BOLINGBROOK, Ill. (WLS) --

A lifetime after leaving to defend the United States, Army Private Arthur "Bud" Kelder is home.

"He passed away in a POW camp and we have been trying to bring him home," said Doug Kelder, "Bud" Kelder's nephew.

Thursday's ceremony at O'Hare Airport <<http://abc7.ws/1McCZDC>> was a testament to the courage Kelder displayed after he was taken prisoner in the Battle of Bataan, a fierce fight in the Philippines in which the Japanese captured 75,000 American and Filipino soldiers.

Kelder, who grew up in Chicago's Norwood Park neighborhood, eventually succumbed to disease and starvation in a POW camp. He died on November 19, 1942. His remains, along with 13 others, were buried in an unmarked grave.

Kelder's family had no knowledge of his death and continued to write letters well into 1943. Eventually the burial records were declassified, and it seemed obvious that would be shared with the family. However the U.S. government, for some reason, decided not to acknowledge that information in its own records.

"The last five years spent in a federal lawsuit with the Army and Secretary of Defense and after all this time, we were able to get his body disinterred and bring him back home," Doug Kelder said. "It was just overwhelming."

The head of the organization representing POW families says others can have confidence that the system has improved.

"It's a positive thing but it breaks your heart to think of how many years they had to wait for an answer to that," said Ann Mills-Griffiths, National League of POW-MIA families.

AMG Comment: There was a video clip with this, but it didn't come through in the published copy, and of course I was taped saying a great deal more. The Kelder family DID have to go through what I consider an unwarranted burden imposed by the bureaucracy in getting the grave disinterred and their relative's remains identified. It was another sad, unnecessary and unflattering portrayal of the accounting community, but hopefully, that type of situation is also a thing of the past. At least the report had me saying I was happy for his family, which I certainly am, but nothing was mentioned of the WWII recovery effort being an extension of the Vietnam War accounting, nor that the USG made an extraordinary recovery and repatriation effort post-WWII, but that the science has improved and circumstances are now vastly different. Dear Friends and Classmates of John Brooks Sherman:

Yesterday (Friday, May 22) we confirmed the site of John Brooks Sherman's final resting place. It is in Glen Haven Memorial Park Cemetery in Winter Park, FL. He is buried next to his parents, Allan and Mary Sherman. A photo montage of their markers is attached.

Many people contributed to this discovery:

- Brown University's alumni office that sent out the email to the Class of 1962 five days ago;
- John Sherman's roommate who remembered the younger brother Stephen;
- a classmate who had gone to the same prep school (University School) in Shaker Heights, Ohio (yearbook page attached);
- a Brown University library staffer who initiated a search that revealed the parents' names;
- the alumni office of University School that provided more information from their files that led to a street address in Winter Park, FL., where Captain Sherman's mother relocated from Darien, CT, after the death of her husband in 1963;
- the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency at Hickam AFB, Hawaii, that confirmed the identified remains of

Captain Sherman had been turned over to an Orlando mortuary in 1998

Chronology

May 13: The process began when I got an email from (b)(6) who heads the Vietnam office for the Vietnam Veterans of America Foundation. She had gone to the Vietnam Academy of Diplomacy, a Hanoi university, with Minh Le, who works for Vietnam Television International that was trying to locate Sherman's family for a documentary about the return of war artifacts as a means of reconciliation. Originally Minh thought Sherman was buried at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific at Punchbowl, which is near where I work.

May 14: An employee at Punchbowl confirmed Sherman was not buried there, though Sherman's name was listed on the Marines' Court of the Missing for Vietnam, but he could not find out from the American Battlefields Monuments Commission where Sherman was. His hometown was listed as Darien, CT. I asked E. Gene Maestas, the PAO for Punchbowl, if he had a number for the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency at Hickam AFB about whether they could confirm where Sherman went after his remains were identified in 1998. Because that information is confidential, they provided a 1-800 number for the Marines Casualty Office office, which then provided me with an email address to make the query. I took photographs of Sherman's name on the MIA wall at Punchbowl.

A memorial website -- <http://tinyurl.com/n4eu4kf> -- said

Capt. Sherman is buried at Glen Haven, so I emailed the cemetery. It also said he attended Brown University. Reported everything to (b)(6) and Minh.

Minh sends my email to (b)(6) whose two sons had attended Brown University. One of them (b)(6) had ended up in Hanoi on a (b)(6) (b)(6) and became acquainted with (b)(6) who had received a (b)(6) for the United States. The son stayed

May 15: Left a call for Brown University Alumni Affairs office director. Spoke with (b)(6) at Glen Haven. He said there were several Shermans buried at the cemetery (don't remember exact number), but it had no records with John Sherman's name. He said he would check with the administration. Send email to friend at The New York Times Washington Bureau who had been the Pentagon correspondent for 10 years.

May 16: Thom Shanker from NYT provides phone number for Pentagon Press Operations. No answer. US Special Forces has attacked ISIS in Syria. Suggest to Minh that VTV reach out to Senator John McCain and members of the Hawaii delegation who are veterans.

May 17:

gets email and reaches out to (b)(6) VP for Alumni Relations at Brown.

Contacts classmates from Tuck Business School at Dartmouth who had gone to Brown at the same time as Sherman.

from a alumni office agrees to send an email to Class of 1962 to see if anyone has information as it's office doesn't have anything on Sherman's family or friends who had set up a memorial fund in Sherman's name to purchase books for the library.

May 17 Minh and his crew depart Hanoi on a two-week videotaping trip in the United States

with a Washington/Boston/LA/Honolulu itinerary;
carrying video taping equipment and a small lacquer
box with

Sherman's artifacts

and a letter from the Vietnamese veteran who had
found the crash site in 1966, buried Lt. Sherman,
directed the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency to
the site in 1993 and initiated the return of his watch and
knife in 2014 when Minh Le learned of his story and
began to assist in the search.

May 18: (b)(6) business school classmates
report an address for Sherman at 60 Buttonwood Lane,
Darien CT. Email sent to editor and reporter of Darien
News. Calls the news desk at Orlando Sentinel.
Prepare text for Brown email blast to Class of 62

May 19:

Le Minh, VTV producer

and camera man (b)(6) arrives in
Washington, D.C.

All names are spelled Vietnamese style: last name
first.

Brown reports it's office doesn't have anything on
Sherman's

including Marine headquarters.

May 19: Send email to (b)(6) at University School after Brown classmate (b)(6) reports that he and Sherman had attended University School in Shaker Heights Ohio. Request photographs from yearbook of Sherman.

May 20: Send email to (b)(6) saying I will pay him to photograph all the Sherman graves at Glen Haven or that I would send a reporter from the Orlando Sentinel or a private investigator from Cocoa Beach who was a Special Forces veteran of Vietnam and friend of Sherman's roommate, (b)(6) replies by phone that he will ask management for more assistance.

May 20: photographs of Sherman's high school yearbook received from (b)(6) at University School.

Get information from (b)(6) that Sherman's parents names are Allan and Mary. Forward to (b)(6) at Glen Haven.

Urge Minh to visit Brown University during its alumni weekend May 23-25 as he will be in Boston and the campus may provide footage that may be helpful to his documentary.

May 21: (b)(6) at Glen Haven confirms there is a Mary Sherman in its data base. Confirms that she is buried with an Allan W. Sherman. Sends (b)(6) photograph of grave marker.

Ask Brown alumni office and library and archives to try and accommodate Minh Le's documentary team on Saturday, when he will drive down from Boston.

Difficult, but an alumni veteran's group, led by (b)(6)

(b)(6) @verizon.net>

agrees to help and does so on Saturday, May 23.

May 22: (b)(6) at sends text message with photograph of John Sherman's marker. Found it through Stephen Sherman's records as he had purchased the graves for his parents and "at need arrangements" for brother.

(b)(6) said the marker for John was not noticed next to his parents because "maintenance was cutting the grass and I had to clear the grass off the market to see their names. They had not had a chance to blow off the grass off the markers in that area yet, it was raining also."

May 23: Send email summarizing the search, with photographs of the grave markers, to all those who had assisted in the process or been involved.

May 28: Seek and get permission for VTV crew to shoot at Punchbowl June 2. The site is selected because John Sherman's name is listed on the Marines' Court of the Missing for Vietnam and because there was no family in Florida who could receive the artifacts. A decision had been made by Vietnam Veterans of America that Brown University would receive (after a vote of the VVA national convention in July) that the Sherman artifacts be given to Brown University for its veteran archives. The ceremony in Honolulu would be the formal VVA acceptance of the artifacts by veterans who would then turn them back to the national chapter.

May 29: Learn that Minh Le wants to shoot Arizona Memorial while in Honolulu as it is one of the world's best known monuments to veterans, but the Memorial's landing barge is closed for repairs. Reach out to PAOs for Navy Region Hawaii and USS Missouri Memorial to try and get permission to shoot from Ford Island, which restricts access.

