(U) As we recently discussed, there has been a marked improvement in the coordination and cooperation in the use of the Pien Colombia helicopters. It has consistently been a challenge to strike the right balance between use of the helicopters to support both aerial emdication operations and Colombian military counterterrorist operations. In the past, this caused significant tension between the Embessy and the Colombian military, and it required an inordinate amount of my time to resolve differences. However, the procedures recently established by Ambassador Wood and the Colombian military have both relieved tensions and have optimized the use of the helicopters.
