Dear Mr. Hoover:

This Office has the case of Jeremy Judah Stone, and the associated case of his wife, Betty Jane Stone, for processing under the Industrial Personnel Security Review Program of the Department of Defense.

① Subject resided in the home of his father, Isador Feinstein Stone, both before and subsequent to his marriage, and during a time when the father's activities on behalf of the Communist Party were most pronounced. In an interview on January 27, 1959, Jeremy Stone stated under oath that neither he nor any other member of his family had ever been members or affiliated with any cited organization, and refused, under any circumstances, to discuss his father's political beliefs or activities. In its letter report of August 19, 1957, the Washington, D.C. office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation stated that there was no information to establish that the father, Isador Stone, was, as of 1954, a member of the Communist Party. In view of the passage of five years since the referred-to date of 1954, any further information which may be made available to this Office concerning the present status of Isador Feinstein Stone in regard to membership, convictions or activities in or on behalf of the Communist Party or other subversive organizations, will be most helpful in our determination of the matter.

Your assistance in response to this request is greatly appreciated.
