9. I, (b)(6) (b)(7) WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

On the 2nd of October 2013 1300hrs I went to AFRI to provide testimony to COL (b)(6) at his request. He introduced himself as the duly appointed investigation officer conducting an inquiry into the administration and operation of the OEMS course. He showed me his guiding regulations and appointment letter by Dr Rice. He told me that the information provided would be under oath and in a question and answer format. COL (b)(6) stated that he would take notes and transcribe into a sworn statement form and after I had reviewed and edited the content I would be sworn in and sign the document. He stated that he was aware that I had not physically participated in the OEM course but that I had relevant information.

Q. I understand that you organized and led a group of students to Ft Bragg for a summer experience and that emails exist where some students did not receive the per diem which they thought they were entitled to. What can you tell me about funding issues for the summer experience?

A. My understanding is that there is no difference between USU TDY and any other TDY in the ARMY. I've never heard of unit level reductions happening anywhere other than here. You can't just reduce per Diem it is a regulated entitlement.

Q. Are they doing that here?

A. Yes

Q. How are they doing that?

A. Regardless of a briefing or an email, reducing a Service Members Per Diem is an official action that needs to be written down in that manner, on orders, prior to mission start.

Q. Were you traveling on orders?

A. No, but because it was an approved rotation we traveled without them and were told that DTS authorizations would cover us while we were down there. I called (b)(6) who said he had done everything he could to get them to us to have in hand but it didn't happen.

Q. Whose responsibility is the orders?

A. (b)(6) (b)(7) at USU

Q. How does this process unfold?

A. each service has a coordinator and each individual student must arrange for his/her summer experience. As the Army Service Leader, I felt it my responsibility to help as many as I could do this, hence the JSOMTC training at Fort Bragg. (b)(6) then approves it.

Q. Who takes it beyond that?

A. I don't know other than (b)(6) (b)(7)

Q. Did you ever get Orders?

A. No we never received them. There is an authorization form in DTS but in my opinion that doesn't satisfy the need for Orders.

A. Yes LTC (b)(6) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) I received emails from them.

Q- I produced the emails which stated students weren't getting full per diem because of a briefing and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said "yes those are the ones".

Q- You worked for DMI as an instructor when?

A September of 2007 to Nov 2008

Q- During that time had you ever seen ketamine injected?

A. No.

Q Alcohol being used?

A. After duty hours, not as some part of a procedure or cognitive demo. I was a lecturer, FIX coordinator and a LTT instructor. My experience with OEMS was with the formal two week course-proper. I've not worked with or participated in any "off-site" training iterations, and cannot speak to them.

Q- when was the last time you spoke to Dr Haggmann

A. The day the course was cancelled and he hasn't tried to talk to me since

Q Has anyone from DMI contacted you?

A. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) sent a text asking "any idea what is going on". I sent back a text saying I don't know and I can't talk with you. I haven't had any contact either way since.

Q- You sent a letter to the class that was a "testimony" of sorts to take the OEMS course, how did you come to do that?

A. there was a nearly unanimous concern among the school that we wouldn't have enough instructors to help run the summer OEMS here.

Q- Why?

A. Because the majority of the class isn't out front, they are quiet and reserved, concerned with grades.

Q- who asked you to write the letter?

A. no-one it was my initiative, and it worked we got a lot more to sign up. In my experience with previous military medical units that attended OEMS proper, the lessons learned there were profound and made better medical providers. I wanted the same benefit for my classmates.

Q- During the summer courses did anyone talk to you?

A. Amended answer, no. (I mistakenly thought this conversation took place in the spring, but after double-checking the conversation happened earlier, email dated Dec 18 2012 to be precise)

When I volunteered to be an OEMS coordinator, because I already had been one and I didn't need to attend the OEMS course again but then Dr. Haggmann said it wouldn't be a good idea for me to take that opportunity away from someone else. He didn't tell me who was going to be the coordinator but I knew it was going to be (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) told me this) and I believe it was (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) from the 2015 class who recommended (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to Dr. Haggmann, but I have no proof of this.

Q- Do you have anything else you want to add?

A. Only as curious as I am about what is going on I haven't heard anything and this speaks highly of our class.

Sir, regarding the training in Fort Bragg, special thanks to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) for being amazing USUHS instructors and supporting advanced medical training and making our class better. I'm grateful for the opportunity to plan and execute what I believe to be the best training anyone received in the class, two weeks of training with Special Forces medics as Medical Commanders. They helped make that happen. Concerning whatever happened with OEMS, it is my sincerest hope that the situation is resolved effectively and that no one from USUHS faculty, staff, or students suffer ill effects from the investigations.

Hear, hear.

Not to spam anyone but I have a unique perspective here. I was an OEMS instructor, and I can tell you that I have personally seen junior medics outshine senior physicians based on the training they've received there. This is the real deal, folks.