June 2: Permission granted to shoot with Navy escort at Ford Island

June 2: National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific presentation of artifacts and official letters from Vietnamese delegation, represented by Minh Le, and Vietnam Veterans of America, Hawaii Chapter 858, member (b)(6) who served two tours in Vietnam as an Army Nurse. A few significant points: Analysts and specialists, as well as NOK, are people and should not be referred to collective as "that" but as "who" did whatever.

Secondly, and as you know, there ARE civilians missing, and they were serving as surely as our military were, and now are around the world, so please don't neglect them in ANY reference to those missing. The inclusive term of "missing and unaccounted-for US personnel" works as does "missing and unaccounted-for Americans" for this purpose.

Third, Try to avoid using the term "closure" when alluding to the uncertainty and the NOK need for answers to bring an end to uncertainty. Some even mistakenly think that "closure" comes with a Memorial Service, rather than a funeral. Not so! As you know, I arranged one as PNOK for my brother, but not because I knew anything at all. It was because I wanted to reserve a space at Arlington just in case remains were ever recovered and ID'd.

A pretty convincing end to our uncertainty came a couple of years later (or 3) when the canopy frame from the aircraft in

which my brother was the RIO was discovered and returned to the Lab. As soon as I was able to get the photos and have LSEL check the records, I knew my brother undoubtedly was killed, as was his pilot, Jim Bauder, when their F4B crashed into the ocean, September 21, 1966. Although nothing further has been recovered to prove this with certainty, and only one partial ejection seat was discovered, I've decided that there will be only one more underwater effort made to recover remains and, if not successful, I will request no further effort and my brother will remain unaccounted-for administratively, though I will also make perfectly clear that for the Mills family, he has been accounted for as fully as possible and we wish USG assets and resources focused on other cases in which NOK have no information/answers.

It is also my hope that the Navy's CTF technology will be used for that last effort, especially now that SRV Sr. LTG Vice Minister of Defense Vinh has told us they are receptive, and I've learned that it is already in use by DPAA in Europe, plus LTG Tony Crutchfield is favorable, as is ADM Scott Swift, PACFLT Commander. All we need to do now is confirm with the SRV, possibly during the visit by McKeague/Spindler in September or, if later, during the Linnington/Cruthfield visit in November, hopefully before the POTUS visit, also anticipated in November.

Yes, all that is a mouthful and, please, NOT for further distribution. I don't want ANYONE called to task or embarrassed by having been responsible for a poorly crafted letter that was signed by the new Director. I also don't want him signing anything that isn't up to par in terms of grammar, inclusion and/or exclusion. His credibility and that of the new agency are at stake and, as you know, everyone (certainly including me) makes mistakes. My confidential note to you two is strictly intended in the best interest of the mission.

Ann, there is no length of time specified. If someone was captured by the enemy, they were considered a prisoner. That said, the term POW is denoted by the Geneva Conventions so if a person was captured and escaped within a day or so, it could be that he was never officially declared a POW. The military would recognize him as having been "missing/captured.". There is a famous case where a soldier was captured by the enemy after his unit got wiped out. He escaped while being led away and got back to friendly forces after three days. His unit did not believe his story and listed him as a deserter which stuck with him for 30 years until (b)(6) found Vietnamese documents in 2002 confirming his story. (b)(6) did an assessment and sent them to the Army and they corrected his record. But 29 days sounds very suspicious. As we both know, the phonies have a dozen excuses as to why they were not listed as a POW. I have never heard that. (b)(6) might know this claim. Have a great trip and that was a very nice little commemoration for Roger Lester and James. (b)(6) is a good guy.



The substitute is somewhat better, but still in our view deficient and doesn't truly portray the important mission DPAA pursues; however, we are confident that Mr. Linnington's influence on the process will ensure the 2016 poster is appropriate to reflect the mission and efforts to succeed. Thank you for our determination to obtain and distribute this year's posters as you have done for years, and we again apologize for the frustration you have suffered in trying to implement requirements you have voluntarily agreed to perform. I'm confident that (b)(6) will ensure you receive the 30 posters you need. I know there is a mechanism they have put on the DPAA website to order posters, but in reality, I don't know what that might be, so you're better off to get that information, or the posters themselves, from (b)(6) or (b)(6). First, the MD doesn't "make" the ID, but authorizes it during his review and, if satisfied it is persuasive, approval of the work of qualified personnel in the lab and AFDIL. Second, "accounted for" is defined as the man returned alive, or his identifiable remains, NOT when it is convenient or sensitive for the NOK to be briefed and convinced to sign off on the papers they are given to accept, since that is simply acceptance of the disposition responsibility. That is accurate, unless there has been a policy change.

I've argued with (b)(6) on this over and over again. It is misleading to have on DPAA's web site the date the NOK is briefed and signs off as the date the man is "accounted for, just as much so as listing the date DPAA decides to announced the likely long-ago ID just before a funeral to drag out photo-ops for the media.

As a suggestion you could do as the old PMSEA did, list the incident date, repat date, ID date, then announce whenever the funeral is about to be held if that is what Outreach and Communication wants to do, but say so, don't mislead in the DPAA web site.

Also, if DPAA is going to make the lists available by Alpha, by State/Alpha, they need to have the ability for users to also download and print out, if desired, the list by repat date and by ID date on accounted for, and by Alpha, State/Alpha and incident date on unaccounted-for, then also of course as now exists, by Service and by Country, and those also should be by incident date. All that wouldn't be necessary if the user could simply sort by the desired category, but if they fear false manipulation of the data, they those feeding the web site for DPAA need to have these additional categories so that those of us who have to deal with counterpart governments seriously know the true level of counterpart cooperation. Simply put, the policy community needs to have an accurate, simple way to draw conclusions, as do the analysts asked to do assessments on given questions.

Last week's Congressional briefing went real well. The event was held inside a hearing room in the Rayburn congressional office building. (No one sat in the big chairs.) (Photo attached.) The briefing was attended by staff members from congressional offices, past and present members of the administration, veteran's service organizations, and the press (including several members of the South Korean media).

The briefing was expertly moderated by (b)(6) Congressman Rangel (Korean War vet) opened with a moving talk about the impact the Battle of Kunu-ri (November 3--Dec 1st 1950) had on his life.

"Since Kunu-ri, I have never, never had a bad day."

Congressman Nugent (11th District, Florida) followed with his commitment to have declassification legislation part of the next defense spending bill. DPAA Director Linnington, as the guest speaker, presented a comprehensive, straightforward look at the agency's transformation and mission's status. (b)(6) then broke down critical issues from the family's perspective. Yours truly closed the event with the emotional context of the mission. There was mingling afterwards, including a buzz about the room. Those of you who reached out to your Representative, consider yourselves a part of the buzz.

The event was designed to be the beginning in a series of Congressional briefings on the Korean War accounting mission. The next one is planned for the Senate side, early next year. We hope to broaden the scope to include the Cold War mission, and will be asking that you contact your Senate offices for that one.

Three flags stand outside each Congressional member's office. The U.S. flag and the member's state flag are two. The third is the member's choice. The predominate third flag is the POW/MIA flag (note the hallway photo attached). As I have mentioned, much of what has been accomplished in the mission has come through Congress; whether it be legislation, hearings, member letters, or simply having a legislative aide copied on an email to an unresponsive agency. They are our guardians in the search for answers to the missing men. Whenever you can, please let them know how important that relationship is to us.

All that wouldn't be necessary if the user could simply sort by the desired category, but if they fear false manipulation of the data, they those feeding the web site for DPAA need to have these additional categories so that those of us who have to deal with counterpart governments seriously know the true level of counterpart cooperation. Simply put, the policy community needs to have an accurate, simple way to draw conclusions, as do the analysts asked to do assessments on given questions.

On 3 April 1972, Chief Warrant Officer Two Larry A. Zich, Warrant Officer One Douglas L. O'Neill, Specialist Five Allen D. Christensen, and Specialist Four Edward W. Williams, all assigned to HHD, 37th Sig BN, departed Marble Mountain Airfield, DaNang, as the crew aboard a UH-1H helicopter,

on a combat support mission near Quang Tri City. They were reported missing in the vicinity of YD 330 530, the general location of the Quang Tri City Airport. The last reported contact with the aircraft was at 0945 hours, by the Hue/PhuBai ground control approach (GCA) radar. At that time, the pilot reported that he was lost and believed he was in the Quang Tri area. The GCA controller was unable to locate the aircraft on radar, and all communications were subsequently lost at 1010 hours. Normal fuel exhaustion time would have been at 1100. 



PERSONAL MESSAGE: I was very disappointed that President Obama failed to mention our missing men, unreturned veterans all, during his remarks at Arlington National Cemetery on Veterans Day. His otherwise commendable remarks focused on our Nation's duty to our Veterans, in terms of health care, employment opportunity and across the board. This isn't the first time the accounting mission has been omitted, but with recent formation of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA), one would think it logical and timely to include a message, an opportunity to make a supportive statement and pledge renewed commitment.

