Introduction to the Survey

The Defense Research, Surveys, and Statistics Center (RSSC), Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC), conducts both web-based and paper-and-pen surveys to support the personnel information needs of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (USD[P&R]). These surveys assess the attitudes and opinions of the entire Department of Defense (DoD) community on a wide range of personnel issues. DMDC also conducts *QuickCompass* surveys, fast-turnaround studies targeting special topics not included on other large-scale surveys due to timing, target population, and/or content.

The DoD Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Office (SAPRO) is committed to ongoing evaluation of its efforts towards prevention and victim support. SAPRO is mandated by Congress to gather certain data on incidences of, and programs related to, sexual assault (DoDI 6495.02, 2015). SAPRO regularly collects both these mandated data, as well as auxiliary data to evaluate the effectiveness of Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) programs and policies for continuous improvement.

As part of its ongoing evaluation effort, SAPRO requested survey support from DMDC to gather data from certified Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs) and SAPR Victim Advocates (VAs). The *2015 QuickCompass of Sexual Assault Prevention and Response-Related Responders (2015 QSAPR)* is designed to assess characteristics of SAPR programs at military installations worldwide. Responders are the focal point for SAPR programs at each military location. It is critical to SAPRO and Service SAPR officials to understand how responders are trained for their position and their perceptions of how well their program is supported and executed. Because the SAPR program is now well established, regular assessment of the opinions of responders is necessary to understand both their view of the resources required to run the program and how well they are supporting the objectives of the program.

The *2015 QSAPR* is the third survey of this population following the *2012 QuickCompass of Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (2012 QSARC)* and the *2009 QuickCompass of Sexual Assault Responders (2009 QSAR)*. Due to major changes to the questions and substantial differences in the survey populations, the results of *2015 QSAPR* are not comparable to the previous two surveys. The *2009 QSAR* surveyed SARCs, SARC supervisors, and SAPR VAs. The *2012 QSARC* surveyed only SARCs. Both SARCs and SAPR VAs are surveyed in *2015 QSAPR*.

This report contains tabulations of responses from the *2015 QSAPR* conducted from September 8, 2015, to October 15, 2015. This introduction (1) summarizes the survey content, (2) defines the total population surveyed and the subgroups used in

tabulations of responses, (3) summarizes the survey methodology,¹ and (4) provides details on how to use the tabulations. The tabulations and a copy of the survey items follow this introduction.²

Survey Content

The 2015 QSAPR was administered to certified SARCs³ and VAs⁴ to collect quantitative and qualitative data for SAPRO as part of its ongoing evaluation effort. The 2015 QSAPR is designed to assess the effectiveness of SAPR programs within the DoD in areas including resources, procedures, programs, and outreach.

The topics covered include responder background; attitudes and opinions about SAPR policies, prevention programs, victim assistance; and recommendations for improvement. The survey was divided into the following ten topic areas:

1. *Background Information*—SARC/VA status, active duty Service, Reserve component, civilian DoD component, paygrade, time served as SARC/VA, deployment status, training before deployment, supervisor status, military location, populations served, and SARC/VA duties.
2. *Policy: Safety Assessments*—Safety assessments conducted at military location/area of operation, frequency of safety assessments conducted, safety assessments training preparedness, number of times a High-Risk Response Team (HRRT) was set up in the past 12 months, types of high-risk situations handled by HRRT, HRRT personnel, and length of time the HRRT remained in place.
3. *Policy: Expedited Transfers*—Involvement in expedited transfers in the past 12 months, notification of SARC receiving the transfer, victim's consent to notify the receiving SARC, victim's commander contacted the new commander receiving the expedited transfer, and general impression of the impact of transfers on victims' well-being.
4. *Policy: Case Management Groups (CMG)*—Effectiveness of CMG in resolving issues, CMG chairperson, CMG awareness of retaliation from

reporting, allegations of potential retaliation forwarded to authorities, and which authorities were notified of allegations of potential retaliation.

