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

NODIS**Summary of Conclusions

It was agreed that:

- A State-led inter-agency team will visit Colombia as soon as possible to work with the incoming Uribe government on the essential elements and priorities of a national security strategy. In preparation for this visit, State will:
 - Draw up a list of team members, which should include representatives from State, DOD, ONDCP, (b)(1), and NSC;
 - Circulate Embassy Bogotá's cable on the incoming Uribe government's initial draft of the national security strategy to the inter-agency team; and
 - Draft a guidance paper that provides the parameters of the visit and makes clear that the Uribe government's plan is one to which the Colombians are committed and which we can support. The guidance paper should outline the team's strategy for ensuring that the Colombian national security strategy incorporates key U.S. objectives and should indicate what those objectives are. (Action: State) (e)
- The training of Colombian troops by individual NATO countries is worth exploring. Training should be conducted on a bilateral basis, not as a NATO activity. (Action: State) (e)
- (b)(1), 1.4(d)
- The Administration should not alter PDD-73 until Congress acts on the Administration's request for new legislative authorities. State will call a sub-PCC on Colombia to prepare a new NSPD to be reviewed by Deputies within 2 weeks. DOD will circulate to the sub-PCC its draft NSPD for consideration. If it appears that the new NSPD will not be signed within several weeks of its being drafted, the sub-PCC will recommend to Deputies either to rescind or amend PDD-73 as an interim fix. (Action: State, DOD, NSC) (e)
