SUBJECT: Suggestions on Venezuela/Charges of Corruption

- (C) You asked about ways to expose Venezuelan corruption and Cuban black marketing.
- (S) We agree that corruption is Chavez's Achilles Heel. Specifically, there is substantial evidence of corruption by Vice President Rangel, Chavez's closest confidant and the most feared member of his inner circle.
- (C) The Cubans have long employed black marketing as a way to purchase scarce goods and to supplement their meager income. Recently, Castro has cracked down by replacing gas attendants, retail store and bank clerks with loyal Communist Youth Party members.
- (S) State created a Public Diplomacy (PD) Task Force (Tab A) to implement the Western Hemisphere Public Outreach strategy approved at the February 7, 2006 Venezuela PC.
 - o (S) This group will create and implement PD activities designed to seize the information initiative, and exploit such issues as the ones MoD Ospina mentioned.
 - o (C) We will explore using Peruvian, Brazilian, and other regional media to deliver the message.
- (S) The Interagency Venezuela Illicit Finance Group has targeted eleven Venezuelans for possible illegal activity associated with corruption. Currently there are no pending criminal charges or requests for extradition.
 - o (S) The group will continue to collect information and consider next step options that may lead to criminal charges against corrupt Venezuelans.
 - o (S) We will ask the PD Task Force to coordinate with the Illicit Finance Group to find ways to expose corruption without hindering ongoing investigations.

(U) We will keep you informed on these initiatives.

- 1. Corruption against the Venezuelan government
- The fact that there are a great many people in Cuba who operate in the black market.

There must be some way to use those in a way that helps the people of Venezuela understand what is really happening.

You also ought to look into the point he made about getting extradition requests from the US to deal with Venezuelan military people and others who have disobeyed the law. He said to check with the Justice Department to find out what they have pending, because it makes the people fearful and behave better. He thinks using the international legal system is the best way to go at Venezuela.

Summary of Conclusions

It was agreed that:

- Our strategy and policy implementation, including our public diplomacy messages, should focus on linking democracy and development, developing strategic partners, keeping a focus on achieving success in Colombia, and keeping the momentum on the trade agenda, including bringing CAFTA into effect and pursuing a larger regional integration initiative.
- The Action Plans submitted to the PC are approved, namely:
 - The Western Hemisphere Democracy and Economic Development Action Plan;
 - The Multilateral Strategy for the Western Hemisphere;
 - · The Western Hemisphere Near-Term Energy Action Plan;
 - . The Public Outreach Strategy for the Western Hemisphere; and
 - Strategic Partnerships: Guidance on Objectives, Principles, and Next Steps. (C)
- The Western Hemisphere and Transnational Economic Policy PCCs, in implementing these action plans are to:
 - Ensure that exchange programs and military-to-military programs are appropriately addressed in the relevant action plan implementation;
 - Develop indicators for measuring progress in achieving our policy objectives;
 - Take the steps necessary to more effectively convay our public diplomacy messages throughout the hemisphere, including through the formation of an interagency task force specifically tasked with developing messages, information, and materials and the means for transmission to relevant recipients throughout the hemisphere; and
 - Develop a re-articulation of our hemispheric policy using the NSC-drafted "Opportunity Partnership of the Americas" as the framework for a bold and aggressive effort to convey the larger message, in terms understandable to the average person, that it is democracy and free markets that best address their concerns of jobs/economic opportunity, security, and good government. The task force will review and implement the Venezuela Strajegic Communication the Action Plan. It will also develop and implement longer-term initiatives that above the commitment of the U.S. to transform the hemisphere into a region where the benefits of democracy, free markets and economic prosperity are accessible to all levels of society. The task force will report its activities and accomplishments on a regular basis to the interagency, and will devise methods of meanning its effectiveness.

Composition of the Iask Porce:

The task force will initially consist of representatives of State, NSC, USAID, DOD (including OSD and JS), the Departments of Energy, Commerce, Homeland Security and Treasury, IBB (VOA), the, and CIA.
