SUBJECT: Major Non-NATO Ally Status for Chile (6)

- (U) I read with great interest the reports on your successful trip to Latin America. We should follow up quickly.
- (C) The "Strategic Partnerships" paper that we endorsed at the last Western Hemisphere Principals Committee recommended that we designate El Salvador, Chile, and Colombia as Major Non-NATO Allies.
- (C) Let's make this happen. With Chile I think we gain the most benefit by moving sooner rather than later. If we move out smartly with Chile's designation (perhaps simultaneously with El Salvador) it will be seen as part a broader strategy to reward and strengthen friends in Latin America. On the other hand, if we delay until the Chileans ratify the Rome Statute (as they will), the designation could be portrayed simply as a loophole to get out of the Article 98 impasse with Chile. That hurts our Article 98 strategy more.

(C) I understand that President Bachelet has been invited to visit the President here in early June. It would be helpful to have worked this out before then.
