SUBJECT: Update on China FMS Suspension (U)

programs on June 5, the Chinese have sought face-to-face discussions regarding these programs. On August 9, you approved a working-level team led by Special Assistant for China Mr. Ed Ross from ISA to go to China for discussions with the Chinese. The team will attempt to persuade the Chinese to make a payment by September 1 to prevent these programs from being terminated for lack of funds. The Chinese were informed on August 9 of U.S. intention to send such a team, and accepted immediately our offer to respond to their request for dialogue. Visas were issued by the PRC Embassy for the four team members on August 10. They will arrive in Beijing on August 13. After meeting with Ambassador Lilley on Monday morning, August 14, the team will begin meeting that afternoon with the Chinese.

(S) On August 10, the team's strategy was briefed to State officials from EAP, PM, the legal office, and Under Secretary Kimmit's staff. The strategy is to: (1) Convince the Chinese that the September 1 deadline is a serious one. (2) Impress upon the Chinese that re-starting deliveries to China is not possible at this time because of the President's decision. (3) Provide assurances to the Chinese that we are willing to meet their concerns about participation in the F-8 avionics modernization program by allowing some level of participation by their engineers after we receive China's payment. We believe that the Chinese, although unhappy over the suspension, do not want to see these programs terminated for financial, technical, and political reasons. Therefore, there is hope on our part that this dialogue and the arrangements we are willing to enter into on participation in the F-8 program can induce the Chinese to pay. That would be in our interest, since the U.S. also does not want to see these programs terminated.
