The Department of State (DOS) has verified that Burundi is eligible to receive the type of assistance authorized by this legislation and supports the use of section 1203 authority for this purpose. This program is part of a regional AMISOM support concept, consistent with the intent of section 1203. It will build the capacity of Burundi's national military forces to provide engineering, logistics, and counter-IED support for the Burundian troops participating in AMISOM. Enhancing the capacity of Burundi's national military forces to conduct CT operations supports U.S. national security objectives both globally and within the U.S. Africa Command (USAFRICOM) area of responsibility.

This program will contain the required elements to promote the observance of and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms, and respect for legitimate civilian authority. Units selected to receive this assistance will undergo "Leahy" human rights vetting before such assistance is provided.
