Good morning. First, the only photo I could find of Dr. Hagmann is the one you pointed out on Flickr from 1989 and his graduation photo from 1980. I have attached the 1980 photo (it's black and white). Besides the obvious 35 years time difference, I will tell you that he does not look like that much anymore, if that matters.

Below are the answers to your questions:

Q. "Dr. Hagmann says that the procedures he used during training involving your employees or students- the ones for which his medical license was suspended- were authorized by USUHS, both by your faculty and IRB process. Is this true?"

A. The procedures used during the training were not authorized by USU faculty or IRB process (IRBs are for research, not for education or training).

Q. "Is it permissible under any circumstances for your employees or students to insert genital

catheters into each other, participate in "cognition labs" involving alcohol and prescription drugs or perform rectal exams on each other? Your staff will know all about this because you guys did an investigation on this. Note that according to Dr. Hagmann, USUHS did an investigation of his training and then made a complaint to the medical board authorities."

A. It is absolutely not permissible. The moment the department and USU leadership were informed that these events occurred, the institution immediately suspended the relationship with Dr. Hagmann, his course, and his company. We launched an investigation and those findings prompted a report to the Virginia Medical Board.