Some may think I'm too critical, or even too negative, but such is definitely NOT the case. I could not have endured some 40 years of ups and downs to continue pressing for answers if I were anything but an optimist. Admittedly, "tilting at windmills" can be very frustrating and, if not careful, cynicism can grow. I encourage each one of you to be hopeful, as I am, convinced that the new DPAA leadership is comprised of the right people, at the right time, with the intellect, dedication and level of commitment necessary to seriously move the issue forward. And, in particular, new DPAA Director Mike Linnington has publicly assured us that he is all in for the long term, at least ten years, possibly more!

The evolution is complex and it isn't over yet, but things ARE looking up. Merging, changing and improving a bureaucracy as large and diverse as that now comprising DPAA (over 600 personnel, civilian and military) is not a short term, easy proposition. The leadership must take into account all manner of rules, regulations and restrictions, while focused on achieving mission success and the people affected by every action, including the POW/MIA families.

More patience may be required, but as Thanksgiving approaches, we all should take heart, say our prayers and be grateful for many blessings.

The Chair of Honor will remain perpetually empty, symbolizing American prisoners of war and those missing in action who may never return. Mayor Bill West said "The Chair of Honor will be a reminder to all of the sacrifices the men and women serving in the armed forces have made to ensure our continued freedom and way of life."

The first Chair of Honor was installed and dedicated at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Mass., on Veterans Day in 2012. Sponsored by the Rolling Thunder organization and Hussey Seating (which makes the chairs) the program has expanded rapidly, with chairs now dedicated in municipal buildings, state capitals, public facilities, professional and college sports stadiums and even the USS Constitution.

According to the National League of POW/MIA Families, of the more than 92,000 service members who are unaccounted, four are Delawareans from different service eras. For more information, call 302-856-7391.

In Vietnam, a scam has been discovered in which families of soldiers missing in action were duped into believing their loved one has been found, after paying a sizable amount of money.

The Vietnam War occurred in Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia from 1 November 1955 to the fall of Saigon on 30 April 1975. This war followed the First Indochina War (1946–54) and was fought between North Vietnam—supported by communist allies—and the government of South Vietnam—supported by the United States and other anti-communist allies.

The Viet Cong, a South Vietnamese communist common front aided by the North, fought a guerrilla war against anti-communist forces in the region. The People's Army of Vietnam, or North Vietnamese Army (NVA), engaged in a more conventional war, at times committing large units to battle.

A coup in South Vietnam resulted in South Vietnamese leader Diem's death and by August 1964, concerned about instability in the area and under the pretence of a torpedo attack, the US government

began bombing North Vietnamese targets. Full military involvement came in 1965, and by the end of 1967 almost half a million US troops were on the ground in South Vietnam.

Three million people died in the ensuing conflict. One million were Vietnamese soldiers. America's involvement was to cost the lives of 58,000 US troops; the remainder were Vietnamese civilians. As of April 2013, 1649 Americans remained unaccounted for, of which 850 were listed as Killed In Action – Body not recovered and 749 are listed as a presumptive finding of death.

Of the million Vietnamese soldiers killed, over 200,000 bodies remain undiscovered, and a further 300,000 are buried in unmarked graves. The Vietnam Bank for Social Policies established a fund to provide poor families with loans in cases of hardship, and a disturbing case of callous fraud has recently come to light.

Difficult as it is to believe, a Central Vietnam National has been systematically extracting money from the families of Missing in Action (MIA) soldiers, on the pretext of locating the remains of their loved ones. The families obtained money from the bank's fund to pay the sums requested by fifty-six-year-old Nguyen Van Thuy, a man who claimed to have supernatural powers that would enable him to locate the remains of their relatives.

Thuy and his family secretly desecrated the graves of over 70 unknown soldiers and removed the remains, including military helmets and other personal belongings. They dug new graves and placed the items inside, marking them with the names of the people whose families had paid him. Thuy fooled 12 families in all, fraudulently netting a total of \$363,000, the International Business Times < Caution-

One of the defrauded victims spoke of her joy when she saw a helmet with her dead father's name on it, and her shock when she learnt she had been fooled. She paid Thuy 4500 dollars for the 'discovery'.

A total of seven people, including Thuy's wife, were involved in the deception, and all were sentenced to imprisonment in October 2015. The sentences varied from five years to life in prison for what the trial judge called a very serious crime, one that hurt the families of the soldiers killed in action and "the nation as a whole".

The Capitol will soon have a permanent commemoration to prisoners of war and servicemen and women missing in action.

On Wednesday morning, the House Administration Committee approved a resolution that would direct the Architect of the Capitol to obtain and display a chair in the Capitol building that features the National League of POW/MIA Families logo.

“They deserve to be honored, they need to be honored, in the U.S. Capitol,” House Administration Chairwoman Candice S. Miller, R-Mich., said at the markup.

The development marks the end of a more than year-long effort to instill the chair in the Capitol. Rep. Stephen F. Lynch, D-Mass, first introduced the measure in August 2014 after meeting with Joe D’Entremont, president of a Massachusetts Rolling Thunder chapter, which advocates for POW/MIA issues.

On July 30, Lynch wrote a “Dear Colleague” letter urging members to support his bill.

“These brave men and women served our nation with valor and honor,” Lynch wrote. “This commemorative chair will serve as a reminder to our POW/MIA and their families that we will never forget them.”

At the Wednesday hearing, Rep. Zoe Lofgren, D-Calif., also encouraged the committee to honor the only prisoner of war serving in the House, Rep. Sam Johnson, R-Texas, who was held as a prisoner in Hanoi for nearly seven years during the Vietnam War.

Thank you for your inquiry concerning the status of Captain Kenneth D. Thomas, Jr., listed as missing in North Vietnam on May 5, 1966. His remains were unilaterally repatriated by the government of Vietnam on August 14, 1985, and the identification process was finalized on July 7, 1985. His home of record was Mt. Vernon, Illinois.

This statistical data is now available to all by utilizing the web site of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, or DPAA (Caution-<http://www.dpaa.mil/> < Caution-<http://www.dpaa.mil/> >).

Thank you for your commitment to accounting for this American serviceman by wearing a POW/MIA bracelet bearing his name and retaining it all these many years later. From the dates reflected, it appears that the remains of Captain Thomas were among those recovered at the time of loss and retained by the Vietnamese government until serious negotiations for bilateral cooperation ensued in the first Reagan Administration. Directly involved in those negotiations, I can attest to the difficulties then encountered. Due to those decades of experience, I can also attest to the significant expansion of cooperation, both in quality and quantity, that has resulted in accounting for 1,024 US personnel since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975.

We are most grateful for the leadership provided by President Reagan and the continued commitment of assets and resources since that time, thanks in no small measure to the support we receive from the major National Veteran organizations and the American people. As one of these supportive Americans, please accept our sincere appreciation.

Sir, (b)(6) runs (b)(6) mission (according to his face book) is to "actively search for clues regarding the disposition of American Combatants possibly left behind in Laos against their will after 1973." He travels to Laos investigating possible loss locations. I believe he does this as a tourist with no coordination with the Lao Gov--which is a concern. He visited Laos first in 2012 on his own. (b)(6) (TSgt Louis Clever) was killed when the EC-47Q (call sign CAP 72) was shot down over Southern Laos on February 5, 1969. He went with his wife (Thai/Lao speaker). He found the site and recovered remains which were sent to JPAC and included in the ID memo. In his last trip in Dec 2015, he states he investigated a Pathet Lao POW Camp Site and linked the site to eight American POWs, and believes Capt Appelhans was one of those POWs (Case 0862). He going to present his findings on 20 Feb at the Jefferson Barracks POW-MIA Museum, St Louis. He says he has info that strongly suggests more than a couple of American POWs were left behind in Laos. He's contacted us once asking how he can support us...before we had an SP. He said he would contact us again in early 2016. I briefed (b)(6)--so SP is aware. The Appelhans case is not on the upcoming FMU.

Racine resident, 93, reflects on captivity as Japanese POW

U.S. Marine veteran Marvin Roslansky, 93, was held prisoner in a Japanese prison camp for almost four years during World War II. More than 70 years later, he still finds it difficult to talk about the ordeal.

RACINE — Even Marines — the few, the proud, the first to fight — can cry.

More than seven decades have passed since Racine resident Marvin Roslansky endured exhausting slave labor, intentional malnutrition, filthy living conditions and brutal beatings as a prisoner of war in a

Japanese labor camp during World War II.

While the physical pain has subsided, the emotional wounds still sting. Tears well in Roslansky's eyes when he even thinks about his three long years of captivity in Zentsuji prison camp.

"I still can't really talk about Japan," says Roslansky, now 93 years old, his eyes red and watery. "We did what we could. We lived one day at a time. There was no place for us to go. We couldn't escape. We were in hell and you had to have a lot of faith."

