- On August 23, you asked why the State Department requested only \$400 million in Foreign Military Financing (FMF) funds for the Afghan National Army (ANA) in Fiscal Year (FY) 2005.
- The Department of Defense (DoD) requested that the State Department program \$668 million for the ANA in FY 2005, to include \$644 million in FMF, and \$24 million in Peacekeeping Operations funds.
- The relevant State Department offices supported these funding levels through the State Department budget process.
- During budget negotiations, the following funding allocations for the ANA were assigned in order to take pressure off of the FMF top line:
 - \$400 million in FMF.