5. *Policy: Victim Assistance*—Clarity of local SAPR program procedures for victim assistance, personnel support of victim assistance efforts, and resources used to locate updates on SAPR policy.
6. *Prevention: 2014-2016 DoD Sexual Assault Prevention Strategy*—Knowledge of the strategy, methods used to learn about the strategy, activities performed in each major area of the strategy, amount of time devoted to teaching prevention in training in the past 12 months, and ways in which commanders and supervisors support prevention.
7. *Prevention: Specific Components of Strategy*—Frequency of collaboration with community resources to enhance sexual assault prevention in the past 12 months, familiarity with and frequency of use of SAPR Connect, use of SAPR Connect online Community of Practice (CoP) for Sexual Assault Awareness Month preparation, participation in SAPR Connect webinars, frequency in which commanders participated in sexual assault prevention events, and barriers or challenges faced in implementing the elements of the DoD Sexual Assault Prevention Strategy.
8. *Prevention Versus Other Duties*—Time for SARCs/VAs to adequately address victim support needs and prevention activities, and portion of time in a month spent on these duties.
9. *Victim Assistance*—Use of DoD Safe Helpline (SHL), helpfulness of resources if made available through DoD SHL, availability of group counseling resources for victims of sexual assault, familiarity with Safe HelpRoom, victim referral to Safe HelpRoom, use of Defense Sexual Assault Advocate Certification Program (D-SAACP), extent kept up-to-date by SAPR leadership on new initiatives, knowledge of the March 2015 revision to D-SAACP, whether chain of command supports requests for continuing education training, VAs' ability to gain enough time and experience to progress to a higher certification level, average level of VA certification, knowledge of SVCs/VLCs, support for male victims, familiarity with resources for male victims, experiences with other Services, and use of the Defense Sexual Assault Incident Database (DSAID).
10. *Self-Assessment*—Extent to which SARCs and VAs perform duties.

Population and Reporting Categories

The target population of the 2015 QSAPR consists of D-SAACP certified SARCs and VAs who are active duty members, National Guard/Reserve component members, or DoD or Service civilian employees, in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, or DoD agencies. The population was provided by SAPRO from their list of

certified SARCs/VAs in the D-SAACP. Survey results are weighted to represent the full population.

Survey results are presented for the total population of SAPR responders, SARCs, and VAs and by a variety of reporting categories. To form the reporting categories for the tabulations, respondents are classified primarily by survey self-report data. If the self-reported data are missing, then D-SAACP data, at the time of sampling, were used to impute the subgroup classification. Definitions for reporting categories follow:

- *Overall*—The categories include *Total*, *Service (Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, and Other DoD Affiliations)*, and *Status (Active Duty, National Guard/Reserve, and Civilian)*.
- *Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs)*—The categories include *total SARCs*, *Service (Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Air Force)*, and *Status (Active Duty, National Guard/Reserve, and Civilian)*.
- *Victim Advocates (VAs)*—The categories include *total VAs*, *Service (Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Air Force)*, and *Status (Active Duty, National Guard/Reserve, and Civilian)*.

Survey Methodology

The web survey administration process began on September 8, 2015, with the mailing of an announcement e-mail to all sample members.⁵ The announcement e-mail explained why the survey was being conducted, how the survey information would be used, and why participation was important. Throughout the administration period, additional e-mail reminders were sent to encourage survey participation. Data were collected on the web between September 8 and October 15, 2015.

The 2015 QSAPR was a census of 32,106 certified SARCs and VAs who are active duty members, National Guard/Reserve component members, or DoD or Service civilian employees, in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, or DoD agencies. Members of the sample became ineligible if they indicated on the survey or by other contact (e.g., telephone calls to the data collection contractor) that they have separated, retired, or have not been a certified SARC or VA since the date of the most recent D-SAACP list, June 22, 2015 (1.2% of sample), which was used to determine the list of certified SARCs and VAs for inclusion in the survey.

Completed surveys (defined as 50% or more of the survey questions asked of all participants are answered) were received from 5,322 eligible respondents. The overall weighted response rate for eligible respondents was 20%.⁶

While the 2015 QSAPR was a census of certified SARCs and VAs, not everyone responded to the survey; hence the weighting procedures described below were required to produce population estimates (e.g., percent SARCs).

Data were weighted using an industry standard process to reflect the population of certified SARCs and VAs as of June 22, 2015.⁷ Weighting produces survey estimates of population totals, proportions, and means (as well as other statistics) that are representative of their respective populations. Unweighted survey data, in contrast, are likely to produce biased estimates of population statistics. The process of weighting consists of the following steps:

- *Adjustment for selection probability*—DMDC adjusts the respondents initially based on their selection probability within scientific sampling procedures. In the case of 2015 QSAPR, all certified SARCs and VAs as identified by SAPRO were selected to participate in the survey. Therefore, in this instance the selection probability is 100% and the base weights are calculated to be 1.
- *Adjustments for nonresponse*—Although the 2015 QSAPR was a census of all certified SARCs and VAs as identified by SAPRO, some did not respond to the survey and others responded or started the survey but did not complete it (i.e., did not provide the minimum number of responses required for the survey to be considered complete). DMDC adjusts for this nonresponse in creating population estimates by adjusting the base weights for those who did not respond to the survey in two stages. The first stage of adjustment for nonresponse is based on whether the eligibility of the respondent can be determined. The second stage of adjustment for nonresponse is based on whether the respondent completed the survey.⁸
- *Adjustment to known population values*—DMDC adjusts the weights in the previous step to known population values to likely reduce nonresponse bias for estimates that are correlated with these variables. In the case of the 2015 QSAPR, the weights in the previous step were adjusted to known population values using the three known demographic variables (SARC or VA position, Active, Reserve, or Civilian status, and Service). The poststratification adjustments are small because the poststratification variables as well as auxiliary demographic variables were already accounted for in the previous step.

Table 1 (page 7) shows the number of eligible respondents who completed the survey and the percentage of total respondents in each reporting category. Also shown are the estimated number of eligible members and the estimated percentage of total eligible members in each reporting category. Differences in the percentages of

respondents and population for the reporting categories reflect differences in response rates.⁹

Tabulation Procedures

Tabulations¹⁰ for each question, including the text of the questions and response options, are shown. To compress the width of columns in the tables, the response options are shown with a number or letter; then this number or letter is used as the column heading for the responses. The central feature of the tabulations is the percentage of members choosing the response options indicated by the column heading. Within a set of response options, percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Where scales can be collapsed and presented as a percentage, those scales (e.g., “Never,” “Almost never,” “Sometimes,” “Fairly often,” and “Often”) are presented in the bar chart as the percentage who experienced the behavior or activity (e.g., those who indicated “Almost never,” “Sometimes,” “Fairly often,” or “Often”). Similarly, scales representing levels of agreement with a statement (e.g., “Strongly disagree,” “Disagree,” “Neither agree nor disagree,” “Agree,” or “Strongly agree”) are represented in the bar chart as the percentage who agreed (e.g., those who indicated “Agree” or “Strongly agree”). In other cases, the responses are averages of the numeric scales presented with the response options. Where there is a simple binomial response (e.g., yes/no), only one percentage is presented. In this case, the bar chart represents that percentage. When multi-level response scales (e.g., “Yes, in all cases;” “Yes, but not in all cases;” and “No”) can be dichotomized, the bar chart represents the sum of the percentages in multiple columns (e.g., “Percentage Reporting Yes”).

For example, the estimated population is higher for SARCs (n=2,935) than the number of SARCs originally identified in the D-SAACP file (n=1,887). This increase in SARCs is due to a large number of respondents originally identified on the population frame as a VA (n=360) self-reporting as a SARC on the survey. DMDC uses the administration data to weight up to the population and the survey responses to produce estimates, and therefore the estimated population of SARCs shown in Table 1 is larger than the original population file.

