Mission and Description

The M88A2 HERCULES is a 70-ton, armored, full-track, diesel-powered recovery vehicle based on the M88A1 chassis. The HERCULES is intended to provide single vehicle recovery, evacuation, and battle damage repair of the Abrams Main Battle Tank and other combat vehicles up to 70 tons. Specifically, the HERCULES provides Armored Brigade Combat Teams (ABCT) with the capability to recover overturned or mired vehicles using the main winch, remove and replace vehicle turrets and powerpacks weighing up to 35-tons using the boom and hoist winch, and tow vehicles using on-board tow bars.

The M88A2 hull is armored for protection against small arms fire, artillery fragments, and anti-personnel mines. The vehicle mounts a .50-caliber machine gun for self-protection. It is configured with three winches, an improved spade, and an improved A-frame boom which enables the vehicle with a 35-ton lift capability. The M88A2 is an improvement over the M88A1 Medium Recovery Vehicle; it is the only vehicle capable of providing single vehicle recovery of the 70-ton main battle tank.

The M88A2 is key to rapid maintenance and recovery of disabled combat systems for return to operational condition in order to dominate the maneuver battle. HERCULES vehicles prevent the need for tank-on-tank recovery, thus preserving combat power.

The HERCULES operates during hostile battlefield conditions of darkness, smoke, dust, and adverse weather and protects equipment and crew from the effects of indirect artillery, Nuclear, Biological and Chemical attack, electronic countermeasures, directed, optical and low-energy weapons, anti-personnel mines, and small arms fire. The M88A2 operates in the same environment and geographical areas as the ABCTs it supports.

Executive Summary

Program Highlights Since Last Report

The M88A2 HERCULES vehicle started production in 1994 and FRP in 1997. The program is post-Milestone C and on schedule.

The M88A2 HERCULES requirements are stable and funding is adequate to meet cost and schedule baselines. There is no increased risk to the program since the 2017 SAR.

Current baseline Procurement funding procures 925 systems thru FY 2020 with the remaining eight vehicles funded in FY 2024 to reach the Army Acquisition Objective (AAO) of 933. This may result in a production break in FY 2022 to produce the remaining eight M88A2 HERCULES. The project office will continue to work with the Army to identify opportunities to move funding forward in future budget cycles.

FY 2018 received a Congressional Plus Up of \$81.0M. The current budget includes Overseas Contingency Operations funding of \$42.8M in FY 2019 and \$80.1M in FY 2020.

On August 1, 2018 a modification to the current contract was definitized for an additional 36 vehicles. As of March 11, 2019, 814 vehicles have been produced and delivered. Another 57 are on contract to be delivered in CY 2019 - CY 2021 bringing the Army inventory to 871 M88A2 vehicles. The AAO pure fleets the Army's Active and National Guard Armored Brigade Combat Teams with M88A2 HERCULES. When M88A2 HERCULES production is complete, 237 M88A1s will remain in inventory in non-Abrams equipped units.

The M88A2 HERCULES was designed to and is the only system capable of providing single vehicle recovery, evacuation, and battle damage repair of the Abrams Main Battle Tank and other combat vehicles up to 70 tons. The current Abrams M1A2 System Enhancement Program version 2 (M1A2 SEPv2) tank with force protection kits exceeds 74 tons. Subsequently, the M88A2 HERCULES can no longer perform the required single vehicle recovery in all mission scenarios due to the increased weight of the M1 Abrams platform.

The Project Director (PD) - Main Battle Tank Systems is supporting an O&S initiative through an Engineering Change Proposal (ECP) effort to improve the current the M88A2 HERCULES to regain Single Vehicle Recovery (SVR) of the heaviest tracked combat vehicle with Force Protection kits applied. The PD is pursuing an opportunity to accelerate the ECP effort and reduce the current development effort by up to two years and enter M88A3 production in FY 2022 versus FY 2024, if additional resources are made available. The Army supports the acceleration of the ECP effort and will look for opportunities to add additional RDT&E funding to get the M88A3 to Soldiers as quickly as possible.

The addition of the SVR ECP initiative costs to existing M88A2 O&S costs caused an O&S APB deviation since these costs are not included in the M88A2 APB.

There are no significant software-related issues with this program at this time.

Explanation of Breach

The O&S APB cost deviation is due to increased O&S costs in support of an Engineering Change Proposal (ECP) effort that will be applied to currently fielded M88A2 vehicles as a post-production modification and deviates from the December 4, 2017 APB. The M88A2-HERCULES ECP effort is to regain the original requirement for Single Vehicle Recovery (SVR) of the heaviest combat vehicle, which was lost due to weight increases of the Abrams tank. The APB deviation is attributed to the additional ECP RDT&E and Procurement O&S costs associated with regaining the original SVR requirement. The HERCULES ECP strategy utilizes mature non-developmental, production-ready technologies to reduce the development schedule and is largely an engineering integration effort. Anticipated funding supports current fielding requirements.

A Program Deviation Report (PDR) was submitted to the Army Acquisition Executive and approved on January 7, 2019. The PDR states that the O&S deviation will be carried forward through the December 2019 (FY 2021 PB) SAR which will be the program's final report.

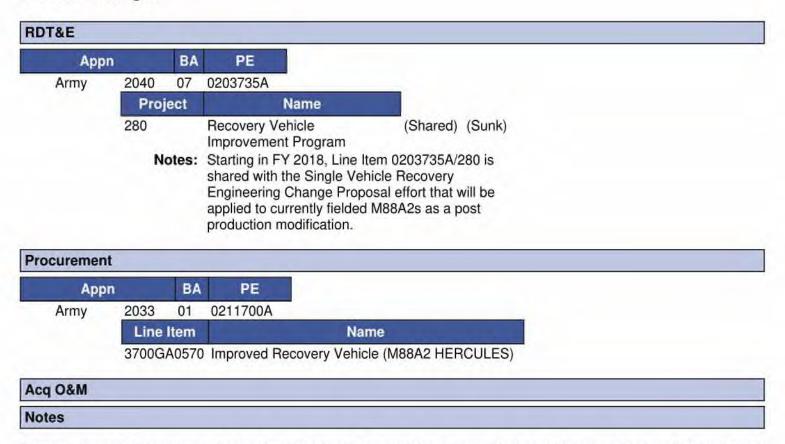

This SVR ECP effort will extend the useful life of the vehicle another 20 years in addition to the existing 20-year useful life.

Sustainment Strategy

The current M88A2 HERCULES ORD, dated November 9, 1998, specifies organic M88A2 support. The M88A2 employs the Army's two-level maintenance strategy for support. The Combat Recovery Systems Integrated Product Support Manager is updating the Life Cycle Sustainment Plan to meet the requirements of an ACAT IC program. The M88A2 product support concept consists of both Operational/Field support and Sustainment support. Operation/Field support is through the use of Brigade Support Battalions using the assigned Forward Support Company for maintenance support. The unit using the M88A2 draws repair parts from the Supply Support Activity. An updated Interactive Electronic Technical Manual will provide crew and maintainer with platform information. Depot Maintenance Work Requirements and National Maintenance Work Requirements are in place for major sub-system components.

Antecedent Information

The antecedent system is the M88A1. This system was in production from 1977 to 1993. Due to the age of the program, O&S costs cannot be collected, therefore no cost comparison can be provided.