Faith and dreams of returning home to his native Lakeview, Minn., for the next holiday kept Roslansky alive for his 45 months of hell.

"You could be beaten at any moment for any reason at all," he remembered. "We knew you would have to do what they said or you would never go Caution-home."

Roslansky was one of 147 Marines based on the island of Guam in September 1941. Guam was an idyllic, sought-after destination: tropical climes, white sand beaches, cheap beer. The peace was shattered Dec. 7, 1941, when the Japanese bombed the island as part of their coordinated attack across the Pacific, including Pearl Harbor.

Two days later, 6,000 soldiers from the Imperial Japanese Army waded ashore. Roslansky helped the short-lived defense before the island was captured.

Roslansky and the rest of the Marines were loaded aboard the MS Argentina Maru, a luxury liner turned into a warship. They were sent to Shikoku, Japan, a small island about 400 miles from Tokyo, and imprisoned in Zentsuji.

For long hours each day, Roslansky and his fellow prisoners loaded and unloaded railroad cars in the Sakaide rail yards. Guards beat prisoners without provocation or reason, he said. By night, prisoners tried to survive on starvation rations, and sometimes no food at all. They got English language newspapers, but those had more paper than news.

"They were cut full of holes," he said.

The most frightening time was the final months of the war. Prison officials knew the end was near. The Army issued orders to not feed prisoners, then directed guards to execute them.

"Our graves were already dug," Roslansky said.

After almost a year of bloody fighting — Marines raised the flag on Iwo Jima 71 years ago Tuesday — Japan surrendered in August 1945. But it took Allied forces another month to liberate all the prison camps. The now-free Marines from Guam hung on for 30 more days without food and little water.

Post-war reconciliation

Miraculously, 103 of the 147 Guam Marines survived their ordeal. They spent months in Guam and San Diego recovering. Roslansky then spent six months at Great Lakes Naval Training Base near Waukegan, Ill., before moving to Racine in 1946.

He used GI Bill money to learn automotive work. In 1949, he purchased Sturtevant Auto Sales and Salvage and operated the yard for 32 years. He retired in 1981. He spent a few years in Arizona, and in 2013 traveled to Japan with a contingent of former POWs.

"At first I refused to go," he said. "But I actually had never seen Japan. They appreciated us being there.

They were sorry it happened. They were bad, bad people during the war.”

During the war, the Japanese held 2,274 Marines in prison camps across Asia, according to the POW Research Network. By the end of 2014, only 200 of those Marines were still alive.

Roslansky is one of them. His story has appeared in several books about World War II. At 93, his mind, eyes and hearing still sharp, he volunteers at various veterans groups and visits veterans hospitals. Each Thursday he gathers with local veterans at the Piggly Wiggly, 5201 Washington Ave., to drink coffee, listen to music and just talk.

“There are not many like him left,” said Racine resident David Kramer, a Racine Marine who is active in the Fourth Fest parade. “He has been a part of history. We owe these men like him so much.”

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Marvin A. Roslansky Timeline

1922: Born in Lakeview, Minnesota.

1941: Enlists in Marine Corps, achieves the rank of sergeant.

December 9, 1941: Captured by Japanese soldiers on Guam.

Jan. 16, 1942: Arrives in Shikoku, Japan, and is transported to the Zentsuji prison camp. Spends next three-plus years as a slave laborer.

August 1945: Japan surrenders.

September 1945: Liberated from Zentsuji.

1946: Moves to Racine. Operates an auto salvage yard in Sturtevant.

1981: Retires.

2010: Marries Josephine Plourde. Lives in Mesa, Ariz., for several years.

2013: Visits Japan as a guest of the Government of Japan.

2015: Josephine dies.

August 2015: Moves into Home Harbor in Racine.

Feb. 23, 1945: Flag rises on Mt. Suribachi

On Feb. 23, 1945, United States military forces captured Mount Suribachi on Iwo Jima, four days after invading the Pacific island.

Five Marines and a Navy corpsman raised an American flag atop the dormant volcanic cone.

The picture of the flag raising, snapped by Joe Rosenthal, has become one of the most iconic images in American history and won the Pulitzer Prize in 1945.

The image was later used by Felix de Weldon to sculpt the Marine Corps War Memorial dedicated in 1954

and located adjacent to Arlington National Cemetery just outside Washington, D.C.

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

AMERICANS ACCOUNTED FOR: The number of US personnel missing and unaccounted-for from the Vietnam war is now **1,622**. The number of Americans now listed by DoD as returned and identified since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 is 961. Most recently accounted for is Major Donald G. Carr, USA, listed MIA on July 6, 1971, in South Vietnam, remains returned August 29, 2014, and identified August 19, 2015. The second officer recently accounted for is 1LT Donald W. Bruch, USAF, listed KIA/BNR on April 29, 1966, in North Vietnam, remains returned December 14, 2011, and identified September 4, 2015. This brings the total accounted for to **961** since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975. Another 63 US personnel, recovered by the US and identified before the end of the war, bring the total of US personnel accounted for from the Vietnam War to **1,024**. Of the 1,622 still missing and unaccounted-for, 90% were lost in Vietnam or in areas of Cambodia and Laos under Vietnam's wartime control: Vietnam-1,264 (VN-466, VS-798); Laos-302; Cambodia-49; PRC territorial waters-7. These country-specific numbers can and do fluctuate when investigations result in changes to loss locations. Since formation in 1970, the League has sought the return of all POWs, the fullest possible accounting for those still missing, and repatriation of all recoverable remains.

DPAA DIRECTOR VISITED RUSSIA AND EUROPEAN NATIONS:

Following coordination with General Robert "Doc" Foglesong, USAF (Ret), US Co-Chairman of the USRJC, and with interagency approval, Mr. Linnington traveled to Moscow February 8th to meet with Russian Co-Chairman General Colonel Vostrotin. There he proposed the date and agenda for a US-Russia Joint Commission on POW/MIA Affairs (USRJC) Plenary Session later this year in Washington, DC. There is great hope of renewing and restoring the work of the USRJC, especially since the Russian

Federation named its new Chairman and opened its new office in their Embassy in Washington, DC. Recognizing it was past time to get beyond the endless delays that have plagued work of the USRJC, the League welcomes and appreciates these new initiatives by leaders in both countries and looks forward to increased efforts and accounting results. Director Linnington also visited several European countries and senior US officials in the region who will be contributing to the effort to conduct WWII recoveries.

Plan your departure no earlier than Sunday, June 26th, to enable you to participate fully throughout the meeting and maximize your time in the Washington, DC, area with access to US officials directly responsible for the accounting mission and to the historic sites in our nation's capital. The 47th Annual Meeting formally concludes Saturday evening, June 24th, with a League-hosted Farewell Reception.

This means that as a result of rigorous investigation, we have conclusive evidence the individual perished, but do not believe it possible to recover his remains. On rare occasions, new leads can arise that bring a case back to a more active status.

Repatriating and Identifying Remains

- The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) plans to conduct four Joint Field Activities (JFAs) this fiscal year in Vietnam. Each JFA involves approximately 95 U.S. personnel plus their Vietnamese counterparts. Together, they work on investigations and excavations throughout the country for a period of approximately 30 days.
- American remains are transferred to DPAA’s Central Identification Lab in Hawaii for identification by forensic anthropologists.
- The 121st JFA began November 6 and continued through December 15, 2015. Recovery teams excavated sites in Dien Bien, Son La, Thanh Hoa, and Ha Tinh Provinces.
- The 122nd JFA began February 25 and continues through April 12, 2016. Recovery teams are excavating sites in Kontum, Binh Dinh, Dac Lac, Khanh Hoa, and Binh Phuoc Provinces.

Resolving “Last Known Alive” Cases

- Of the original 196 individuals “Last Known Alive” in Vietnam (those who survived or may have survived their loss incident and were either alive on the ground, in captivity, or in immediate proximity to capture, but did not return), DoD has confirmed the death of 174, with 22 still unresolved.
- Of the 174 whose deaths have been confirmed, the remains of 51 have been located and identified.
- Cambodia, Vietnam, and U.S. technical experts met in Hanoi in November 2004 to discuss Last Known Alive cases along the Cambodia – Vietnam border. A meeting with Laos, Vietnam, and U.S. technical experts to discuss Last Known Alive cases along the Laos – Vietnam border took place in Vientiane in April 2005.
- U.S. and Vietnam technical experts meet regularly in Hanoi to discuss Last Known Alive cases in Vietnam, as well as in Cambodia and Laos.

Research and Investigations

- U.S. POW/MIA investigators rotate into Hanoi on a continuous basis to pursue leads associated with the remaining 1,264 Americans still unaccounted for in Vietnam.
- A research effort continues in the Ministry of National Defense (MND) central archives. Since May 2012, Vietnam has turned over policy, strategic, and tactical level archival documents regarding unaccounted for Americans.
- In addition to the interviews conducted during JFAs, U.S. and Vietnamese investigators have conducted nearly 300 oral history interviews of Vietnamese government and military officials, including General Vo Nguyen Giap.
- Since Vietnamese troops occupied portions of Cambodia and Laos during the War, the U.S. asked them to cooperate in investigations there. Ninety-three (93) Vietnamese witnesses have participated in operations in Laos (79) and Cambodia (14); most of them have participated more than once.

