTER OF OFFER AND ACCEPTANCE REGULATIONS. THE EAF STILL HAS NOT RECEIVED ANY SPARE PARTS FOR THE AGE, AND THE USAF HAS NOT ESTABLISHED A DELIVERY DATE FOR THE SPARES.
- 2. WORK ON AGE HAS STOPPED BECAUSE THERE ARE NO SPARE PARTS AVAILABLE. REQUIRED AGE PERIODIC INSPECTIONS ARE OVERDUE SINCE AUGUST 1982. ALL WORK IS COMPLETED UNDER THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EGF AND A LACK OF SPARES SUPPORT CREATES DAMGER TO THE EQUIPMENT AND THE SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT ON THE FLIGHTLINE AND IN MAINTENANCE.
- THE LACK OF SPARE PARTS WILL CAUSE GROUNDING OF THE F-16 FLEET IN JANUARY 1983. THIS IS BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE REFUSED TO GIVE ANY OFFICIAL GUARANTEE FOR THE OPERATION AND SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT IN EGYPT AFTER EAF AGREED TO EXTEND PERIODIC INSPECTIONS BEYOND TECHNICAL ORDER SPECIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS.

FROM THE ABOVE, I HOPE THAT YOU SHARE WITH ME THE OPINION THAT THIS SITUATION IS VERY CRITICAL AND MEEDS YOUR COOPERATION AND PROMPT INTERVENTION. REQUEST YOUR ASSISTANCE TO MAKE THE AMERICAN SIDE TRANSFER THE REQUIRED SPARE PARTS FOR EQUIPMENT SHOWN ON ATTACHMENT 1, EVEN IF SUPPORT MUST COME FROM USAF STOCKS. SPARES CAN BE BROUGHT TO EGYPT BY A EAF C-130 OR BY C-141 AIRCRAFT FROM THE USAF.

PLEASE RECEIVE MY DEEP COMPLIMENTS AND THANK YOU FOR YOUR USUAL COOPERATION.

OMC COMMENTS: EAF IS GENUINELY CONCERNED ABOUT THE LACK OF SPARE PARTS AND CONSUMABLES FOR REPAIR/INSPECTIONS OF CRITICAL FLIGHTLINE AGE FOR PEACE VECTOR I. F-16. THIS AREA OF SUPPORT WAS MADE AN ACTION ITEM IN 1980 DURING INITIAL DEFINITIZATION. EACH ITEM OF AGE THAT REQUIRED SPARES WAS IDENTIFIED AND THE APPLICABLE AIR LOGISTICS CENTER (ALC) WAS TASKED TO PRODUCE A SPARES LISTING FOR EAF DEFINITIZATION. THE LISTINGS COULD NOT LISTING FOR EAF DEFINITIZATION. THE LISTINGS COULD MOT, HOMEVER, BE PRODUCED UNTIL THE MAMUFACTURER OF EACH ITEM WAS IDENTIFIED. IN MID-1982, THE FIRST LISTINGS WERE PRODUCED. AT THIS TIME, SPARES FOR ALL BUT 12 OF THE 78 ITEMS IDENTIFIED HAVE BEEN DEFINITIZED. THE LACK OF THE CONSUMABLES, I.E., FILTERS, HARDWARE, ETC., HAS FORCED THE EAF TO USE THE AGE PAST THE SCHEDULED INSPECTION BATE. WHILE USAGE PAST. THE SCHEDULED DATE WILL NOT HURT THE ATERTACT. IT MIGHT CAUSE PREMATURE FATHURE OF THE ACE AIRCRAFT, IT MIGHT CAUSE PREMATURE FAILURE OF THE AGE. THE EAF IS OVERLY CONCERNED THAT THE AGE WILL FAIL AND THUS CAUSE FLYING TO STOP. DUE TO THE LATE IDENTIFICATION OF MANUFACTURERS AND PREPARATION OF LISTS, SPARES WERE NOT ORDERED UNTIL THE ZNO HALF OF CY 82. CURRENT STATUS REFLECTS 2,800 ITEMS ORDERED THRU 15 OCT 82 (ALL PRI 06) WITH 80 PERCENT SHIPPED. FREIGHT FORWARDER CONFIRMS THAT 1551 OF THEM HAVE BEEN SHIPPED TO EGYPT. SINCE OCT 82. ANOTHER 1,400 PLUS HAVE BEEN ORDERED. IN ADDITION, GENERAL DYMANICS HAS BEEN TASKED TO EXPEDITIOUSLY PROVIDE HISSING ITEMS NECESSARY TO PERFORM THE SCHEDULED INSPECTIONS. - 1. IN SEPTEMBER 1980, THE USAF AGREED TO PROVIDE AEROSPACE GROUND EQUIPMENT (AGE) IN SUPPORT OF THE PEACE VECTOR I (40 F-16 A/B AIRCRAFT) PROGRAM. CONTRACT(S) FOR AGE SPARES WERE DELAYED BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE DID NOT PREPARE AND FORWARD THE LISTS OF THE PARTS TO EAF FOR APPROVAL IN A TIMELY MANNER. LISTS OF THESE PARTS SHOULD HAVE BEEN FORWARDED EARLY IN THE PROGRAM PER PRE-VIOUS AGREEMENTS AND LETTER OF OFFER AND ACCEPTANCE REGULATIONS. THE EAF STILL HAS NOT RECEIVED ANY SPARE PARTS FOR THE AGE, AND THE USAF HAS NOT ESTABLISHED A DELIVERY DATE FOR THE SPARES.
- WORK ON AGE HAS STOPPED BECAUSE THERE ARE NO SPARE PARTS AVAILABLE. REQUIRED AGE PERIODIC INSPECTIONS ARE OVERDUE SINCE AUGUST 1982. ALL WORK IS COMPLETED UNDER THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EAF AND A LACK OF SPARES SUPPORT CREATES DANGER TO THE EQUIPMENT AND THE SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT ON THE FLIGHTLINE AND IN MAINTENANCE.
- 3. THE LACK OF SPARE PARTS WILL CAUSE GROUNDING OF THE F-16 FLEET IN JAMUARY 1983. THIS IS BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE REFUSED TO GIVE ANY OFFICIAL GUARANTEE FOR THE OPERATION AND SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT IN EGYPT AFTER EAF AGREED TO EXTEND PERIODIC INSPECTIONS BEYOND TECHNICAL ORDER SPECIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS.

FROM THE ABOVE, I HOPE THAT YOU SHARE WITH HE THE OPINION THAT THIS SITUATION IS VERY CRITICAL AND NEEDS YOUR COOPERATION AND PROMPT INTERVENTION. REQUEST YOUR ASSISTANCE TO MAKE THE AMERICAN SIDE TRANSFER THE REQUIRED SPARE PARTS FOR EQUIPMENT SHOWN ON ATTACHMENT 1, EVEN IF SUPPORT MUST COME FROM USAF STOCKS. SPARES CAN BE BROUGHT TO EGYPT BY A EAF C-130 OR BY C-141 AIRCRAFT FROM THE USAF.



1. LETTER FROM MINISTER OF DEFENSE AND MILITARY PRODUCTION, FIELD MARSHAL MOHAMED ABDEL HALIM ABOU GHAZALA IS HEREIN QUOTED FOR YOUR REVIEW.

DEAR MR. CASPER WEINBERGER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

I WOULD LIKE TO INFORM YOU ABOUT THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. IN SEPTEMBER 1980, THE USAF AGREED TO PROVIDE AEROSPACE GROUND EQUIPMENT (AGE) IN SUPPORT OF THE PEACE VECTOR I (40 F-18 A/B AIRCRAFT) PROGRAM. CONTRACT(S) FOR AGE SPARES WERE DELAYED BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE DID NOT PREPARE AND FORWARD THE LISTS OF THE PARTS TO EAF FOR APPROVAL IN A TIMELY MANNER. LISTS OF THESE PARTS SHOULD HAVE BEEN FORWARDED EARLY IN THE PROGRAM PER PREVIOUS AGREEMENTS AND LETTER OF OFFER AND ACCEPTANCE REGULATIONS. THE EAF STILL HAS NOT RECEIVED ANY SPARE PARTS FOR THE AGE, AND THE USAF HAS NOT ESTABLISHED A DELIVERY DATE FOR THE SPARES.
- 2. WORK ON AGE HAS STOPPED BECAUSE THERE ARE NO SPARE PARTS AVAILABLE. REQUIRED AGE PERIODIC INSPECTIONS ARE OVERDUE SINCE AUGUST 1982. ALL WORK IS COMPLETED UNDER THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EAF AND A LACK OF SPARES SUPPORT CREATES DANGER TO THE EQUIPMENT AND THE SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT ON THE FLIGHTLINE AND IN MAINTENANCE.
- 3. THE LACK OF SPARE PARTS WILL CAUSE GROUNDING OF THE F-16 FLEET IN JANUARY 1983. THIS IS BECAUSE THE AMERICAN SIDE REFUSED TO GIVE AMY OFFICIAL GUARANTEE FOR THE OPERATION AND SAFETY OF THE AIRCRAFT IN EGYPT AFTER EAF AGREED TO EXTEND PERIODIC INSPECTIONS BEYOND TECHNICAL ORDER SPECIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS.

FROM THE ABOVE, I HOPE THAT YOU SHARE WITH ME THE OPINION THAT THIS SITUATION IS VERY CRITICAL AND NEEDS YOUR COOPERATION AND PROMPT INTERVENTION. REQUEST YOUR ASSISTANCE TO MAKE THE AMERICAN SIDE TRANSFER THE REQUIRED SPARE PARTS FOR EQUIPMENT SHOWN ON ATTACHMENT 1, EVEN IF SUPPORT MUST COME FROM USAF STOCKS. SPARES CAN BE BROUGHT TO EGYPT BY A EAF C-130 OR BY C-141 AIRCRAFT FROM THE USAF.

PLEASE RECEIVE MY DEEP COMPLIMENTS AND THANK YOU FOR YOUR USUAL COOPERATION.

THIS AREA OF SUPPORT WAS MADE AN ACTION ITEM IN 1980 DURING INITIAL DEFINITIZATION. EACH ITEM OF AGE THAT REQUIRED SPARES WAS IDENTIFIED AND THE APPLICABLE AIR LOGISTICS CENTER (ALC) WAS TASKED TO PRODUCE A SPARES LISTING FOR EAF DEFINITIZATION.
