

Yemen:
Tactical Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Capability

The Department of Defense (DoD) plans to undertake activities to build the capacity of Yemen's national military forces and maritime security forces to conduct counterterrorism (CT) operations, pursuant to Section 1206 of the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2006 (P.L. 109-163), as amended. The Department of State (DOS) has verified that Yemen is eligible to receive the type of assistance authorized by this legislation and supports the use of Section 1206 authority for this purpose. This Section 1206 program will build the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations by providing a tactical level intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR) capability to identify and track terrorist movements within their territory and across their borders. Enhancing the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations supports U.S. national security objectives to disrupt and degrade al-Qa'ida in the Arabian Peninsula within U.S. Central Command's area of responsibility.

These programs will contain the required elements to promote the observance of and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms and respect for legitimate civilian authority. Units selected to receive this assistance will undergo "Leahy" human rights vetting before such assistance is provided. This \$17,500,000 program was coordinated through a joint DoD-DOS review and approved by the Secretary of Defense, with the concurrence of the Deputy Secretary of State. There will be no adverse effect on U.S. personnel or operations.

ISR Aircraft with Precision Strike Capability

The Department of Defense (DoD) plans to undertake activities to build the capacity of Yemen's national military forces and maritime security forces to conduct counterterrorism (CT) operation, pursuant to Section 1206 of the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2006 (P.L. 109-163), as amended. The Department of State (DOS) has verified that Yemen is eligible to receive the type of assistance authorized by this legislation and supports the use of Section 1206 authority for this purpose. This Section 1206 program will build the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations by providing an aerial intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR) aircraft with a precision strike capability to monitor terrorists' movements and support operations against al-Qa'ida in the Arabian Peninsula. Enhancing the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations supports U.S. national security objectives both globally and within U.S. Central Command's area of responsibility.

These programs will contain the required elements to promote the observance of and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms and respect for legitimate civilian authority. Units selected to receive this assistance will undergo "Leahy" human rights vetting before such assistance is provided. This \$46,500,000 program was coordinated through a joint DoD-DOS review and approved by the Secretary of Defense, with the concurrence of the Deputy Secretary of State. There will be no adverse effect on U.S. personnel or operations.

Yemen:

Light Observation Aircraft Initial Operating Capability (IOC) Support for FY 2013 Border Security Program

DoD plans to undertake activities to build the capacity of Yemen's national military forces and maritime security forces to conduct counterterrorism (CT) operations, pursuant to section 1206 of the NDAA for FY 2006 (P.L. 109-163), as amended. DOS has verified that Yemen is eligible to receive the type of assistance authorized by this legislation and supports the use of section 1206 authority for this purpose. This section 1206 program will provide a critical aircraft spare parts package to the Yemen Air Force, which will enable Yemen to implement fully the FY 2013 section 1206 Border Security program, which is building the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations by providing equipment in support of real-time air, ground, and naval operations along Yemen's borders. Enhancing the capacity of Yemen's national military forces to conduct CT operations supports U.S. national security objectives both globally and within the USCENTCOM area of responsibility.

This program will contain the required elements to promote the observance of and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms, and respect for legitimate civilian authority. Units selected to receive this assistance will undergo "Leahy" human rights vetting before such assistance is provided. This \$5,420,000² program was coordinated through a joint DoD-DOS review and approved by the Secretary of Defense, with the concurrence of the Deputy Secretary of State. There will be no adverse effect on U.S. personnel or operations.

² **Note:** The cost of this program will be funded using funds previously notified for other FY 2014 section 1206 programs, that have become excess in the course of executing the programs. The funds will come from the Tranche 1 Yemen "CT Targeting" program (\$200,000), the Tranche 2 Bulgaria "Tactical Vehicle & UAS" (\$2,500,000), and the Tranche 2 Poland "SOF C-IED Survivability Enhancement" (\$2,720,000).