If I may add a couple of points:

- 1) (b)(7) is right about not needing experience. Dr. Hagmann has put everything into this course, and he appreciates that many of you have NO medical training whatsoever. Doc's intent is to create the finest military physicians possible, so he will do his best to create the most solid foundation. There will be no embarrassment, harassment, or discrimination. The environment is professional and conducive to maximal learning. Every minute is used to learn something new. Mistakes are opportunities to learn, nothing more. If you become a sponge, learn all you can, ask questions, and stay highly motivated, you will do just fine.
- 2) You won't find a more motivated mentor. I've had to share a hotel with him a couple of times while on the road training God knows who in God knows where, and he's the guy that stays up way past midnight talking to doctors and medics overseas on a sat-phone in order to get the very latest information on battlefield medicine, so he can incorporate it into the course. He then wakes up at 5am, regardless of what he says about liking sleep, and gives it his all throughout the day. He's a self-proclaimed "Medical Mythbuster", and uses evidence based medicine and field proven techniques in the course. No "that's what we've always done" BS here.
- 3) The skills you will receive being trained as an assistant instructor will *immediately* make you a superior medical provider. OEMS-I is a badge of honor and will serve you well on your CV. I agree with Doc when he says that every single provider needs to have advanced live tissue training, and the ability to teach it. Who wants a military doctor that doesn't understand the unique requirements of military medicine? If your intent is to become as multifaceted as possible, then this instructorship is highly encouraged.
- 4) You will better understand what you're asking your deployed medics and doctors to do after being an OEMS instructor. When you answer the phone from a medic on a mountainside at 2am, you will understand exactly how hard it is for him to assess his patient in the dark, or how hard it is to stop REAL massive hemorrhage in a moving vehicle (no simulators), or how chaotic triage can be during noise, smoke, and confusion. No promises on doing those exact things, but the training is really that good regardless. In my opinion, the best in the military, because there is nothing else like it.

It's hard work, but nothing worthwhile is easy. Don't miss out.

9. I, (b)(6), WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

On or about 0900 hrs., On October 16th 2013 I was contacted by COL (b)(6). He introduced himself as the Investigation officer duly appointed by Dr. Rice to investigate the administration and operation of the Operational Emergency Medicine course. COL (b)(6) stated that he would take notes in a question and answer format and then transcribe these notes into this form for my review and at a later time he would arrange to sign with me as my sworn statement. He stated this investigation was to meet, in general, the requirements of AR 15-6, the Navy JAGMAN, and the AF Command Directed Inquiries.

Q (b)(6) how did you become coordinator of the OEMS course?  
 A. The duty seemed to be passed on from coordinator to coordinator. My predecessor was also my sponsor and his sponsor passed it on to him. I did the job from Oct of 2011 until mid Aug of 2012.

Q. You passed the duty to (b)(6) was there specific criteria used?  
 A. Not really he approached us (myself and Dr. Haggmann) and expressed interest during the course at USU, illustrated a genuine interest and he was mature.

Q. Did you have previous experience with DMI?  
 A. No

Q Did (b)(6) have previous experience with DMI run courses?  
 A. Not that I know of.

Q. How were students picked to attend this course?  
 A. We had an "all come meeting" in which all students interested in the course were invited to hear Dr. Haggmann's presentation. Dr. Haggmann desired a selection process consisting of a basic information sheet and two essay type questions as well as instructing students that were interested to keep in contact with myself and (b)(6). We looked at all the applications and how they might fit into the entire course including those that might make good TA's for the full course. I discussed the applicants with Dr Haggmann over the phone and we began to establish a list of candidates.

Q. Was there anything unusual about the selection process?  
 A. There was nothing I noticed that was unusual about the selection process; Dr. Haggmann desired to have interested individuals for the course. He had a copy of the student bios as well as a copy of the student's information/essays. He desired to have a cohesive team that was genuinely interested. The selected individuals were provided to (b)(6) and he submitted their names to OSA to see if they were in good academic standing, some individuals were removed from the list of selectees based on this. Some students changed their minds over time so adjustments were made to accommodate new personnel. At first we were not sure about which courses would occur, where they would be conducted and what accommodations could be provided (living quarters, and hygiene facilities). Dr. Haggmann was concerned about the altitude course in that the location could not provide separate accommodations and desired that female participants be placed in the UK course. Because of this some personnel were shuffled around and he increased the number of personnel going to the UK.

A. Yes and we worked with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was the primary coordinator and (b)(6) was the authorizing authority. We did DTS as permissive IDY, but 5 individuals for that course were funded by USUHS for travel. The remaining students were funded by Dr. Hagnann.