Of the remaining 49 Americans still unaccounted for in Cambodia, seven are in a “non-recoverable” category. This means that as a result of rigorous investigation, we have conclusive evidence the individual perished, but do not believe it possible to recover his remains. On rare occasions, new leads can arise that bring a case back to a more active status.

Repatriating and Identifying Remains

- The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) normally conducts at least one Joint Field Activity (JFA) per fiscal year in Cambodia.
- Each JFA involves 25-40 U.S. personnel plus their Cambodian counterparts. Together, they work on investigations and excavations throughout the country for a period of approximately 30-60 days.
- American remains are transferred to DPAA’s Central Identification Lab in Hawaii for identification by forensic anthropologists.
- The 50th JFA began January 10 and continued through March 23, 2015. A recovery team excavated a site in Kampong Som Province.
- The 51st JFA began January 10 and continued through March 1, 2016. A recovery team excavated sites in Prey Veng and Stung Treng Provinces.

Resolving “Last Known Alive” Cases

- Of the original 19 individuals “Last Known Alive” in Cambodia (those who survived or may have survived their loss incident and were either alive on the ground, in captivity, or in immediate proximity to capture, but did not return), DoD has confirmed the death of 10, with nine still unresolved.
- Of the 10 whose deaths have been confirmed, the remains of seven have been located and identified.
- U.S. and Vietnam technical experts meet regularly in Hanoi to discuss Last Known Alive cases in areas of Cambodia controlled by Vietnamese forces during the war.

Research and Investigations

- A U.S. POW/MIA investigator is stationed in Phnom Penh full-time. He pursues leads associated with the remaining 49 individuals still unaccounted for in Cambodia.
- Witnesses have assisted in identifying recovery sites on Koh Tang, the island associated with the Mayaguez incident. Thirteen of the 18 Americans missing from that incident have been recovered and identified.
- U.S. researchers continue to review materials in Cambodian archives. Private researchers studying Khmer Rouge wartime atrocities in Cambodia have shared relevant information they have uncovered.

Together, they will work on investigations and excavations throughout the country for periods of between 30 - 45 days.
- American remains are transferred to DPAA’s Central Identification Lab in Hawaii for identification by forensic anthropologists.
- The 139th JFA began January 10 and continued through February 16, 2016. Recovery teams excavated sites in Attapeu and Savannakhet Provinces.
- The 140th JFA began February 29 and continues through April 6, 2016. Recovery teams are excavating sites in Houaphan, Xiang Khoang, and Khammouan Provinces.

Resolving “Last Known Alive” Cases

- Of the original 81 individuals “Last Known Alive” in Laos (those who survived or may have survived their loss incident and were either alive on the ground, in captivity, or in immediate proximity to capture, but did not return), DoD has confirmed the death of 62, with 19 still unresolved.
- Of the 62 whose deaths have been confirmed, the remains of 20 have been located and identified.
- U.S. and Vietnam technical experts meet regularly in Hanoi to discuss Last Known Alive cases in areas of Laos controlled by Vietnamese forces during the war.

Research and Investigations

- A U.S. POW/MIA investigator is stationed in Vientiane full-time. He pursues leads associated with the remaining 302 individuals unaccounted for in Laos.
- The Lao have allowed approximately 80 Vietnamese witnesses to participate in investigating 50 cases in trilateral operations during JFAs in Laos. These witnesses have provided significant information that has led to the excavation of several sites and recoveries associated with as many as 20 individuals.
- The U.S. completed an archival research arrangement with the Lao in 2007. The initiative, begun in June 2004, involved a jointly planned comprehensive effort to locate documents in Lao archives that could contain information regarding Americans missing in Laos during the war. The program did not uncover any information.
- The Lao allowed a Joint Archival Research Team (ART) access to the Lao National Film Archives and Video Center from 1994 - 1999. The ART reviewed over 18,000 photographs, with eight depicting U.S. POWs and nine depicting U.S. aircraft wreckage.

Rolling Thunder < Caution-Caution-<http://www.washingtontimes.com/topics/rolling-thunder-inc/>> is known for its patriotic "Ride for Freedom" to the nation's capital each year and an intense interest in veterans' affairs. Now the national motorcycle club has inspired some legislation, based on the organization's unwavering support for the "chair of honor" — a simple but effective public reminder of some 83,000 troops still missing in action or held as prisoners of war.

Each chair bears the stark, familiar POW/MIA emblem and remains permanently unoccupied; currently, there are chairs of honor placed in 100 indoor and outdoor sites around the nation, including several major sports stadiums. But Rolling Thunder < Caution-Caution-<http://www.washingtontimes.com/topics/rolling-thunder-inc/>> officers wanted to know: Why not one for the U.S. Capitol?

They made their case two years ago to Rep. Stephen F. Lynch, Massachusetts Democrat, who introduced the "National POW/MIA Remembrance Act of 2015," which passed unanimously on the floor of the House last week. The bill has straightforward intent, providing that an appropriate chair of honor be placed on the Capitol grounds as a solemn, enduring reminder of those who did not make it home. A bipartisan companion bill in the Senate < Caution-Caution-<http://www.washingtontimes.com/topics/senate/>> has also been introduced by Sens. Marco Rubio, Florida Republican, and Elizabeth Warren, Massachusetts Democrat.

"When we pass this chair every day, we will be reminded of our commitment to our POWs, our MIAs and their families that we have not forgotten them, we will never forget them, and we will not rest until they all come home," the Massachusetts Democrat said after the bill passed, heartily crediting Rolling

WASHINGTON — The Air Force closed the case on Sgt. Joseph Matejov when his surveillance aircraft went down at the end of the Vietnam War.

The missing airman was deemed killed in the fiery crash, and more than two decades later a group gravestone was installed at Arlington National Cemetery. A single casket containing bone fragments recovered in Laos was lowered into the ground at the 1996 funeral for Matejov and seven fellow Air Force crewmembers.

Officially, it was the end of the military's accounting.

But the funeral did not bury the controversy over the downed aircraft, call sign Baron 52. The case's long history is riddled with doubts and disagreements within the Pentagon, intelligence community and Congress over whether Matejov died that night in 1973.

Now, the Air Force and the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency are re-examining the incident after decades of pressure from Matejov's family and could change his status from killed to missing in action. A decision could be made within weeks.

The airmen's nine siblings, who have pushed for the change, in February presented evidence to the accounting agency of Air Force conjecture over the crash circumstances and a radio intercept about potential American captives. The evidence, spanning 43 years and compiled by the family, contains declassified documents and was shared with Stars and Stripes.

"MIA is not closure, though it is better than this travesty that exists in the file to this day," said his younger brother John Matejov, who is a retired Marine officer. "We shouldn't have to fight for that."

The change would add Matejov to the list of 83,000 servicemembers still missing and require DPAA to embark on a new effort to account for his remains.

An MIA status would be a stunning reversal for the Air Force, which has insisted since 1973 that there is

no proof airmen escaped the Baron 52 crash. It would also be an extraordinary precedent for the DPAA to support the move, giving hope to other families still searching for loved ones lost in the war.

'That KIA determination was wrong'

For Matejov's family, the decades of uncertainty and frustration began with a letter from his wing commander a week after his EC-47 aircraft crashed.

"After careful consideration, I feel that there is a possibility that one or more crew members could have parachuted to safety, therefore your son will continue to be carried in a missing status until a final determination can be made," Col. Francis Humphreys wrote to Matejov's father and mother on Feb. 13, 1973.

Their hope was smashed days later by another letter from the colonel.

With little new evidence, Humphreys, who retired as a brigadier general and died in 2013, reversed his opinion and listed Matejov and all seven other crewmembers as killed in action.

"My chief concern is that KIA determination was wrong," said Roger Shields, who was chairman of the Defense Department POW/MIA task group and directed the return of American prisoners of war during Operation Homecoming. "Nobody at the time when this decision was made could have said without any question that these men were dead."

During the Vietnam War, the military often classified troops as missing in action – and assumed further effort might bring them back alive – even when the facts indicated otherwise, he said. Troops were rated MIA even when witnesses saw their aircraft go down with an intact canopy and no rescue beacon was activated.

"We just saw too many cases where it looked like the chances of survival were not that good but it turned out that people did survive," he said.

Last contact

Joe Matejov turned 21 in February 1973. He had been deployed 10 months as an electronic warfare specialist with the Air Force Security Service, first to Vietnam and then to an airfield in Thailand. The classified work consisted of eavesdropping on North Vietnamese forces during flights over the officially neutral country of Laos.

His tour was wrapping up – 100 missions under his belt and a Distinguished Flying Cross in the pipeline – and he was ready to get back to the United States.

