



Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status






Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status















Summary of Findings

August 2007

- 56% likely to stay; 30% unlikely
 - Likely to stay led by O4-O6, Marine Corps officers, Air Force officers, male officers, single with child(ren), married with child(ren), Air Force, Navy officers, E5-E9, officers, Air Force enlisted, married, enlisted with 6-9 years of service, and living off base
 - Unlikely to stay led by enlisted with 3-5 years of service, E1-E4, Marine Corps enlisted, single without child(ren), Marine Corps, single, living on base, Army enlisted, Army, enlisted, and male enlisted
 - No differences found over time for deployment status
 - Percentage point differences over time for total, Service, and paygrade are:







Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Paygrade





Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status
















Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status






Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status






Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status







Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status







Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status

Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Service





Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status









Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status







Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Deployment Status







Percent of All Active Duty Members, by Service



Summary of Findings

August 2007

- 80% reported they were well prepared for their wartime mission; 7% were poorly prepared
 - Higher personal preparedness led by Marine Corps officers, deployed members, O4-O6, E5-E9, male officers, Army officers, married with child(ren), living off base, male enlisted, male, and in the US (including territories)
 - Lower personal preparedness led by Army enlisted, female enlisted, female, Army, E1-E4, and enlisted
 - No differences found over time for total and deployment status
 - Percentage point differences over time for Service and paygrade are:
