1. Reference is made to letter your office, dated 8 June 1951, subject: Transmittal of QMC Forms 1044 and 1042, regarding disposition of Unknown X-6002, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P. I., presently stored U. S. Mausoleum AGRS, Pacific.

2. Present regulations governing the return of other than U. S. remains to the "Host Government" are not deemed appropriate for the case cited above, since nationality cannot be proven; also, the determination of racial origin by anthropological examination is not considered sufficient to disprove membership in American Military Forces. Men of all races and nationalities were members of or attached to American Forces; therefore, it is not impossible that the subject remains are those of an unknown American of Oriental national origin.

3. In view of the above, it is requested that the Commanding Officer of Schofield Barracks be contacted and arrangements considered for interring subject remains in the Schofield Barracks Post Cemetery as previously accomplished for Unknown Mongoloid remains referred to in letter this Office dated 29 September 1950, subject: Identification of World War II Deceased. It is requested that a Certificate of Unidentifiability be submitted to this Office for Unknown X-6002.

4. The above method of disposition will permit future availability of the remains in the event an association or identification is ever accomplished.
