General Info	As defined by 10 USC 2350(1), the term "logistic support, supplies, and services" means "food, billeting, transportation (including airlift), petroleum, oils, lubricants, clothing, communications services, medical services, ammunition, base operations support (and construction incident to base operations support), storage services, use of facilities, training services, spare parts and components, repair and maintenance services, calibration services, and port services. Such term includes temporary use of general purpose vehicles and other nonlethal items of military equipment which are not designated as significant military equipment on the United States Munitions List promulgated pursuant to section 38(a)(1) of the Arms Export Control Act." Congress originally expressed interest in the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA) when it passed the "Lord's Resistance Army Disarmament and Northern Uganda Recovery Act of 2009" (PL 111-172). The act required the President to develop and submit a strategy to guide future US support across the region for viable multilateral efforts to mitigate and eliminate the threat to civilians and regional stability posed by the LRA. No US military, civilian, or contractor personnel are to engage in any related combat operations other than in self-defense or in the rescue of a US citizen.
