- 3. Pursuant to the Presidential approval, operation HEAD 17 START was commenced with sealed-pit weapons on 3 October 1958. 18 During the period 3 31 October 1958, results were as follows: 19
 - a. Aircraft Scheduled 116 20
 - <u>b</u>. Aircraft Airborne 108
 - <u>c</u>. Missions Completed 106
 - d. Effective Hours Scheduled 1920:20 23
 - e. Effective Hours Realized 1783:09 24
 - f. Effectiveness 92.8%
 - g. Accidents/Incidents None 26