His EC-47 flew out of Ubon Royal Thai Air Force Base just before midnight Feb. 4. The converted cargo plane, equipped with secret surveillance equipment, carried three other electronic warfare specialists from the 6994th Security Squadron and a four-man flight crew with the 361st Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron.

Over Laos, the flight left U.S. radar coverage. The airmen flew at a lofty 10,000 feet as they sniffed out North Vietnamese tanks moving south along the Ho Chi Minh Trail.

Crews had recently begun flying at the higher altitude to avoid artillery fire. Even so, parachutes were packed and each crewmember carried a survival radio preset to an emergency frequency.

Every 20 minutes, Baron 52 radioed Moonbeam, the airborne command-and-control center also plying the night sky over Laos. At 1:25 a.m., the crew reported 37 mm or 57 mm anti-aircraft fire but no damage.

There were no more updates from Baron 52.

Report: No evidence of survivors

Four days after the last radio contact, an HH-3E Jolly Green Giant helicopter hovered over the Baron 52 wreckage as it lowered two pararescuemen and a radioman. The airmen worked quickly once on the ground. The area was hostile, and approaching aircraft heard gunfire and were targeted by a missile. Two large North Vietnamese bases were just miles away.

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“When we got there one of the PJs set up a perimeter, and the other one and myself were looking for bodies,” the technical sergeant radio operator at the time, Ron Schofield, said in a declassified Air Force oral history interview in 1989.

Schofield and the team searched for crewmembers and ensured the classified surveillance equipment used by the Air Force Security Service was destroyed.

The EC-47 was on its back. The rear of the fuselage – where Matejov and three other electronic warfare specialists were seated – was badly damaged after a heavy load of fuel burned off in the crash.

Still, the bodies of four airmen, including the seated pilot and copilot, were visible, preserved by their fire-retardant flight suits. The team was only able to recover the remains of pilot 1st Lt. Robert E. Bernhardt

during a rushed 15 minutes on the ground.

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Matejov and the other three “backenders” could not be seen in the wreckage.

“There should have been some remains of the backenders in the fire, but there wasn’t anything,” Schofield said in 1989.

The search-and-rescue report found no evidence of survivors. However, Schofield remembered a clue in the burnt fuselage that pointed to crewmembers escaping through a rear door.

“These aircraft flew with the doors on. If that aircraft had crashed with the door on, there would have been a little bit of it left at the top” where the plane had burned, he said. “It was gone. It looked like it had been kicked off.”

‘A certain amount of conjecture’

After the search, Humphreys believed some of the crew could have gotten out of the EC-47 before it crashed Feb. 5 on the jungle floor.

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On Feb. 5, 1973, about a week after the signing of the Paris Peace Agreement, an EC-47Q electronic warfare collection aircraft call sign Baron 52, was shot down over Saravane province, Laos, about 50 miles east of the city of Saravane.

But pressure was mounting from the families over the missing-in-action status. They wanted progress in finding the airmen.

An Air Force cable from higher command to Humphreys on Feb. 21 said, “The father of one of the missing men has contacted this office” after receiving the colonel’s letter about possible survivors.

A few days later, Humphreys again wrote to the Matejovs and other crew families, this time with a very different conclusion.

“A careful review of all available facts has been made and there is no reasonable doubt that there were no survivors,” the letter said.

The letter was met with enough fear and doubt that the colonel wrote again to the families in March, denying that his decision was premature or lacked a sound basis.

“We did employ a certain amount of conjecture in trying to visualize the events as they took place,” Humphreys wrote. “However, we made logical assumptions based on all the available faces and information.”

He said the Baron 52 flight was blown out of the air suddenly, leaving no time for escape. The high-tech equipment on the EC-47 and the crew’s survival radios were key to his determination. The airmen never made contact again in the moments – and then days – after the crash.

“The intensive training of all flying personnel makes it improbable that at least one of the crew members would not have instinctively transmitted on one of the many pieces of communication equipment available in case of an emergency, unless they were all immediately and completely incapacitated,” he wrote.

‘Holding four pilots captive’

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The barracks at Ubon Royal Thai Air Force Base located on the eastern border of Thailand was the host to Detachment 3 of the 6994th Security Squadron and eventually the Headquarters, 6994th Security Squadron. Detachment 3 operated out of Ubon from Dec. 1, 1972, until Feb. 7, 1974.

At the time of the Baron 52 crash, a U.S. surveillance plane flying somewhere over the South China Sea picked up an enemy radio intercept.

The initial classified translation was: “Group is holding four pilots captive and the group is requesting orders concerning what to do with them.” A later version used the word “pirates,” which some would claim was a term used for Americans, and also included numerical markers.

The intercept was publicly revealed years later, in 1979, when it became a central – and strongly disputed – piece of evidence. Was it proof Matejov and the three other “backenders” had escaped and been captured by enemy forces in Laos?

It is unclear whether the Air Force command had direct access to the classified intercept in February 1973 when it decided to list Matejov and the other crewmembers as killed in action. Records show the Air Force Security Service discussed the possibility of “sanitizing” a specific piece of classified intelligence so it could be presented to support keeping Baron 52 personnel listed as missing in action.

Lionel Blau was a captain serving as operations officer at Matejov's 6994th Squadron at the time. He was skeptical of the push for a KIA status and pressed Humphreys to look into the intercept.

"I went in and simply told the colonel, 'Please do not make that decision yet until we can get straightened out what this [intelligence] is about,'" Blau said in a declassified 1989 oral history interview. He said Humphreys turned him down because he believed the search-and-rescue evidence showed no one could have escaped the crash.

But Blau continued to believe the airmen had an opportunity to escape.

"I've gone through this in my sleep, awake. It haunted me for quite a while," he said during the interview.

'The science was conclusive'

By spring 1973, Shields, the National Security Agency and the Defense Intelligence Agency still believed there was a slim chance that crewmembers escaped the aircraft, a Senate select committee found in 1993 after investigating the case.

An NSA analyst named Jerry Mooney stoked the smoldering doubts with a memorandum in May 1973 about the enemy radio intercept.

Mooney, a fiery critic of U.S. treatment of POWs during the Vietnam War, retired from the agency in the late 1970s and left public service for an isolated part of Montana, where he keeps three telephones but no computer. "Too easy to bug," he joked.

The radio intercept could only be traced to one area – the Baron 52 crash site in Laos, according to Mooney.

"Everything showed that the target communications that were sent were from that area and in reference to that shoot-down. ... The science was conclusive," he said.

His NSA interpretation of the radio intercept claimed it showed not only the location of the transmission, but also that U.S. crewmembers with burns were given water and transported by truck between particular mile markers along a road in Laos.

"After three months, there was no doubt all this stuff was tied into the EC-47," Mooney said.

Word of the intercept and Mooney's memo spread among airmen in Matejov's squadron. It was startling news to Joe Matejov's father in 1979 when it was made public by the press. The Matejov family had held a funeral, as the Air Force advised, and was coming to grips with the sergeant's death.

Airmen began telling Stephen Matejov, a former Army lieutenant colonel with a Silver Star from the Korean War, about sightings of men herded along dirt roads and radio intercepts about American captives.

"It was 'barracks room' talk, and these men expressed surprise and consternation that those captured would be declared dead in so short a time," he wrote in a frustrated letter to the Air Force.

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Word of the radio intercept and Mooney's memo spread among airmen in Matejov's squadron and was made public by the press in 1979. Theory or 'musings'

Bob DeStatte, a senior analyst with the Defense Intelligence Agency, was handpicked by the White House in 1986 to take another look at the case after years of public controversy and news coverage, much of it over the radio intercept.

DeStatte was an Army signals intercept technician during the Vietnam War and was later recruited by the DIA to investigate Vietnam POW cases. "I knew how to make reasonable judgments," he said.

If Mooney was a believer in the value of intercepts – called signals intelligence – DeStatte was a skeptic.

"In general, I think you should never rely on signals intelligence without some collateral information from other sources to deal with it," he said. "In this case we had one intercept."

DeStatte tracked down the airman on the modified Boeing 707 who had picked up the transmission. He provided flight logs, which often include handwritten notes for analysts.

"The intercept technician sitting on that aircraft added such a footnote ... his comment was, 'Other

transmissions on this frequency indicate that the transmitting unit is located in the vicinity of Vinh city,” on the central Vietnamese coast, DeStatte said.

That put the origin far from the interior of Laos where the Baron 52 wreckage was found.

Sen. Bob Smith, vice chairman of the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs, questions Bob DeStatte, a senior analyst with the Defense Intelligence Agency, about the Baron 52 intelligence during a 1992 hearing.

DeStatte’s investigation resulted in a detailed takedown of Mooney’s theory – what DeStatte now calls a page and a half of “musings”—and a DIA conclusion that the transmission had nothing to do with the flight.