Q. Are you familiar with the Joint Travel Regulation and the Joint Ethics Regulation?

A. No, not really

Q. Did Hagnann funding this trip strike you as odd? A civilian corporation funding travel for students?

A. No, it was an agreement or understanding with USUHS, I was under the impression that this was permitted because it had happened in the past and he was affiliated with the university previously. Dr. Hagnann stated that this was a gift to the students and was thrilled to provide the opportunity to teach us.

Q. Can you tell me what happened during the procedure on Student (b)(6)

A. I was with Dr Hagnann when we talked to (b)(6) about the procedure, that he would receive ketamine and then he would receive one of three possible minimally invasive procedures (DRE, foley catheter, NG tube). I didn't see a signed consent done.

Q. Why wasn't he told what procedure, exactly, was going to be done to him?

A. This was part of the cognition lab, the purpose was to assess what his recollection be after the procedure was done.

Q. What happened next?

A. He was given the ketamine and we watched him for a while, participating in a Q&A where we asked him questions regarding how he felt and what was going on. After a period of time we asked that he move to the floor for the procedure we had discussed with him before. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) placed a foley catheter into (b)(6)

Q. Was that because he had done one on her earlier?

A. No, it wasn't a quid pro quo thing it was because she hadn't administered one previously and almost everyone else had done one.

Q. Did (b)(6) receive any other drugs?

A. I believe he also had versed because that was part of the cognition lab.

Q. Did he receive fentanyl? A. No

Q. Did you see anyone else receive fentanyl? A. No

Q. Did you participate in a conversation with (b)(6) the following morning about the procedure?

A. I was not aware of a conversation with (b)(6) the following morning, we all met in the commons for breakfast.

Q. Do you know who gave the drugs to (b)(6)? A. Dr Hagnann.

Q. Do you know where the ketamine came from? A. No

Q. Do you know where the versed or morphine came from? A. No

Q. Did you carry any medical equipment with you to the UK?

A. Yes, no medications, or controlled substances. I carried two bags with medical supplies such as syringes, iv setups, portable ABGs.

Q. Did you declare these items? A. Yes

Q. Where did the equipment come from?

A. It came from the "compound" in VA. We had inventoried the equipment based on which course it would be used and packed it prior. My bags never left me after I packed them.

Q. Did any equipment leave USU?

A. Not for the altitude or UK course, some supplies were utilized for the course held at USUHS

Q. When was the last time you spoke to Hagnann?

A. I spoke to Dr. Hagnann before the course began at USUHS to see how everything is going. Also about my wife, she had asked him for a letter of recommendation. She's a USU 4th year applying for Emergency Medicine.

Q. Has Dr Hagnann ever asked you to help or coordinate the movement of equipment?

A. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and myself picked up equipment from Partlow, VA using a U-Haul from the compound in VA for the large course that was going to be held at USUHS. (b)(6) procured animal tissue (pig tracheas) from southern PA for a LTT course held at USU. All expenditures were paid for by Dr. Hagnann.

Q. Are you aware of borrowing government equipment?

A. We utilized some equipment from USUHS to replace supplies of expendable items such as small bore catheters and additional IV supplies.

Q. Where did it come from?

A. (b)(6) had brought us some extra equipment

On or about 1415 hrs. On October 21st 2013 I met with COL Z Page at AFRRI. He introduced himself as the Investigation officer duly appointed by Dr. Rice to investigate the administration and operation of the Operational Emergency Medicine course and Dr John Hagmann. COL (b)(7)(C) stated that he would take notes in a question and answer format and then transcribe these notes into this form for my review and at a later time he would arrange to sign with me as my sworn statement. He stated this investigation was to meet, in general, the requirements of AR15-6, the Navy JAGMAN, and the AF Command Directed Inquiries. I was permitted to review the letter of appointment.

Q When was the last time you spoke with Dr Hagmann or any staff from DMI  
 A. After the course was cancelled, a bag of blood was left behind I contacted Doc and he contacted (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) who met with me to collect the blood. Also a student had left an IPAD at the farm and asked me to inquire about it but they didn't have it. Mark (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) texted me about two months ago to ask how things were. I can give you the text if you want. I also spoke to Doc about 2 months ago; I texted him to let him know that (b)(7)(C) (b)(7)(C) was wearing a ranger tab that he hadn't earned, then called at his request.

A. I don't know if I transported medications. There was a first aid kit already at the huts in CO with DEX, and Diamox.

Q. Did you take the Diamox?

A. Yes, I told Doc that I had had symptoms climbing Mt. Rainier, around 12,500 ft. I began taking it in VA.

Q. Did anyone else begin in VA?

A. No, I think they started in CO a couple of days into it. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) may have also been on it in VA.

Q. Can you tell me about the Orders process?

A. we didn't have orders at all for Italy that I know of; we signed one form for CO to make it legal

Q. Did you get email itinerary for the flights from Hagmann?

A. yes
