I introduced myself as the duly appointed investigating officer charged with looking into the administration and operation of the Operational Emergency Medicine course. I informed the that I had interviewed a number of individuals testified that you may have information regarding the OEMS course conducted in early July 2012 In the United Kingdom.

 - Q. Do you recall the Orders process?
 - A. I believe the TDY, Flights; meals were set up by Dr Hagmann
 - Q. Did you get e-mails from Dr Hagmann? Was your itinerary sent to you by him?
 - A. I know I went into DTS but I don't recall how I got the itinerary or tickets.
 - Q. Was alcohol consumed during the course?
 - A. Yes.
 - O. When was it consumed?
 - A. We stayed at a Hotel in England and there was a restaurant and bar in the Hotel and we had drinks there, not during the day, after the course.
 - Q. Was alcohol consumed during the "Cognition lab"?
 - A. Yes, but only in the evening after dinner, usually while listening to a lecture.
 - Q. There was a Foley procedure done during that time could you tell me about it?
 - A. We had been taught earlier in the week how to do the Foley and a Non USU student. (b) performed the procedure on me and then he was going to be the

one who was injected with ketamine. Dr Hagmann told us that he was briefed about the Ketamine and that he would get a procedure. He received the ketamine and some versed and then I was told to do the Foley on him.

- Q. Where any other drugs given to him?
- A. Only versed and ketamine
- Q. Was informed consent used?
- A. I was not present for it, but Hagmann said he had consented to the procedure.
- Q. Did you talk to (b) the following morning?
- A. Yes, because I wanted to know how he felt about everything. For me, it was awkward and uncomfortable. I felt somewhat pressured by Dr Hagmann to do the procedure when he asked me to, but I was not in any way forced to do it either.
- Q. Did you receive Ketamine?
- A. No, when it was done to me I was completely with it. I knew another student had gotten morphine but got sick. The following day I did talk with (b) He didn't really remember what happened to him that night but could guess what it was.
- Q. Was he that obtunded?
- A. He was very subdued, but following commands.
- O. Who performed the injections?
- A. I believe it was Hagmann, I think it was done in front of us.
- Q. Do you know where the ketamine came from?
- A. No
- O. Would anyone else know?
- A. I don't know.
- Q. Do you have anything else to add?
- A. No
