Summary of Conclusions

1. U.S. Strategy to Cuba. The SCC explored different strategies for the U.S. to pursue vis-a-vis Cuba, but did not reach any conclusions. The SCC agreed to discuss these issues in greater depth in the future, perhaps reconvened as a PRC. (S)
2. Prisoner Parole. Justice and INS informed the group that they would try to expedite procedures so that they can parole Cuban political prisoners at the rate of 500 per month. Justice indicated it would forward a paper with specific recommendations on how to expedite the parole procedures to the National Security Council soon. (S)
3. Non-Aligned Movement. The SCC agreed that the USG should continue its strategy of encouraging the moderates to take part and weigh in at the Non-Aligned Summit. (S)
4. Intelligence-Sharing. The SCC agreed that we should share intelligence on Cuba's military build-up and what it is doing internationally with other friendly countries, particularly those in the region. We should convey this information on a regular and systematic basis through diplomatic and intelligence channels. (S)
5. Intelligence Collection. DCI will prepare a proposal for the NSC on ways to improve the intelligence collection on Cuba. (S)
6. Military Presence. OSD, JCS, State, and NSC will prepare detailed recommendations on ways the U.S. can increase its military presence in the Caribbean in order to serve one or two objectives: to enhance the security and the stability of the nations of the Caribbean and to send a message of caution to Cuba. An SCC on the Caribbean will explore these recommendations. (S)

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