In the early 1990s, the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs chaired by John Kerry also investigated Mooney’s claims. Relying heavily on DeStatte and the DIA’s work, it came back with an equally skeptical conclusion.

“Mooney’s analytical judgments regarding the Baron 52 incident are largely speculative and unsubstantiated,” the committee wrote in its final report. “There is no firm evidence that links the Baron 52 crew to the single enemy report upon which Mooney apparently based his analysis.”

‘Get this stuff behind us’

The Senate committee spent 18 months traveling the globe and holding hearings on Baron 52 and other reports of possible POWs from the Vietnam War. In 1993, it concluded there was no evidence that the United States left anyone behind.

But again, the Baron 52 case would have no clear-cut resolution.

“They started from the premise that it (the evidence) was all bogus,” said Bob Smith, a former New Hampshire Republican senator and the committee vice chairman. “Their goal was to get this stuff behind us, account for as many people as we could, put them on a list and then normalize relations with Vietnam.”

When the committee issued its findings, Smith released a list of POWs he said were still not accounted for by the United States. Matejov and the Baron 52 airmen were on it, despite the Air Force insistence and the doubts raised over the intercept evidence.

The crew should never have been considered killed in action if there was any indication of capture, he said. Instead the Air Force should have assumed they were missing.

“The Matejov family, what they went through is a disgrace,” he said. “They are still not getting all the information from the government.”

Smith was a controversial figure on the committee. Shields and DeStatte viewed him as a zealot and still hold some bitterness. He and his committee staff were “true believers,” who like military families at the time were ready to assume a cover-up, said Frances Zwenig, a Democrat under Kerry who was staff director of the committee.

“You want to believe your loved one wasn’t killed,” she said.

‘Not my brother’s teeth’

The crash site in Laos was finally excavated in 1993. Examiners uncovered 31 bone fragments and a variety of zippers, fasteners, pieces of flight gear and side arms. The fragments could not be tested – or even conclusively determined to be all human.

The excavation uncovered compelling evidence including metal pieces to account for eight parachutes – enough for all crewmembers. It also found one of Matejov’s dog tags.

The Matejov family and others have discounted the findings. They say crews sometimes carried extra parachutes and airmen had more than one dog tag, leaving open the possibility of escape and survival.

Among the remains was a single tooth.

Sgt. Peter Cressman was a radio operator in the back of Baron 52, just like Joe Matejov. Twenty years after he was declared dead, the Air Force identified the tooth as his.

His younger brother, Bob, still has doubts. The tooth was identified using dental records instead of DNA testing, Cressman said. But the Air Force records showed two full rows of teeth. Some of Peter Cressman’s teeth had been knocked out and he wore a dental plate.

“Those X-rays are not my brother’s teeth,” Cressman said.

Cressman is a retired law enforcement officer, a former police sergeant who once oversaw a sheriff's office crime prevention division. After clashing with the Air Force over his brother's death, he parlayed his professional experience into investigating POW cases in the 1980s.

"I don't want to sound like a conspiracy idiot because I don't believe in all that crap," said Bob Cressman. "I think from everything I've seen and heard from interviews, I think that he and several people on that plane got out before it crashed."

'What it all boils down to'

Joe Matejov's family filed into a conference room at the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency in Arlington, Va., in February. All nine of his siblings and other relatives had flown in from across the country – two now using walkers.

Stephen Matejov had traveled to the area 37 years earlier and left the Pentagon perplexed by the decision in his son's case. In 2007, the family received what they considered a lengthy run-around regarding a Baron 52 review from the DPAA's predecessor agencies, the Defense POW/Missing Personnel Office and the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command.

But the years of persistence finally won them an opportunity to present their case directly to Michael Linnington, the DPAA director, and Brig. Gen. Mark Spindler, the deputy director. The Matejovs went prepared with a presentation of witnesses, experts and declassified military documents put together with about a decade's worth of pro bono work by a sympathetic Washington law firm.

"What it all boils down to when all is said and done, however, is right here. ... Sgt. Joseph Matejov, our brother," John Matejov told the DPAA officials as he pointed to the airman's portrait. "Joe put on a uniform and went to fight for his country, a country that has yet to properly account for him."

The DPAA leaders listened for two hours and agreed to send a recommendation on the change of status to the Air Force by mid-April.

The service will make the final decision on whether to list Matejov as missing in action, Air Force spokeswoman Capt. Brooke Brzozowska told Stars and Stripes.

A decision to change the status would mean that DPAA “would seek to account for them as we do with all other individuals who are unaccounted for from past conflicts,” agency spokeswoman Lt. Col. Holly Slaughter told Stars and Stripes.

It would also be an admission by the Air Force that it erred when considering Matejov killed all those years ago.

“I honestly don’t believe he is alive but he didn’t die in the crash,” his sister Theresa Freeze, 56, said. “We just want the truth. We want [the case] to remain open and be looking for him ... because we don’t believe he came Caution-home.”

Freeze, a West Point graduate who served as an Army captain, said it is unlikely the DPAA would launch a mission to Laos to find her brother, and that the family is not asking for the contents of the Arlington grave to be exhumed for further testing. Instead, she wants her brother’s name to be added to the 83,000 servicemembers the DPAA lists as missing and unrecovered.

As unidentified remains are discovered in Southeast Asia and elsewhere, Matejov would be considered as a possible match, Freeze said.

“Every day now on Facebook, I see them finding remains and bringing them home and giving people closure,” she said.

‘He was denied’

John Matejov was the recipient of the last letter his brother ever wrote, sent from Southeast Asia before the plane crashed. He keeps it in a safe in his home. From time to time, he takes out the letter and reads it, choking with emotion.

Just a year apart, the brothers shared the tightest bond in the family.

They competed in everything and got in trouble together, Matejov said. They planned to enlist in the military together after high school.

“I oftentimes wonder where he would have been, what his career path would have been. Would he have kids?” he said. “And he was denied that.”

He has mastered all the details of the case. Every point has been considered and reconsidered in the hope that it will finally, someday, persuade the Air Force to see the family's version of the truth.

It has become a long-running theme in his life, repaying a debt to a brother he loved so much.

"First and foremost is honor. I don't understand why people don't grasp that. The debt of honor," John Matejov said. "We all have our lives, we all have our distractions. I get that. But if we can't uphold honor in the accounting process ... who are we?"

The likely remains of American airmen who went missing over the Himalayas during a World War Two mission are finally returning Caution-home.

They were found after a major search in mountainous jungles in Arunachal Pradesh state in northeastern India, and are being flown to Hawaii for DNA testing.

The men were among Allied pilots who flew perilous routes over the world's highest mountains to deliver supplies from Indian airfields to Chinese forces from 1942.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA), which deals with US soldiers missing in action, sent a team to Arunachal Pradesh last September to try to find wreckage of a B-24 Liberator plane downed in 1944 with eight men on board.

"They had to hike in for three days to get to the site," said US Marine Corps captain Greg Lynch.

He said once there, they spent eight hours a day carrying out detailed searches on a steep slope, often roped together.

They painstakingly sifted through soil around the plane's wreckage to try to find the airmen's remains, but the risk of landslides stopped them searching the whole site.

They found what they believe to be the remains of one or two of the missing airmen.

Gary Stark, from the DPAA's India desk, said the remains could fit inside a ziplock sandwich bag, but to the families that does not matter.

"To have something that they can put in a casket and know that this was Grandpa Joe and they can bring to a cemetery of their choice and have buried with military honours is closure for them," he said.

Allied airmen ferried about 650,000 tonnes of fuel, weapons and equipment over the eastern Himalayas - which they nicknamed "The Hump" - when the Japanese cut off the main land route through Burma.

According to the China-Burma-India Hump Pilots Association, 590 planes went down with the loss of more than 1,650 lives.

Many crashed in the mountains of Arunachal Pradesh, bordering China, Bhutan and Burma.

Todd, during your meeting tomorrow, you can expect that Ann will raise the issue of breakout rooms at the annual League Meeting. I just had a long talk with her as we do every year at this time. As background, since 2008, we (DPAA) have paid for the breakout rooms for the services to meet with their respective families -- one each for the Army, Air Force, and Navy/Marine Corps and one for the DPAA analysts in which to work and to hold overflow meetings. Prior to 2008, the League picked up this cost as detailed in the email chain at the bottom which I sent to her earlier this afternoon because she could not recall why we (DPMO) took over the breakout room contracts --- the reason we did is because she told us to.

As we have done since 2008, we plan to contract for four breakout rooms for two days (Thursday/Friday). These two days were selected because our past leadership had determined we could conduct all the government business in those two days. As it stands, the four rooms are going to cost us \$2400 (1200/day) for Thursday and Friday.

In addition to doubling the costs, if we are going to host meetings on Wednesday and Saturday, the services are going to face two extra days of travel and per diem and likewise so will our analysts from Hawaii. In the past, we have always worked these outliers by meeting with the handful of families on Wednesday night or Saturday morning. The necessary casualty officers would simply fly in early Wednesday or fly out late Sunday. Ann has a point in that spreading the one-on-one meetings over four days will allow the families to focus more on the government briefings on Thursday and Friday; however, the League hosts non-government business during those two days. This year, she has a new argument-- i.e. in the spirit of new leadership we should be hosting one-on-one meetings all four days.