On each page of tabulations, the first column lists the reporting group shown in that row. The second column, *Percent Responding*, lists the portion of the reporting group represented in the estimates in that row. There are two reasons the *Percent Responding* might not reflect 100. First, not all questions will apply to every respondent. In some instances, respondents were skipped past questions that do not apply to them (based on their answers to previous questions). In these cases, if the *Percent Responding* is less than 100, it reflects responses from a subgroup of respondents who were eligible to see the question. For example, only those respondents who indicated they had been deployed as a SARC or VA (Q10) were asked if they were trained and given the opportunity to work on issues relating to sexual assault prevention and response to gain experience prior to deploying (Q11). The footnote for that question indicates, “Percent responding are certified SARCs and VAs who answered the question and who have been deployed as a SARC or VA (Q10).” In addition, some questions are asked only of certain respondents (e.g., SARCs only or Active Duty/Civilians only). The footnote for these questions indicate, “Percent responding are certified SARCs who answered the question” or “Percent responding are certified SARCs and VAs who answered the question and are active duty military or DoD or Service civilian employees (Q3).” At the end of the question text, this is also noted by presenting “[SARCs only]” or “[Excludes National Guard/Reserve members].” The second reason *Percent Responding* might not reflect 100 is due to item nonresponse (some respondents who were eligible to respond chose not to).

Several questions on the survey allowed respondents to mark more than one response (Q22-23, Q31, Q34, and Q37-38). For example, in Q23, respondents were asked to “Mark all that apply” for what personnel were part of the High-Risk Response Team (HRRT). Because respondents were able to select more than one option, the tabulations show the percentage who marked each subitem, and the sum across the subitems does not equal 100% (e.g., if a respondent indicated both the “Victim’s commander” and the “Suspect’s commander” were part of the HRRT, they were counted in the percentage for both subitems).

Because the survey contains open-ended questions, not all responses are tabulated. For instance, if a respondent indicated some “other” high-risk situation(s) (Q22q), the following question is open ended asking the respondent to elaborate on what other high-risk situation(s) applied to HRRTs they worked with in the past year. Since it is not feasible to tabulate the wide range of responses received, Q22q is tabulated to indicate how many respondents reported the frequency of some other high-risk situation(s), but the individual responses provided in the written comments are not tabulated.

Margins of Error

To create estimates that represent a population (e.g., percent SARCs or VAs who have been deployed), DMDC creates survey weights for each respondent

record.¹¹ Because of the weighting, conventional formulas for calculating the margin of error will overstate the reliability of the estimate. For this report, variance estimates were calculated using SUDAAN[®] PROC DESCRIPT (Research Triangle Institute, Inc., 2013).

Standard errors are estimates of the variance around population parameters (such as percentages or means) and are used to construct margins of error (i.e., confidence interval half-widths). Percentages and means in these tabulations are reported with margins of error based on 95% confidence intervals. In order to compress the data display, only the maximum margin of error (Max ME) within the presented response options is shown per reporting category. That is, the tabulation volume shows only the largest margin of error for the percentages in each row. For each average shown in these tabulations, its margin of error is also printed.

The following reporting conventions are used:

- “0” indicates that the response option was never endorsed (no one in any reporting group selected the response option).
- The annotation “NR” indicates that a specific result is not reportable due to low reliability. Estimates of low reliability are not presented based on criteria defined in terms of nominal number of respondents (less than 5), effective number of respondents (less than 15), or relative standard error (greater than 0.3). Effective number of respondents takes into account the finite population correction and variability in weights. An “NR” presentation protects the Department, and the reader, from presenting potentially inaccurate findings due to instability of the specific estimate. The cause of instability is due to high variability (large relative standard error) usually associated with a small number of respondents contributing to the estimate.
- NA indicates the question was *Not Applicable* because the question did not apply to respondents in the reporting category based on answers to previous questions.
- No Max ME is printed when all percentages in the row are shown as NR.
- No margin of error is printed for an average when it is shown as NR.