My recommendation is that you take notes and listen and discuss with the Director when he returns. My recommendation would be to compromise and agree to contract for two rooms (we won't need four) on Wednesday and then we plan to host one-on-one meetings on Wednesday afternoon when most of the families fly into town. We just need to make the sure the Army, Air Force, and Navy can support. The Marines are local and won't be impacted. I would not agree to holding one-on-one meetings on Saturday not for the associated costs but simply for the wear and tear on the analysts. They are beat up and worn out by Saturday.

In view of a shortage of the color assigned this year to USG officials' badges (red), we have decided NOT to make them for uniformed officials at all levels, since they are reticent to place them on uniforms anyway and many have their names displayed.


I understand that DPMO normally pays for the meeting spaces for the "Family Updates" held around the country, as well as costs incurred for DPMO to host the "Annual Government Briefings" for the Korea/Cold War Families. Those charges are undoubtedly much higher than the \$750/three days required for the breakout rooms. Since a flyer was sent to the families stating that the upcoming 39th Annual Meeting was in fact the "Annual Government Briefings," at which the individual case reviews would be available, perhaps this is the means by which tax-payer funds might be legally expended.

We regret that this was necessary, and the League will also be paying for meeting space this year, for the first time, and you can be certain we don't have the funds for such expenses. Best to all,

Good morning, Mike,

As we all anticipated, impatience is growing and will continue to grow in the Vietnam War community as additional assets and resources are required for WWII remains recovery and an "ID-counting" mentality that still seems to motivate some, especially in the Lab. This is somewhat understandable since successful IDs are their sole measurement of success. Cases that have been on the Master Excavation List (MEL) for many, many years are still waiting. In our view, the priority for scheduling should NOT be influenced by political factors, including Members of Congress, but such pressures will increasingly be inevitable.

Families must have total confidence in the integrity of the process, as well as the people implementing it; therefore, I encourage you to determine the priorities for scheduling excavations based on DPAA's reality and in terms that all can and will understand and accept as logical, at least eventually, in the

best interest of the overall mission. I cannot express that same hope for the WWII and Korean War families as they all appear more focused on their own individual cases.

I haven't sent this note or the article below to the families, or even the board as yet, but perhaps you might consider a solution, clearly spelled out, to separate accounting processes and priorities for each war. As related to the Vietnam War, the initial assurance on which confidence was built was directed from the top, and more recently by former Secretary Hagel's direction to "build on the existing strengths" and implement the "complete reorganization" using that direction as a guideline.

I very much appreciate the budget figures and usage of operational funds you showed me in confidence, but to knowledgeable family members and veterans long involved, it is looking increasingly like what was working for Vietnam War accounting, that admittedly would NOT be applicable to WWII remains recovery, is being abandoned in favor of boosting the ID count. That rings much too closely to the Vietnam War media use of "body count" as applied to KIAs, often on both sides.

As in all instances, the decision is yours to make and, if you wish, I'll be more than happy to contribute to the process, quietly of course, either in person or by editing from afar, and welcome back, Ann

Valerie Wolfe was just nine months old when her father, Air Force Cpt. Thomas Wolfe, a pilot, was shot down and killed in Laos in 1966.

She is on a campaign to compel the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency to keep its promise to bring her father Caution-Caution-Caution-home.

"My father volunteered for duty in southeast Asia," Wolfe said. "He was there a matter of months before he was killed. Originally listed as MIA, missing in action, that status was soon changed to MIA/BNR, missing in action, body not recovered, due to the official determination that no one could have survived the loss incident."

Zack Pryse, Wolfe's friend and former roommate, described the incident from letters he received from pilots in another aircraft that had observed the crash.

"Tom wanted to see where he thought he had spotted an anti-aircraft gun a few days before," Pryse said. "Chuck Dudley [the pilot] was wounded, but he fought it all the way in. The navigator bailed out on

the left side, but he got out too low. He deployed his 'chute, but landed in a bamboo thicket.

"I think Tom tried to grab the yoke. The plane bucked up but then went in. I think Tom fell out. The left engine hit the ground and the plane caught fire."

There was no rescue mission deployed as it was determined no one could have survived the crash.

The Wolfe family has, for years, kept in contact with military officials in an effort to have the crash site, identified in 1999, excavated and the remains of all three pilots returned to their families.

While the site was approved for excavation in 2006, no effort has been made by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, the military branch tasked with those efforts, to begin.

At each subsequent family update, those same officials would give, for various reasons, an extended five-year timeline before excavation could begin. The first delay on was cited for the possibility of unexploded ordinance making the site unsafe for excavation. Additional attempts to determine the status of her father's case were met with the response that the site had been recommended for excavation, but no other specific information as to why no action was being taken.

"We have attended family updates, written to our casualty officer, requested review information and provided DNA information," Wolfe said. "We have done whatever was asked of the family in a cooperative effort to enhance further progress toward remains recovery."

But one thing they didn't know, until 2012, was a part of the criteria in determining which sites to excavate was based on family involvement.

"Neither my sister nor I wanted to believe that our level of caring was being assessed as a criteria of who they should go looking for overseas. We found out in 2015 that it was, and that the box as a family had not been checked, even though we had kept in regular, consistent contact for decades."

And while her father's case remains near the top of the list, new cases are being added all the time.

"In actuality, my father's case is falling further away from selection, not moving closer, due to a new cluster policy, in which sites geographically located close to one another are prioritized to speed up the process." Wolfe said. "The likelihood of a serious review of my father's case will not occur until 2020."

For Wolfe, that is too long.

"Time is not on our side," Wolfe said. "The longer they wait, the less likely there will be recoverable remains. I was nine months old when my father was killed. I am 50 now. We have been waiting a very long time."

The motto of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency is "Fulfilling Our Nation's Promise."

Wolfe now thinks it time -- past time -- for the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency to keep its promise to bring her father Caution-Caution-Caution-home.

Todd, I worked the written language with (b)(6) until last night and came up with what I think is MUCH

better language and, (b)(6) I just added "unaccounted-for" to that final email I sent, knowing you'd probably left for Boston by then.

I also recommend that the April 7, 2001 incident be listed first, then the December 15, 1973, and corrected JCRC with ARVN. Also strongly recommend the Vietnamese military personnel on that fatal flight be listed by their service, NOT the purported contractor Northern Flight Services, a owned and operated MND company. Put yourself in their places, and you'd want your rank/rate and service listed next to your names if YOU had lost your life helping account for missing former enemies. Otherwise, it would be almost insulting, and the SRV knows that we KNOW that company was a front. No secret there.

Also, the 2003 PNG entry should not be listed on this plaque. He lost his life by heart attack, a civilian flying for an actual private company that very nearly cost the lives of US personnel on that mission.

Obviously, the final decision rests with you all, but those are my recommendations in the best interest of the intended purpose of the memorial, as well as the best interest of the mission and SRV perceptions.

I hope no one is offended or insulted by my revisions or recommendations. I have NO idea who drafted this, but clearly, the historical knowledge was lacking, as well as in-depth knowledge of the circumstances. Newly engaged people are not expected to know a lot, in fact little. I spoke at the Ft. Myer Memorial Service held in 2001, along with the Deputy Secretary of Defense at the time, Paul Wolfowitz, with whom I'd been on delegations and known for years. If anyone is offended, I apologize in advance, as it is not my intention.

Perhaps I'll see you in a bit when I come over for the meeting with the Director and whomever else he decides to include. If not, have a good weekend, travel safely, and I hope the FMU is productive for all, and informative, of course. Best to all, Ann

Chris is spot on in the below. That said, Bob Newberry was a very good man and felt the JCSD team was spending way too much money with little to show for it. The Administration had just formed up bilateral commissions with the Russians as part of the restart -- around 15 of them on various issues. Newbs wanted to move the POW/MIA issue out of the USRJC and into a bilateral. We warned him of the political dangers as Newbs was also making enemies by taking on JPAC and trying to hold them accountable. So he called a meeting with all the family and vets groups and brought over a young energetic staffer who turned out to be very arrogant and not ready for prime time. She tried to take on Ann and (b)(6) and things got ugly. Our principal director at the time, Ed Frothingham, asked for a voice vote at which (b)(6) got up and yelled at Ed and Newbs that the meeting was over. Ann and all the major veterans groups wrote a letter to the SecDef and Newbs and Ed got fired and DASD Winfield took over. The staffer got fired too. Newbs was right though, in my view. OK, I do understand, but it precisely because of the tensions and the sensitivity on mil-mil bilaterally that makes this the very best time and what I'm referring to on the web site is fact, historical accuracy, the history of the USRJC, rather than great emphasis on this particularly plenary. 
